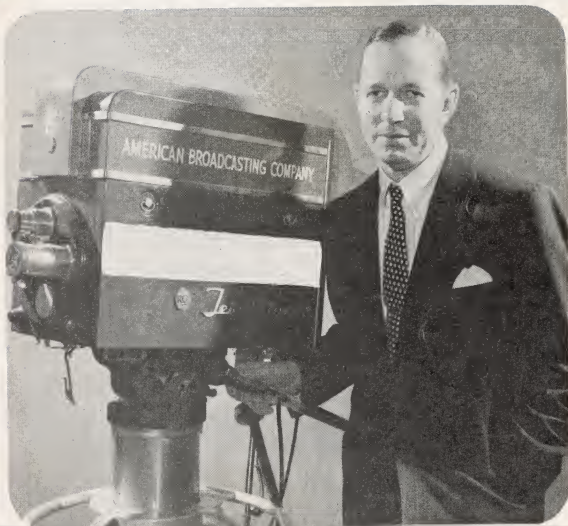

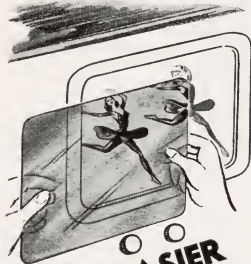

Television vs. Comic Books

If your phone rings and someone asks "Do you have any children? Do they like television?" it will very likely be the editors of this magazine, seeking information. Beginning Monday, Feb. 14, hundreds of Chicago and suburban children and parents will be interviewed.

Perhaps the letter from *Mrs. A. G. Rein* of 103 N. Forest, Palatine, started it all. Mrs. Rein wrote, "I would much rather have my children grow up with television than read those weird comic books."

Of late, comic books have gained an unwholesome reputation, and many parents, like Mrs. Rein, shy away from having such publications in the home. Like many of our readers, we feel video programs, written and prepared especially for children, can be not only educational but entertaining.

William Boehm of 1534 Thomas, Chicago, feels that each telereceiver is in itself an Off-the-Street Club. He suggests that the owners of sets invite at least twice a week one or two children to their home. If done, more than 200,000 youngsters would enjoy this new medium for the first time. He footnotes his letter by warning, "It may save a life!"

Dick and Jim Hansen of Maple Lane, Batavia, avid TV fans, write: "My brother and I would like to see a Saturday morning program for children on television. It would be nice to have some films and a serial and a cartoon," they add. Dick and Jim are not alone in wanting increased hours on Saturday's programming. *W. J. Seguin*, of 2735 W. Farwell, Chicago, comments: "There are a great many of us who have television sets who do not get home until 9 p.m. . . . consequently we do not enjoy much television when the programs go off at 10:30 p.m."

Our Mail Bag also brought forth suggestions from readers, one in answer to the letter from *A. C. Marazick*, whose landlord refused to allow an antenna on the roof of building. *Mr. O. H. Trempe*, of 1032 Lennox, writes: "Our antenna is not on our roof, but in a closet and our reception is perfect. In fact, the picture comes in better

than some of our neighbors who have outdoor antennae. Why not try it?"

Philip Lewis, of 5220 S. Kenwood, Chicago, who has been doing much research work on video, comes up with this idea, giving credit to his wife, Gerry. He writes: "Over a period of months we found that the image on our TV receiver was producing less light and decreasing definition. The thought was that the tube was getting old. My wife got the bright idea that maybe enough dust had deposited on the reverse side of the safety pane to interfere with the image. We took out the pliers and screwdriver and removed the frame and glass. Sure enough, a layer of dust had deposited itself so uniformly that it could not be detected as such from the front. The set works as good as new now."

There just isn't enough basketball on television for some of our readers. *John Hattenhauer*, of Maywood, *Darryl Lem*, of Calumet City, and *C. W. Bryant*, of Chicago, would like to see high school, college and pro games on the screen.

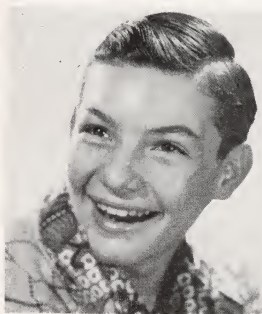

Shorty Sklamm, that is Archibald, of WBKB's "Piano Pals" is a Chicago boy that may be your neighbor. A freshman at Parker high school, Shorty, at 14, is one of video's youngest stars, with a remarkable background of theater and radio experience. He has been a member of the Jack and Jill players in Chicago for more than five years. Although offered the part of Harlan in "Life With Father," he remained here to do radio shows like Tom Mix, Jack Armstrong, Curtain Time, Meet the Meeks, and a dozen others. Young Mr. Sklamm also is a personality on records, and during the last election—despite not being of voting age—made several political recordings.

Like non-professional kids, Stuart likes sports, playing hard at football and baseball. And like so many other youngsters he is currently annoying the neighbors while he practices on his alto, saxophone and clarinet.

"Piano Pals" is not his first meeting with video. Back in 1944 we recall his appearance on channel 4 in several Marshall Field programs, the one most remembered "School Lunch."

frey" show began as an amateur on Big Red's talent roundup, and is still slightly dazed by his good fortune, but is beginning to remember some of the steps that led to it.

One of the things the WGN-TV star recalls as a big musical influence in his life is his training at East Side high school in East St. Louis, Illinois, his home town.

"I got a lot of encouragement from our music teacher," he tells us. Our school was always very proud of its choral groups.

Bill attributes his liking for popular music to the fact that Mrs. Rose Mary Greene Brinson, his teacher, didn't stick to the straight-laced classical repertory favored by most public school marms.

Although not yet confirmed, Bill reportedly is scheduled to sign a Hollywood contract and begin recording for RCA Victor. No wonder, the way he charms lassies on television.

If Russ Columbo had lived to see and hear the "Supper Club" on WNBQ he would probably say, "Why that sounds like me! Who is that fellow?" The answer: Perry Como, of course.

That Como man captured the hearts of girls long before TV, appearing in movies, on stage, and on radio. Few record collectors lack a Como specialty; more often you'll find Como albums highly treasured.

This NBC show is particularly popular because of its late hour, and refreshing because of its good looking people, Perry foremost, and the charming Fontanne Sisters.

Chicago audiences last saw Neil Hamilton at the Blackstone theatre when "State of the Union" drew record-breaking crowds. Now in TV, on WENR-TV's "Hollywood Screen Test," Neil attracts a wide audience of women who have been his fans since early motion picture days.

Although he is not the dashing lover or hero on video that he was in flickers, because of his role as talent scout, Hamilton has but to say a few words and his women fans are satisfied. One of our male readers last week wrote: "My wife has had his picture on her dresser for 15 years. Me? I'll take hockey, or baseball."

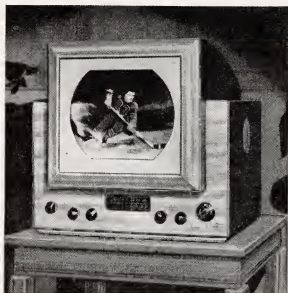
