# Wally Cox Likes to Laugh

WALLY COX discovered the value of humor early in life.

"I was the smallest kid in the class," he said. "I had a high-pitched voice, good diction, good marks and the teachers liked me. I was a perfect subject for getting beat up. So I contrived a method whereby I could give correct answers and make the kids laugh, without offending the teacher. I had to dance between eggs."

Wally likes to laugh.

"I'd rather laugh then do anything else," he said. "I find inanimate objects terribly amusing. One of the hardest and most memorable laughs I've had involved watching a garden hose emerging from a swimming pool with water turned on full pressure. The hose lashed about like an angry serpent dashing its head on the cement."

Wally's whimsical sense of humor has made TV fans laugh from the days of Mr. Peepers to Wally's current stint as a regular panelist on The Hollywood Squares, daytime and nighttime comedy on NBC-TV.

Wally knows what makes people laugh but not why they laugh.

"EVERY time I've contemplated a definition of humor I've found it wanting," he said. "I don't want to define humor. I don't think it can be defined. The idea of defining humor is itself comical and self-defeating. It can only be a nonhumorous definition. All definitions of humor have holes in them. Humor, if you want my definition, is that which is funny."

There's one view of humor that Wally doesn't go along with.

"Some people," he said, "have tried to define humor as a form of cruelty and aggression. That's just a fraction of the picture. Humor can be absurdly kind."

WALLY cited as an example his father's sense of humor: "He liked to answer signs. When he saw a sign in a hotel that said, 'Stop, Have You Forgotten Anything?' he said, 'I won't know until I get

home and open my suitcase."

Wally, whose interests include nature, electronics, sculpture, history, music, politics, economics, sociology, anthropology and handicrafts, among others, is currently preoccupied with the study of semantics—the study of the meaning of words.

"I'VE only recently become aware that this is what I've been searching for," said Wally. "It's so orienting to me. I know what I think afterwards. I feel semantics is the key to mental health and therefore to most human ills, including war."

The fact that Wally looks hopefully at the world constitutes a good clue to his attitude toward humor.

"I SEE so much progress, despite the troubles in the world," he said. "I believe that Freud was right when he said, 'We may say that the voice of reason is small and weak compared to the voice of instinct, and we will be right. But the voice of intelligence will not stop until it is heard.'"

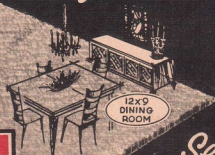
