

Johnny Olsen, One of 11 Children, Used to Crowds, Likes His New TV Program

When Kleenex began blueprinting their first television show, Johnny Olsen from Meen-a-sota was their choice for MC of a giveaway titled "Fun for the Money." You'll see Olsen Friday this week on WENR-TV, channel 7; it won't take you long to realize Olsen is comfortable with crowds.

One of 11 children, Johnny Olsen developed a bit of philosophy which is worth munching: "In a family that size, you've got to learn to give and take, how to appreciate the tastes and peculiarities of others, and that's really the basis of understanding people."

Making his debut in radio at the age of 17, Olsen had previously worked as typist, jeweler's helper, and drug clerk. After a year before the mike as "The Buttermilk Kid," on a Madison, Wis., station, he went to Mitchell, S.D., where he handled all the studio chores, from managing the station to tending furnace.

His next move was to Chicago, where he built a bus and organized a dance band. The band traveled the Midwest but made Milwaukee its headquarters when a station there hired Olsen as singer and announcer. Later he produced and presented his own variety show which eventually took him to Hollywood for a year.

Johnny came to New York in January, 1944, as a staff announcer for the American Broadcasting Company. Recognizing his abilities as an emcee, the network assigned him to "Ladies Be Seated."

Johnny met his wife, then Penelope Powers, while filling a band engagement on the 4th of July in Stevens Point, Wis. After a courtship of a year they were married. That seemed to spur Johnny's ambitions for shortly after he got his first break on the Milwaukee station with the Hollywood and New York stints following.

If you want to find the Olsens during their off hours, you seldom have to look farther than their own fireside. Strictly homebodys, they do not care for night clubs and late hours, and when it comes to entertainment, they prefer the home variety—dinner, conversation and quiet music.

The "Buttermilk Kid" stands five feet nine, weighs 170 pounds, and has dark hair and blue eyes. His main passion is for coffee which he drinks in staggering quantities. Home recording is his hobby.

FIRST IN CHICAGO

THEATER VIDEO IN 66

This week we take a trip through WBKB's new theater video system, the first to be installed in Chicago. How does it work?

The above pictures will illustrate Paramount's large-screen TV projection, involving the photographing of the televised image off the face of a monitoring tube and the developing and processing of film in a record 66 seconds. Patrons of the Chicago theater first witnessed such a demonstration when WBKB opened its new antenna.

Carl Mauer shows Helen Glatt (top left) how a program is teletranscribed. The picture is taken off the tube. Standing behind an Ackley camera, Maurer focuses on a special kinescope tube on which the TV image appears.

Next step (picture 2) shows threading of the camera. Mauer shows B & K engineers J. F. Jacobsen and Robert Burns the special Paramount electronic shutter, which Mauer developed. The Ackley camera alone is valued at \$11,-000. Scene 3: from the Ackley camera, the film begins its long trip through the system, moving out of the camera into the processor. Jacobsen is shown threading the tension take-up loop of the processor.

Not a bicycle wheel (picture 4) but a large drying cylinder is this device through which the wet film travels and is dried by jets of hot air in 10 seconds. Now the film is ready for its unbroken trip to the projection room in the Chicago theater, a distance of 20 yards from the teletranscription room. Jacobsen (scene 5) regulates speed of film as it heads for projection room.

Arriving in the projection room (picture 6), still untouched by human hands, a now dry finished high quality 35 mm print containing sight and sound, the film feeds into a projection machine and is flashed on the screen of the theater in less than 66 seconds. This final scene shows Art Deveant, projectionist, threading a reel.



redn. A studio show may be picked up ivately by the Chicago theater's own udio camera and "piped" over a osed circuit to the film recorder. Such innovations in Chicago may lp revolutionize the theater business, is believed, by giving exhibitors the portunity to present TV shows at ours convenient to their schedules.


