BARN DANCE

Lulu Belle, Scotty and the PTA

If you haven't already seen the Barn Dance on television you're missing a contribution to Americana. Monday, March 14, will find the entire gang on a network presentation seen in Chicago on WENR-TV, channel 7.

Chicagoans who have been fans of Lulu Belle and Scotty (*see cover*) can now see and hear the pair as they go through their sentimental and comic routines. Few readers would bother to dial to channel 7 if the program listing read: Scott Wiseman and Myrtle Cooper, Song Team, yet Mr. and Mrs. Scott Wiseman are known from coast to coast on radio, and from New York to the Mississippi river on TV.

In private life the Wisemans are, as Lulu Belle puts it—"home bodies"—living in a comfortable home in suburban Oak Park, where they are members of the Parents and Teachers Association and other community organizations and clubs. They are the parents of two children, Linda Lou who is 3, and Stephen, age 9.

Away from the hustle and bustle of the Barn Dance show, Lulu Belle and Scotty are planning for the future when they can retire to their small farm in the Blue Ridge mountains near Ingalls, North Carolina, where they have spent their summer vacations for 12 years.

Auburn-haired Lulu Belle's trademark on the Barn Dance show is her old-fashioned dress, high topped shoes and pigtails. Always chewing gum and cutting-up she keeps her tele-audience wondering what will happen next.

Born Myrtle Cooper on December 24, 1913 at Bonne, N.C., 40 miles over the mountain from Scotty's birthplace at Ingalls, Lulu Belle learned many of the mountain ballads at her mother's knee. She memorized others when her family later lived in West Virginia, Kentucky, Florida and Tennessee. After the Coopers moved to Evanston, Ill., Myrtle became a clerk in the 5 and 10 store, but father wasn't satisfied and feeling his daughter had as much talent as anyone on the WLS radio barn dance he brought her to the station for an audition.

Lulu Belle clicked. It wasn't long before she was a star. In 1933 Lulu Belle teamed up with Scotty Wiseman. Their voices blended well, and they harmonized successfully in sweet and humorous songs.

On December 13, 1934 the couple saw the preacher, Lulu Belle blurting out "Me 'n Scotty want to get hitched!" The wedding surprised many, since few took Lulu Belle seriously enough to realize a romance had been budding. After all, Lulu Belle told us, "we both had a liking for corn bread for breakfast."

Sandy-haired Skyland Scotty was born November 8, 1909 in North Carolina, an ambitious person who set the pace by earning his way through college as an entertainer, janitor, engineer and later program director of radio station WMMN.

As a child, like Lulu Belle, he learned many of the southern and old English ballads from his mother. His uncle, "Honey Waits" Wiseman, taught him to play square dance tunes on a homemade five-string banjo. Later Scotty sold a pig, bought a mail order guitar

First of 74 Cubs home games will be played before the WGN-TV cameras at Wrigley Field on April 19 when the north side nine meets Pittsburgh. The season winds up October 2 when the St. Louis Cardinals will face the Cubs at Wrigley Field.

Jack Brickhouse will describe the games, and Don Cook, sports and special events director, will direct the cameras. Brickhouse and Cook were in charge of last year's Wrigley Field pickups for WGN-TV when the channel nine stations presented all Cubs home games.

We Come to Praise, Not to Bury This Man Caesar, Sid That Is—

Staging Sid Caesar is hardly any trouble.

This man Caesar is not only all of the actors, but also all of the props. An artist in drawing satirical sketches, Sid is burning bright in a show that has the distinction of being on two Chicago stations, WNBQ and WGN-TV. Friday, March 18, you're liable to see this telemadman in anything but a serious role.

Caesar's big specialty is his double-talk. He can give a perfect imitation of a person of any nationality speaking his native tongue, yet he does not speak any language except English. While his conversation will not contain one word or syllable of the language he is pretending to speak, nevertheless he'll reproduce to perfection the sound of the desired national speech.

Caesar, who was born in Yonkers, New York, is six feet tall, and has brown hair and hazel eyes. He and his wife, Florence, are parents of Michele Andrea, born in July, 1947.

Caesar made his theatrical debut as a musician, having studied at the Juilliard School of Music. Later he played the saxophone in the orchestras of Charlie Spivak, Shep Fields and Claude Thornhill. But before he could further his studies as a serious musician, the war came and Caesar, at the age of 19, enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard.

It was in the barracks that he got his start as a comedian. (Anyone who studies the 1st Sergeant of an outfit should have enough material for a comedy show.)

Caesar met Vernon Duke, who liked good, clean humor in his Coast Guard band. Sid supplied the kidding, and did it so effectively that when Duke and Howard Dietz wrote "Tars and Spars," Caesar was made comedian of the show which toured the United States and Canada before reaching Hollywood, where Columbia filmed it.

Max Liebman and Caesar met during the "Tars and Spars" day, Max being the director. Since then a writing partnership has sprung up between Sid and Liebman, who is director-producer of Admiral's "Broadway Revue."

Hollywood and Caesar didn't mix.

After a round of parties, tennis courts, swimming pools and more parties, Sid decided 23 was entirely too young to retire and so he gave up the film capitol.

While appearing at the Roxy Theater in New York, he was seen by famous restaurateur Leo Lindy, who advised his friend and successful producer, Max Gordon, to hire this new comedian. Gordon helped him land a place on the Joseph Hyman production of "Make Mine Manhattan."

"Humor should know no boundaries," Caesar told us. "It is universal, like music. When people start looking for political implications in good, clean humor, then it is time for those people to analyze themselves more thoroughly."

Mail Order Course Led Winchell to Mahoney

This comes straight from Jerry Mahoney. Woodenheaded as he may seem to some of you, this week he consented to tell all he knew about Paul Winchell, star of "Floor Show" on channel 5. Winchell, who can be seen Thursday, March 17 on WNBQ, has skyrocketed to fame on video.

Mahoney tells us Winchell learned ventriloquism through a mail order course. It took but seven weeks.

"Winchell has always been a sucker for magazine ads—and he's glad," Jerry adds. "I remember the day he read one in bold type:

ARE YOU UNPOPULAR? DO YOU LACK PERSONALITY AND TALENT? BE THE LIFE OF THE PARTY. Write in for our free trial too.

That started it all. The first thing I knew we were on Major Bowes' Amateur Hour. Someone voted for Winchell, and before long we were appearing on the stage, in night clubs, hotel shows, and then radio."

Mahoney rolled his eyes at this point and reminisced about their early days on NBC's "Jane Pickens Show." TV talent scouts decided the No. 1 Voice Thrower was a natural for television, and Mahoney soon found himself on the screen of thousands of Chicago and New York telereceivers, with Winchell at the controls.

Few viewers know that Winchell during his childhood days suffered a siege of infantile paralysis. Because of his strong fight against this disease he took up the practice of weight-lifting, rebuilding himself physically. Today, he is considered one of the best amateur weight lifters.

Mahoney likes Winchell, and Winchell likes Mahoney. They're a happy team, and to date only one man in America has trouble with blockhead Jerry. That is Dunninger, master mentalist, who still has difficulty reading Mahoney's mind.

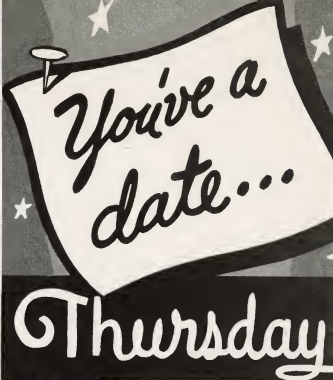

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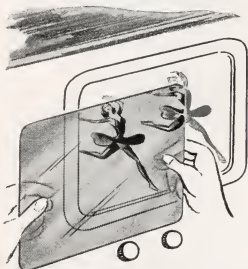

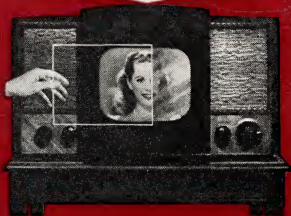
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
