10 Best Shows of the Year

This week Chicago television ends a most spectacular year. With one eye on surprises we can expect in 1949, we look back over the past twelve months and carefully review the programs that have attracted and entertained the largest midwestern audience.

Here, in our opinion, are the 10 Best Shows of 1948:

Television Playhouse—WNBQ
Uncle Mistletoe—WENR-TV

Club Television—WGN-TV

The order of listing for these shows does not necessarily mean we rate them in this manner, for each of the above programs has contributed greatly to advancing television in this great city.

Each are shows seen up until the last few days of 1948. Mention should be made of "Woman's World," a channel 4 production telecast mornings during the summer months especially for women viewers. A fine show, much-needed today, we regretted seeing it disappear from the schedule but feel certain before 1949 is over all Chicago stations will be offering morning and afternoon shows.

Special commendations also go to Jack Brickhouse of WGN-TV and Joe Wilson of WBKB, sports announcers, who have vigorously covered major baseball and football contests. Camera-men at these stations also deserve credit for developing tele-techniques now being used nation-wide at sports events.

We feel a real public service is being offered by WGN-TV's Chicagoland Newsreel. Each day a staff of photographers are assigned to film local personalities in the news; each evening Chicagoans view this carefully-planned and edited show on channel 9.

Little has to be said about Kukla, Fran and Ollie on WBKB. Now and then someone has a hard time understanding why a Dragon is on television, but a

few nights later they join the thousands who either postpone supper to watch the show, or serve the meal in the same room in which their receiver is located. You don't have to be a child to enjoy this children's program.

Club Television started out to be a bright, fresh hope, and still can be, although widely imitated. We miss much of the excellent tele-montage work done by Jay Faraghan in earlier productions, and hope to see the MC-ing accomplished by the guest star, rather than a studio announcer.

What Do You Think is the best answer to the person who cracks: "There's nothing on television but wrestling or baseball. If you don't like them, then why have a set?" WENR-TV is also aiding a great program, the Great Books course, by telecasting these stimulating Sunday evening shows.

Although a relative newcomer to Chicago, WNBQ, the NBC affiliate, has offered some outstanding dramas the last few weeks of 1948. Its Playhouse productions prove that video can and will present good drama for theater-goers

Hubbard, Writer First, Then MC

From the time he was knee-high to a short wave set, Eddie Hubbard, master of ceremonies on WENR-TV's "Dollars and Sense" and "Vaudeo Varieties" programs, was determined that radio, or some phase of electronics was his destiny. Unlike most of his present day colleagues, however, he didn't have his sights set on a position as an announcer and master of ceremonies. Rather, he aspired to script writing for some of the major comedy programs.

After a brief career as staff writer with a local station in Baltimore, Md., he traveled the few hundred miles to Chicago where he was engaged by the American Broadcasting company to write "Club Matinee," a popular hour in its hey-day via which Eddie's ex-classmate, Garry Moore, had skyrocketed to stardom.

Wins Own Show

Quite by accident he learned that a cigarette manufacturer was planning an advertising campaign to expand sales in local markets with locally-produced radio programs. He successfully auditioned before famed Martin Block and presently was emceeing his

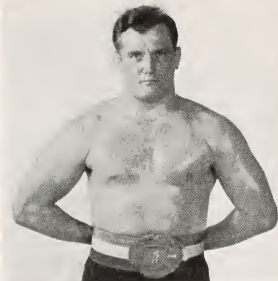

Quip overheard in WBKB's giant studio:

And WBKB, channel 4, does have Miss Scott, a star performer on "Under 21" and "Funny Business." Tall and talented, Miss Scott plays the piano and organ, and sings as well.

A graduate of the University of Illinois, she majored in musical composition, organ and piano; while at school she was a favorite in stunt nights and local productions.

During the war Miss Scott joined the group of entertainers who toured American hospitals, singing and playing for hundreds of disabled servicemen. Following this she returned to Chicago and began engagements at Edgewater Beach, Stevens and Congress hotels.

In 1945 Adele entered radio on an amateur show, eventually working with Morton Downey, Bill Stern and members of Truth or Consequences. Last summer she won the Arthur Godfrey talent scout show.

If Adele isn't seen on your telescreen, she's busy at work on orchestrations and arrangement for future channel 4 programs.

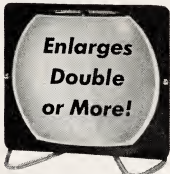

Key Television Figures in Chicago

Comment on Future Operations

The men who know Television, and what it will bring to the ever-increasing Chicagoland audience in 1949 are the men who direct operations of Chicago video stations.

As a special feature for our readers, the editors of *Television Forecast* have asked these video officials to comment on future operations during the new year.

Mr. John Balaban, president of WBKB, predicts, "Next year will see improved programs, healthier competition, and major technical advances. And from now on Mr. and Mrs. Public will be in the driver's seat. Good shows will be the difference between a successful television station and a poor one. And frankly, although WBKB is a pioneer in the field, this is the situation for which we have been waiting. We intend to bend every effort toward better studio programming, the best in sports and the most alert news coverage in Chicago."

"In ten short years," Mr. Balaban added, "this amazing young hercules of industry has grown from a scant 10,000 sets in 1939 to a cool million. 1949 will truly be television's year."

Mr. John H. Norton, Jr., vice president of ABC's television station WENR-TV is equally enthusiastic about the future of video.

"Already ABC has agreements with 36 television stations located in as many cities, five of which are owned and operated by the network. At WENR-TV we will continue in the coming year as we have since our Chicago key station went on the air in mid-September to strive to offer the finest possible entertainment harmoniously balanced with public service," he stated.

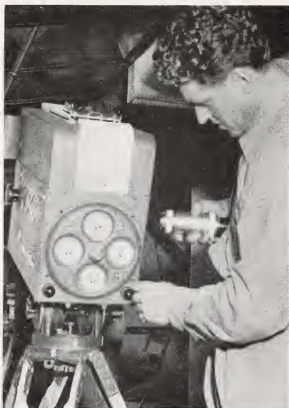
Since first receiving our grant from the F.C.C., no expense has been spared in the construction and maintenance of television equipment here in Chicago. When cables are completed between the east and midwest early next year, we will interchange the best entertainment of both network television webs. Already extensive plans are underway to bring to our vast midwest audience the

Presidential inauguration in Washington on January 20.

"In 1949, we will continue to program according to the precepts of ABC's television creed—"To do our utmost to bring into your homes the kind of program we would want in our homes—to use television with dignity, with skill, with honesty and care," Mr. Norton concluded.

"The year 1949 will see Station WNBQ—the NBC Chicago television station—swing into full operations after a three-months experimental period of tuning up. This will happen on January 8, followed closely by linking with New York television on January 12 when the cross-country coaxial Cable goes into regular service," according to NBC officials in Chicago.

Tentative plans call for a minimum

of 18 hours of telecasting weekly with a wide variety of programming including studio and film shows and field pickups, supplementing the television fare to be offered from New York and other eastern points through the NBC network facilities, officials stated.

Reconversion of Studio "A" in the Merchandise Mart, largest studio in the NBC Chicago plant, into a modern television center is nearing completion. This studio will be the origination point for most of the Station WNBQ and NBC Chicago studio telecasts, beginning early in the year.

"Any fair-minded person who has been watching television for the last six months must have been impressed by the day-to-day accomplishments of the industry," remarks Frank P. Schreiber, WGN-TV manager. "Improvement in the quality of the picture, better camera work, more mature and varied programming—these are but a few of 1948's advances. When the coaxial cable from New York makes it possible in mid-January for WGN-TV to bring important live programs of the DuMont Television Network, the Columbia Television network and TV station WPIX of New York to Chicago viewers, an historic milestone in Midwestern communications will have been reached. With program service from two national network sources and another great television station in New York, WGN-TV will furnish a service to televiewers unapproachable by any other Chicago station."

"The year 1949 will bring new and challenging responsibilities for all of us," Schreiber continued. "The televiewer in his home will have the responsibility of constructively criticizing television programming.

"Companies with goods and services to sell have the opportunity in 1949 of testing a new and powerful sales medium.

Try Fatigmänd Bäkles at Next TV Party

If you are inviting friends over during the holiday to see your new television receiver, you'll want to try these two recipes, one for mulled wine, the other for Fatigmänd Bäkles. Bäkles are delicious Norwegian cookies, ideal to serve with a beverage during TV parties.

Mulled wine has long been a favorite at our home, especially when served with Hors D'oeuvres or assorted cookies. This recipe will yield two quarts.

First, make a sirup by boiling for five minutes: 1 cup sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water, 2 sticks cinnamon, $\frac{1}{2}$ lemon cut into slices, and 2 dozen cloves. Strain the sirup. Add to it: 4 cups of hot fruit juice (lemon, orange, pineapple, etc.). Heat, but do not boil: 1 quart or more wine (preferably red). Combine the fruit juices and wine. Add, if needed, a few drops of coloring. Keep the wine hot in a double boiler. Serve it very hot with slice of lemon and pineapple.

You'll have fun making Bäkles. Here are the ingredients needed:

- 12 egg yolks
 - 3 egg whites
 - 1 cup sugar
 - $\frac{1}{4}$ cup melted butter
 - 12 tablespoons cream
 - 1 level teaspoon powdered cardamon
- Enough flour to form stiff dough.

Beat eggs until light. Gradually add sifted sugar, melted butter and cream. Add cardamon. Stir in sifted bread all-purpose flour until batter becomes firm.

Ch'll batter in refrigerator, then roll out very thin, cut into strips, then into diagonals. Slit each cookie in center and draw one corner through slit. Fry in deep fat. Bäkles may be dusted with powdered sugar before serving.
