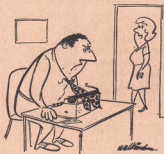

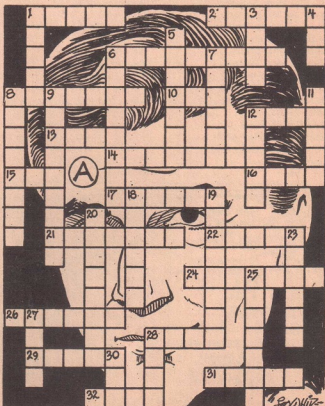

'Julia' creator is rich and famous —and steals from his own kids!

HOLLYWOOD [NANA]—He doesn't look the type at all. He has bushy brows, twinkling eyes behind heavy-rimmed glasses, and a sharp, sardonic, sometimes-biting wit. Summed up, he looks and acts the businessman type.

But he steals from his own children—unabashed by, frankly, and with pleasure!

He's Hal Kanter, who has been one of the big producer-director names in television ever since the medium got fairly under way. Not a season passes but what this family purloiner has two or three hit shows on the tube.

"Sure I steal from my kids," he says without batting an eye. "No writer could ever dream up situations and dialog quite so original as children's own bright sayings. And my own mother got me started on the thing."

It seems when Kanter was a youngster in Savannah, Ga., his mother—"a very bright, imaginative woman" as he describes her—would write down all those funny or bright comments made by Hal, his brother and sister. She kept notebooks which she still has and has loaned to him on occasion.

THE SCRIBBLE system is proving of particular value in Hal's new TV series, *Julia*, which stars Diahan Carroll. It is adult fare, Kanter points out, but is heaped with juvenile wit and background.

In the show, *Julia* is the widowed mother of a 6-year-old boy played by Marc Copage. His best buddy, played by Michael Link, is called by the cast name of Earl J. Waggedorn and he is constantly referred to by his full name throughout every script in the series.

"THAT'S THE KIND of thing kids dream up," Kanter cites. "If this is a child's idea of a name then so be it. In fact, the name was stolen or borrowed from a neighbor we used to have."

Kanter says he has always

had an ear bent toward the utterances of kids while they were playing, not alone his own, but others in the neighborhood who drop around.

"The biggest laugh in a Bob Hope picture I wrote—'Bachelor in Paradise'—came from my own children," he says proudly. "The situation

was Hope being introduced to a little girl as 'Mrs. McGillicuddy' and shortly after he meets her in the grocery store, inquiring why she isn't in school. 'My husband's sick' she pipes back in her five-year-old voice. 'And what's wrong with him?' Hope plays straight. 'We think he's pregnant,' she answered.

"WELL, who could think of a goofy thing like that other than a kid? So I have no compunctions about borrowing from my children's conversation. I've supported them quite well. This way they contribute to my own income and theirs, but they never knew it until they were grown up," he adds triumphantly.

So, hark ye, parents everywhere: Listen around the house and you, too, may grow as rich and famous as Hal Kanter.

HOLLYWOOD — "There's much more to me than the 'sock-it-to-me,' label," observes England's pixie Judy Carne, the cute little kook with the turned-up nose on Rowan and Martin's Laugh-In.

Judy neatly fits the off-beat popoff in mini-skirts, setting a certain anything-goes style for the blackouts comedy hour. She wiggles with a

coltish grace, delivers a line in an innocent Cockney accent, and lets hosts Rowan and Martin draw on her slim back for a laugh, epitomizing the new generation of emancipated girls in boots and short hair.

OFF-CAMERA Judy says whatever comes into her head, salting phrases with good old Anglo-Saxon swear words, yet sweetness prevails. She's really sugar and heady spice in mod clothing.

After straight, gooey parts in failure like Fair Exchange and The Baileys of Balboa, in which she blinked her big brown eyes a lot, Judy dropped her accent to be the young San Francisco newlywed in Love on a Rooftop, and flunked the course once again.

Game shows kept her in groceries during the down period until producer George Schlatter, a man who digs kooks, had the good sense to see her as the "sock-it-to-me" girl.

With "Laugh-In" smothering the likes of Gunsmoke and Lucy on Monday nights [7-8 p.m., channel 5], Miss Carne has come into her own along with regulars Arte Johnson, Goldie Hawn, Ruth Buzzi, and Henry Gibson, all young upstarts, and the taste of acceptance is very sweet.

Riding high right now, Judy hopes to make her big chance count. Landing guest spots or record contracts calls for action by the English girl. She realizes she must do the pushing rather than leave it up to agents. "If you're slightly off-beat like I am," Judy explains, "it takes more time to become accepted. I think shows are a bit leery, not knowing how to use me."

THIS is the positive-minded Judy talking, a new Carne,

infused with confidence emanating from her photographer boyfriend. "I used to lean on others," she says. "And when let down I'd worry and get thin and sick. I've made terrible mistakes in the past with publicity agents and such, and I would let little things destroy me."

"Now I've grown up a little and I get on the phone. My story has the same old theme — a show-off turns out to be the most insecure person."

THANKS to "Laugh-In" and a man, there is a new Judy. She's more than a pixie in a mini-skirt, and she would like to compete with Katharine Ross and the Mia Farrowes for movies, particularly pictures like "The Boy Friend" and "Peter Pan."

"And I wish I could model the latest fashions during our cocktail party segments," she adds. "Then they could really sock-it-to-me."

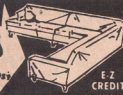

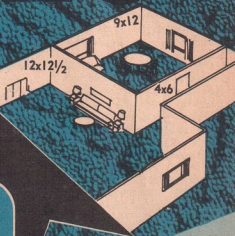

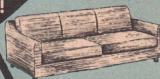
