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On a Limb:

Stack Your Dishes for Simon

Before we go any farther, dial to channel 4. Tonight being Jan. 31 there's a good chance you'll see our candidate for Chicago's Funniest Man: Ernie Simon.

He's on Tuesday, too, and every weekday in a program easily caught after supper is over and the dishes are stacked. Ernest isn't always the star of the show, but that's because "Curbstone Cutup" is a combination of man-on-the-street, we-the-people, and original-amateur-hour. Everybody stars.

With a bit of help from a Hollywood make-up man, Ernie Simon could pass for Groucho Marx. He's already had offers to double for Dick "Two Ton" Baker, but TV lights are helping to slim him down to his original fighting weight.

Whether you like it or not, Simon is contributing something to television. It is certainly hoped that some Chicago sponsor will take note of his free and easy video manners, his past vaudeville experience, and collection of Joe Miller jokes and call it "The Simon Show."

Simon is no Jack Benny. On the other hand Jack Benny is no Simon. And the same can be said of Cantor, Jessel and Berle. We've watched them all on television. We'll still take Simon.

Here are more reasons why:

He's zany, but contagious. Anyone who still has an old fashioned radio set probably hears him on his morning program. Frankly, it took us some time to like him, like olives or Arthur Godfrey, but now that we do life seems like a lot more fun.

Reason 2: Simon hates scripts, and so do we. Nothing spoils television more than watching someone read a script, and do a bad job. He's liable to ask his audience on "Curbstone Cutup" most anything, and usually does.

Reason 3: Simon likes people. That seems to be hard to believe for some viewers, but then they don't know him. His own wife admits he is a dual personality, and claims his screwball antics on the air are not in evidence once he escapes the glare of TV lights. His three-year-old daughter is his idol.

Reason 4: He's a showman. Ernest

can do a soft shoe shuffle tap, although two years ago he needed a cane to get around. Little known is the fact that gagster Simon enlisted in the British Army in 1940, serving in Africa for nearly three years. There he made use of his fluent French and Arabic, was awarded the French Colonial medal for his work in the Intelligence Department under Field Marshal Montgomery.

Add this reason: He's modest. You wouldn't know it listening to him on WBKB, but it's true. Our Inquiring Reporter could not get Simon to talk about himself or his experiences in World War II, even the fact that he spent almost a year recuperating in army hospitals before being discharged in 1944.

Our candidate is not a disc jockey, as some folks might think. He's not a member of our editorial staff. He doesn't know the editor. He's not paying us.

Simon does think a great deal about television. He enjoys himself before the camera, and is quicker than anyone else in putting people at ease who appear with him on his show.

Only recently we discovered the fol-
