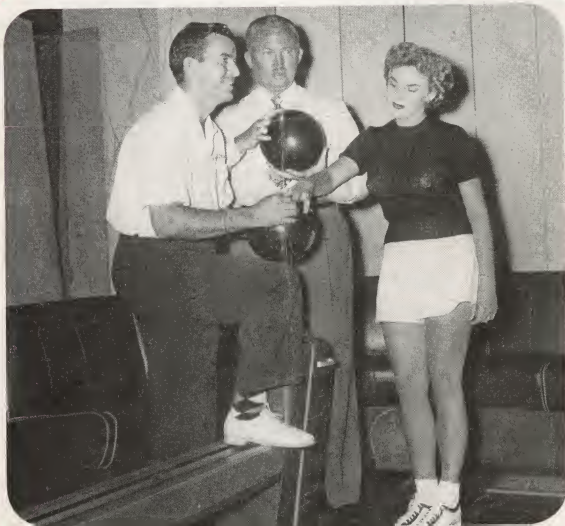

Editor's Report:

It's Channel 7 for WENR-TV

Friday, September 17 is the date!

Spin your station selector to channel 7 and greet a new Chicago telestation, WENR-TV, an affiliate of the American Broadcasting Company.

Watch telehistory being made as WENR-TV presents exciting, entertaining and original programs, in addition to news and special events. For weeks our scouts were snooping about the studios and transmitter, even the antenna atop the Civic Opera building. This is what they have to report—

WENR-TV is organizing a stock company for their teledramas. Although professional actors will be employed, newcomers will be offered an excellent opportunity to break into the new medium.

Two Chicago-originated programs already have proved themselves to be outstanding television fare. "Ladies Be Seated," and the "Breakfast Club." From all indications, the popularity of these shows will jet propel them into TV.

WENR-TV will join with ABC's station WXYZ-TV in Detroit to form a regional network when the latter commences tele-activities on October 1. This will be the nucleus of a midwestern television web which later will include such cities as Milwaukee, St. Louis, Cleveland, South Bend, Minneapolis and Cincinnati.

Plans call for WENR-TV to operate 30 hours per week on channel 7, 174-180 mc with a visual power of 30 kw and aural of 15 kw.

Entrance of WENR-TV in Chicago's

video pattern was well-timed with the first National Television show to be staged this month at the Chicago Coliseum (See page 8).

Now more about WENR-TV. A visit atop the Civic Opera building reveals the 613 ft. antenna, resting on a base 52 feet in height and weighing more than 5 tons. Here automatic de-icing equipment and a flashing beacon for cautioning aircraft in the vicinity is being installed.

Inside the building, on the 44th floor, workmen have been proceeding on a 24-hour-a-day basis constructing facilities for WENR-TV. It is on this floor ABC will house a 5,000 watt RCA type transmitter, a studio, offices and storage room. All studio and field equipment, including telecameras, tele-film projectors, control and lighting equipment and the first custom-built truck of a mobile TV fleet have been received already.

Now meet the staff: Harold Stokes will be program manager, being assisted by E. C. Horstman, engineering director. Gerald Vernon will be coordinator of tele sales; Fred Kilian, director of programming. Jack Gibney is WENR-TV's executive producer, with Monta Fassnacht production director; Gregg Garrison staff director; Nancy Goodwin staff writer; Herb Cuniff and John Mayers program assistants. Robert Whitnah will be station engineer.

Demolition and physical work on the station was started shortly after January 1 of this year and during the past six months nearly 100 persons, includ-

Construction on NBC Studios to Begin October 1 Here

The recent leasing of approximately 20,000 square feet of additional space in the Merchandise Mart and an early start on reconversion of Studio A, largest in the NBC Chicago plant, into a modern television studio was learned by *Television Forecast*. The announcement points up increased activity toward an early start of programming on station WNBQ, key NBC video outlet in Chicago.

Construction work on Studio A will get under way no later than October 1. The studio has been the home of many audience radio programs broadcast from Chicago, and construction work must be delayed until new quarters are found for the audience shows.

Additional floor space has been leased by NBC on the first and second floors of the Merchandise Mart, providing quarters for television technical and administrative staffs.

To Convert Storage Space

Approximately 14,000 square feet on the first floor will be devoted to storage rooms, work shops, shipping room and a television field engineering shop and office. Space now used by NBC on the 19th floor of the Mart for general storage and shipping will be cleared to make way for six dressing rooms, film

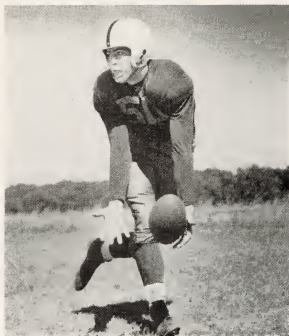

Stations WBKB and WENR-TV will each crown a queen. The girls will be recruited from the employees of the firms sponsoring the show and will be selected on the basis of beauty, talent and personality. Winners will be awarded a 13-week contract with the two Chicago Video Stations and in addition will be presented the following prizes:

- Crosley spectator television receiver from the Harry Alter Co.
- Complete fall wardrobe from Marshall Field & Co.
- Diamond wrist watch by Clinton Watch Co.
- Eight weeks modeling course from Patricia Stevens Studios.

—And, a crown from *Television Forecast*.

Contestants passing preliminary selections will appear on television, and winners of such showings will appear in the finals to be staged during the week of September 18 through 26.

WBKB to Televis Chicago Rockets Football Games

Will the new regime of the Chicago Rockets pay off? Will Coach Ed McKeever be able to pull a hot season out of the bag, based on his advanced T formation and the great Notre Dame star, Angelo Bertelli?

Television fans can get answers to these questions next Friday night when WBKB will televise the second Rocket home game against the Baltimore Colts.

The game will be played Friday, September 13, at Soldier's Field and WBKB will cover the opening kickoff at approximately 8:30 p.m. with three cameras.

There are great hopes in the Rocket camp this year. Ed McKeever is admittedly one of the top coaches of the nation. Angelo Bertelli is the Bertelli of old. His knee injury has healed and doctors assure him that the injury will not recur.

But the Rockets have their work cut out for them Friday. The Colts have a star-studded lineup consisting of the

great Boston star, Charley O'Rourke, and Billy Hillenbrand of Indiana. Also, they have George "Sunny" Franck of Minnesota, Earl Maves, Wisconsin, and the great Fenger high school and Purdue university lineman, Dick "Battlewagon" Barwegan.

On paper the Colts might even be given a slight edge, but Rocket fans have great hopes. McKeever is the man they point to and McKeever may be the man to spring the new Rockets into the top of the gridiron heap.

Consistent with its policy to cover all possible major sports and remote events, WBKB will televise all Rocket home games. The schedule of those games is as follows: Friday, Sept. 17, (night game) Cleveland Browns; Friday, October 1, (night game) San Francisco 49'ers; Sunday, Oct. 24, (2 p.m.) Brooklyn Dodgers; Sunday, Oct. 31 (2 p.m.) New York Yankees; Thursday, Nov. 25, (11 a.m. Thanksgiving Day) Buffalo Bills.

studios and other television workshops and storage.

Approximately 6,000 square feet has been leased on the second floor of the Mart to be converted into offices for production directors, engineers, administrative and other television personnel. The second floor space will not be available until March 1, but temporary quarters of similar size will be made available for these offices on the 11th floor.

Erect Antenna

The 70-foot antenna tower for station WNBQ was recently raised atop the Civic Opera Building. Workmen placed a specially-fabricated steel base for the tower in the 44th floor loft of the building.

Interior construction work at the Civic Opera building where transmitting facilities for the television and FM stations are being installed is nearing completion.

Station WNBQ, operating on Channel 5 with an effective radiating power of 21.8 kilowatts, will be the hub of the NBC Midwestern television network which is rapidly taking shape. Affiliates already aligned with the NBC midwest skein include stations in Milwaukee, Detroit, St. Paul, St. Louis, Cleveland, Dayton, Toledo, Columbus and Louisville, Ky.

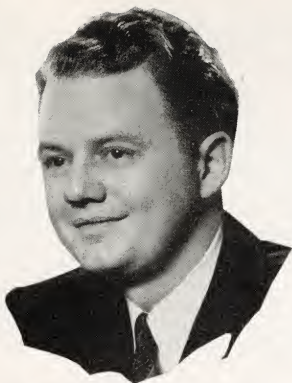
Interconnecting circuits linking these stations, and others expected to join the web, will be available this fall. Cables uniting the midwestern leg with the NBC eastern network are scheduled to be in operation by January 1.

ing supervisors, engineers, foremen and laborers have been working daily, under the supervision of ABC and the Austin Company, general contractors for the network in Chicago, to meet the mid-September opening date.

The transmitter is comprised of eight cabinets containing the latest video equipment as designed by RCA. An elaborate ventilation system has been installed to remove the intense heat generated by the operation of this equipment. The transmitter weighs 8,000 pounds and an additional 1,300 pounds has been added by the installation of water cooling equipment.

The antenna pole to be used for WENR-TV operations arrived in five sections. It was assembled and welded together on the 45th floor of the Opera building and the cables and bat wings were attached at that time.

A great amount of reconstruction work and power readjustment was necessary to the Civic Opera building as a result of the installation of ABC's video station.

A huge base had to be built to support the antenna and a gigantic hole cut through the building roof to facilitate the work of the engineers. The total weight of the base supporting the antenna is 7½ tons. A steel beam, weighing 4,000 pounds, was welded into the building framework to support this entire structure. New and larger transformers had to be installed in the Civic Opera building basement by the Commonwealth Edison company in order to supply the great amount of power necessary for the television operation.

In starting its thirty hour a week video schedule, WENR-TV will employ 46 engineers on television alone and that number is expected to reach 66 as the WENR-TV operating schedule is increased.

Cubs Return Saturday

Chicago Cubs will return to Wrigley field and the TV cameras of WBKB and WGN-TV Saturday, Sept. 11, for a two day battle with Pittsburgh.

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
