Viewers could almost taste the delicious food filmed in the dining rooms of the astra dome cars.

For those who love gadgets, the TV camera showed innumerable gadgets and controls which confront the engineer. Train workers and engineers were also interviewed. Officials estimated that the recent TV showings have boosted attendance at the lake front spectacle.

## Farm Programs Planned

According to a bulletin released by TAP, the department has banished the budget bugaboos that stymied TV operations for so long and its video project will begin shortly.

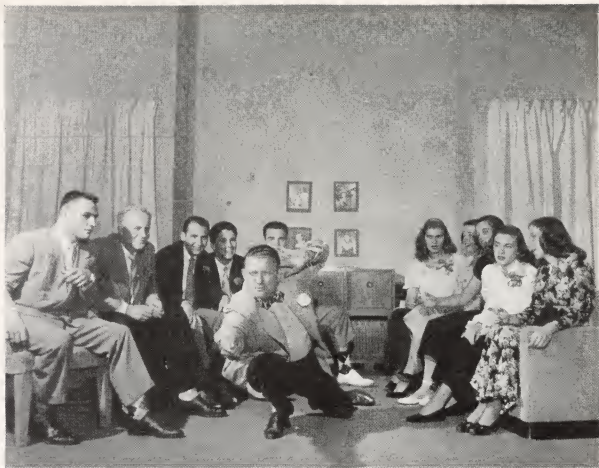

## Use Stratovision • on Convention

In a history-making telecast from WMAR-TV, sessions of the Republican national convention were beamed to the mid-West from a stratovision plane hovering over Pittsburgh. It was the first public demonstration of stratovision in a program designed to cover nine states and reach the largest potential listener audience in the history of television. The plane, flying five miles over Pittsburgh, relayed the WMAR convention coverage for an hour.

Cooperating in the test were stratovision engineers of the Glenn L. Martin Company, and the Westinghouse Electric Corporation, developer of the technique.

The public demonstration was telecast on Channel 6. Viewers in the Baltimore-Washington area were able to ob-

serve the WMAR transmission on Channel 2 and then switch to Channel 6 and pick up the same program direct from the stratovision plane.

Fifteen minutes after the program started, televiewers in Cleveland; Marion, Ohio; and Sharpsville, Pa., reported “good reception.” Zanesville, Ohio, was chosen as one of the listening and viewing test points because of its location far beyond the range of any existing ground-located television stations.

Leading off the historical program was a special film arranged by WMAR and the Martin Company, depicting the operation of the stratovision plane. The film showed the huge B-29 taking off from the Martin plant and the historic test. Listeners in the area west of the Alleghenies, Pennsylvania, New York, Michigan, West Virginia, Indiana, Kentucky and Ohio were told that they were part of a historic engineering feat.

## Superstitious? So Is ABC TV Center

Exponents of numerology will attach some significance to the frequency with which the number "7" appears in ABC's plans for America's largest and most elaborately equipped Television Center in New York City.

The key digit rules all TV engineering operations, not only for WJZ-TV, which will go on the air Tuesday, August 10, but also for all five of ABC's owned and operated stations, because each one will occupy Channel 7. The first announcement of ABC's establishment of these five outlets, incidentally, included news of the signing of two important affiliates, WFIL-TV, Philadelphia; and WMAL-TV, Washington—bringing the total number of video stations at that time to 7. WENR-TV is the Chicago station.

Today it was learned that alterations made on the exterior arrangements of the building to house the mammoth new studio will change the address of the building to 7 West 66th St. And the telephone number will be Trafalgar 3-7000.

When the network program chiefs met to plan the opening night's festivities on August 10, they paused but briefly over the question of opening time. That's right . . . WJZ-TV will inaugurate its activities at precisely 7 p.m.
