Seek Beauty to Reign at TV Show

The next few weeks in Chicago will be exciting!

A Miss Television of 1948 will be crowned as a feature of the first national Television and Electrical Living show to be staged at the Chicago Coliseum September 18th thru 26th.

The queen, and what a pleasant task it will be to pick her, will be selected through special rules and regulations being announced by the contest editors soon.

A highlight of the show will be the presentation of a gold crown to Miss Television by the publishers of *Television Forecast*. In addition, Miss TV will receive prizes from dealers participating in the show. Runnersup will be Maids of Honor for the Queen, and will also receive prizes, according to officials of the event.

More news about this contest will be found in future issues of *Television Forecast*. Watch for it, and in the meanwhile, begin your selection of a beautiful young woman you would like to see crowned Miss Television of 1948.

Inter-religious understanding is being promoted by television. Such is the report that comes from Frank M. Folsom, RCA executive interviewed this week by TV reporters and editors. By familiarizing hundreds of thousands of members of the television audience with what goes on in the other fellow's church, TV vitally supplements and enhances religious teachings.

A New York bishop, whose ordina-

tion was televised recently to an audience of 30,000 in Buffalo churches, foresees receivers in churches, parish houses, and other departments of the church where they will prove an invaluable educational medium.

Each day the culture and knowledge of Chicago and surrounding suburbs is being advanced through television visits to museums, art centers and the theater.

A revolution in teaching methods is in sight. Men of medicine witnessed this first in TV history when Northwestern University Medical School televised surgical operations for about 12,000 physicians and surgeons. With television all students see exactly what the demonstrating surgeon wishes for them to see. Dean J. Roscoe Miller of NU predicts television will more than ever contribute to our country's present and future welfare.

TV TOPICS—Army maneuvers of the active reserve units are being televised from Fort Knox to eastern seaboard residents . . . Part of WMAR-TV Baltimore's program, the training films are of educational value to young guardsmen soon to enter training . . . LeRoy Cooper of Maywood foresees the day when football scouts will do their spying in the comforts of home, instead of chilly stands . . . TV rights to Ringling Bros.-Barnum & Bailey circus have been obtained by David O. Selznik who is busy producing special television shows, soon to be released.

Tele-Flyer Capt. Phill Has Colorful Career

Adventures as colorful as those of a comic strip wonder man compose the life story of Phill Groh, who is "Lt. Phill" of "American Tele-Flyers" seen on WBKB, the Balaban & Katz station, Wednesdays at 7:30 p.m.

Chicago born, he enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1940, and was the first American sailor aboard a seized Nazi vessel. Seriously wounded in action with the anti-submarine patrol off the East coast, he refused a medical discharge, and returned to duty with the "ghost fleet"—95 ft. sailboats which silently prowled for subs. The 102 mile an hour wind of the 1942 Northeaster wrecked his craft and washed him ashore on Cape Hatteras. After that, the Coast Guard made his medical discharge stick.

Member of "Imaginators"

Back in Chicago, he joined with his Northwestern University friends Joe Johnson and Fred Gaines to organize The Imaginators, a team whose comic pantomime to recordings brought them bookings in many of the nation's major theaters and supper rooms.

When transportation became difficult, he learned to fly to carry the troupe to show dates. Three years of such frantic

"Moments of Melody," newest television show in Chicago, is being presented weekly Thursday nights on WGN-TV, in cooperation with the Civil Air Patrol. Featuring vocalists Nancy Evans and Bob Lee, pianist Bill Otto and announcer Jerry Kaufherr, a different guest star is being spotlighted each week.

An informal musical show, "Moments of Melody" drew warm response from most TV critics, and resulted in a flood of congratulatory letters from Chicagoans and suburban residents.

Nancy Evans is well known for her vocal work with Wayne King on the networks, in addition to song duties on the "Breakfast Club" and WGN shows "Song Title Time" and "Boy Meets Girl." Currently, Miss Evans is also doing vocal work with Bob Tredler's orchestra on the new Friday night WGN show, "Nine Tonight."

Baritone Bob Lee, who has appeared at the Edgewater Beach hotel, Latin Quarter and Rio Cabana, is a best-selling artist on English Columbia and HMV recordings. Bob scripts the show as well as vocalizing on it. Previous TV appearances in Chicago include an engagement on "Club Television."

"Moments of Melody" is directed by Chuck Ranallo of WGN-TV.

Mac, Collie TV Star, Faces Degree Crisis

Mac, that appealing collie which Claire DiMaggio puts through his paces on WBKB's "Woman's World" Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m. faces a career crisis. He must choose between being a television actor or a show dog.

For Mac has reached an Orson Welles state of development. He meets some of the requirements for American Kennel Club's equivalent to a Ph.D., but he's flunking grammar school lessons.

Officially in Kennel Club jargon, he has "one leg toward his Companion Dog degree"—which means he has received a score of 170 in one official show. Highest designation is "Utility Dog, Tracking," which requires, among other things, that he respond to silent commands.

At that, Mac is a whizz. He has the cue system at the Balaban & Katz studio down pat. He watches the studio manager more attentively than some two-footed actors, he can tell which camera is on the air—and mugs it—and it wouldn't surprise anyone if he started pushing a dolly.

But American Kennel Club has not yet come around to awarding degrees for television proficiency. It does require, however, that a dog respond attentively only to his trainer.

And that's Mac's downfall. The crew loves him, and Mac begs for their attention and praise. Like a ham actor, he starts bowing to his public the moment he comes in. It's a hit with his audience, but Mrs. DiMaggio fears judges just won't understand.

He encountered Beverly and Hill Caruth at a meeting of the Aviation post of the American Legion. They talked flying, show business and television, with the result that they joined forces to produce "American Tele-Flyers" for air-minded 'teen agers who watch WBKB.

Maywood Park Officials Commend WBKB Telecasts

The ever-growing number of television set owners in the Chicago area are becoming rabid night harness racing enthusiasts thanks to the technical prowess of Station WBKB, who devoted one night each week to telecasting Maywood Park's race card.

While thousands of fans stormed Maywood's turnstiles for such harness classic as the \$10,000 Preview Trot and the Chicago Pacing Derby, video set owners could sit back and relax while enjoying perfect views of the races.

When WBKB first took its cameras to Maywood Park in the spring of 1947, it made Maywood the first night harness track in the country to have its races televised. New developments in production this year have greatly enhanced night harness telecasting.

Use Three Cameras

In 1947, two cameras were used, mounted high above the judges' stand over the finish line. This year three roving eyes were in operation. In addition to the finish line camera, one was erected at the clubhouse turn and one on a high platform in the middle of the infield. Thus televiewers would catch the field leaving the starting gate, get a head-on picture as the horses pounded into the first turn followed by a clear-cut shot of their progress through the backstretch into the home stretch where the finish line camera would pick them up again.

Interview Audience

Interviewer Vin Gottschalk of WBKB, established himself in the far club house box, directly below the camera located there. From this spot he talked with such celebrities as Eugene Hayes, chairman of the Illinois Harness Racing Commission; Lois Fraser, whose father owns the famed pacer, Dr. Stanton; Mr. and Mrs. Silas Thompson, whose Jimmy Creed won the \$10,000 Pacing Derby; and a host of other standout personages. These interviews usually took place after every other race on the card.

Special events at the park also were

Joe Wilson capably handled the narrating duties during the race telecasts, filling in with color and background on the horses, track, and events.

All things considered, is there any reason why Chicago's televiewers should not have become avid followers of the sulky sport from the comfort of a front room easy chair or other video vantage points.

At the conclusion of the meeting Maywood's President Robert G. Johnson and General Manager Sam Wiedrick were quick to agree that WBKB had done an outstanding job.
