EDITORS REPORT:

Living Room Becomes Classroom

This week we viewed chapters of WENR-TV's dramatic and historical "Crusade in Europe," an authentic television version of General Dwight D. Eisenhower's great book. We know you'll want to see it. We cannot say you will enjoy it, because it is not light entertainment. But it is a "must" if we are to understand present day problems.

With Gen. Eisenhower's recall to Washington as the nation's top military adviser to President Truman, the presentation of "Crusade in Europe" becomes the most important public service achievement yet offered by video. It will be viewed not only in Chicago but on the entire TV network, through the facilities of the March of Time, 20th Century Fox and ABC.

Contemporary history unfolds before you and your family, neighbor's children, friends as the living room becomes a classroom. The picture series are carefully documented and come from official government sources, captured enemy films, and motion pictures taken especially for television. More than 52,000 feet of film will be shown during the 26 week series.

Because of this program's importance, we are urging you to open your home to as many viewers as possible. School organizations, civic clubs, study groups of International Relations, all will want to absorb the vital information from these episodes.

COAST-to-COAST television is not far off, according to word this week from officials of NBC. Here is a timetable for network expansion. By July 1, 1949 Wilmington will join the cable network. Hartford connections will be available in August. A Boston to Providence channel will be provided in September. The last quarter of this year promises service to Rochester, Erie, Lancaster, Utica, Syracuse, Columbus, Dayton and Cincinnati.

As early as January 1950 a Los Angeles to San Francisco cable will have been added, and a few months later Harrisburg and Norfolk will be con-

nected to the network cable. Memphis will be joined to St. Louis, Indianapolis added in March, Fort Wayne in May.

During the fourth quarter of 1950, three westbound circuits out of Chicago will be extended to Des Moines, St. Paul-Minneapolis. This leg will also serve the Davenport tri-city area.

TV TOPICS—*Arnold Stang* has emerged from his cocoon to star in WENR-TV's new video show as *Billy Bean* . . . His first appearance answered the query: "Does he look as funny as he sounds?" . . . Hero Bean plays the role of a salesman in Grimble's, world's smallest department store . . . "*Julius Caesar*" will be seen April 3 on WNBQ, channel 5, when the Masquers of Amherst College present an original telecast from the Elizabethan Playhouse of the Folger Shakespeare Memorial Library . . . Chicagoans can expect more shows, like the Harvard Hasty Pudding club productions, the Princeton Triangle Club play and the Stanford Big Game Gaieties.

Familiar Voice? It's Boris Aplon

A reader this week asked: "Why is Inspector Webb's voice so familiar to us? Our children and friends are certain he is a radio actor, yet cannot place him."

The answer is easy: Inspector Webb, WENR-TV's modernized Sherlock Holmes is Boris Aplon, heard for many years as the villain Ivan Shark in "Captain Midnight," serial for children on radio.

Aplon, who can be seen Saturday, March 19, on "Stand By for Crime," is a Chicago born actor who started his professional career when the late De Wolff Hopper discovered him playing in a stock company. Aplon toured with Hopper for two years, starring in such roles as the Mikado, Sir Joseph Porter in Pirates of Penzance, and other Gilbert and Sullivan operettas. In 1937, he entered radio, and it was then he was cast as Ivan Shark, spine-tingler.

Shortly after Pearl Harbor, Aplon joined the army signal corps and served in the invasion of North Africa and Sicily, where he was wounded and hospitalized. After a year in the hospital, he returned to duty and with Wayne King directed radio activities for the 6th Service Command, completing four years of service.

Aplon's first appearance in TV was with the opening of channel 7.

Is TV Replacing Radio's Nerve Wracking News Commentators?

"A Picture is Worth Ten Thousand Words."

The ancient Chinese who coined that axiom probably didn't have Television in mind, but one thing is certain: For a while, he had the daylights scared out of a good many Kaltenborns, Gabriel Heatters, Doug Edwardses, and other newsmen whose forte was the priming of radio's pump each day with 10,000 words.

Would a picture replace them?

The spectre also frightened a good many production men, sponsors and others, who foresaw a future in which the only successful television newscasts might be difficult, unreasonably expensive pickups direct from every scene of action.

Then a fortunate thing occurred: It was discovered there was no reason for too much gilding of the lily; the public even resented too much dressing-up of the news. Pictures—movies or directs from the scene of action are appreciated when the news warrants. But for ordinary, everyday run of the news it was discovered that down-to-earth, honest studio treatment was all the public wanted. Let them see the man giving the news, see how the news came to him, what sort of script he used—and whether he, also, smiled when he read that amusing item—and they got the "feel" of the newsroom, along with the news.

Here, at WBKB, down through the years we've tried all sorts of approaches or experiments for regular newscasts. It is a compliment to the public that, when a survey was made sometime ago, we were pleasantly surprised. The most successful program—by acclaim of fans—proved to be a name newsmen giving the news, casually letting the public in on news sidelights, glimpses of how papers all over the nation were headlining a story, and with an occasional wink from the newsmen.

The public liked this personal straight-forward treatment.

This business of letting the public in

on news has just received new impetus at WBKB. By means of the Multi-Scope, a new device developed by John H. Mitchell, manager and promotion chief S. C. Quinlan, WBKB fans now actually watch Associated Press news as it is being reported to newspapers and commentators across the country. This is not facsimile. It is the real tape, no editing, no changes of any kind. Here, surely, is newscasting at its objective best.

Behind-the-scenes, television news editors are striving for improvements. It probably isn't letting out any secret that WBKB is working on a system for illustrating regular newscasts. This will be done with professional on-the-spot pictures made by real (not synthetic) working press cameramen. Our tie-up with the energetic, scoopvy Chicago Sun-Times staff makes this possible.

These and other developments are coming so rapidly that a news editor has little time for retrospect. But when he does he probably wonders whatever happened to those fellows who used to say, "News is strictly an audio device." The public and sponsors don't seem to think so. And that makes a news editor happy.

Fabulous Tex and Jinx Meet no "Jinx" in Careers

Jinx Falkenburg, the most photogenic girl in America, has teamed up with her husband, Tex McCrary, as editors of the new CBS television show, "Preview," a show which we have been enjoying the past two weeks.

A sure cure for the Monday night blues (March 21, WGN-TV, 7 to 7:30), "Preview" is a living magazine which Tex and Jinx casually compile in an envious fashion. It doesn't take long to realize there are few people this team doesn't know.

Jinx, whose real name is Eugenia, was born in Barcelona, Spain, daughter of an American electrical engineer whose assignments took him all over the world and subsequently gave Jinx the opportunity of spending her girlhood in Chile and Brazil. It wasn't long before she made a name for herself as an amateur tennis player and swimmer.

Then the Falkenburgs moved to Hollywood, and there Jinx began a modeling career which made her the cover girl of nearly every well-known magazine, and eventually a motion picture star.

During the war, Jinx and Pat O'Brien made a tremendous hit with war-weary GIs, putting on one-day stands in the China-Burma-India theater of operations, a 42,000 mile-long run.

Husband John Reagen McCrary stands on his own record. Born some 39 years ago in Calvert, Texas, Tex was educated at Phillips Exeter Academy and Yale. He entered the newspaper business shortly after graduation as a reporter for the New York World-Telegram, then the Daily Mirror and at the ripe old age of 23 became the Mirror's chief editorial writer!

McCrary stayed with the Mirror until 1941 when he joined Pathé News as a commentator, writer and director of newsreels. Later that war year he joined the Air Forces, saw action during the London blitz, and later served in France as a paratrooper. Tex also jumped with British paratroopers in Greece.

Back in civvies, he served as executive

editor of the American Mercury magazine and found time to write "First of the Many," a book about the Eighth Air Force in Europe.

In 1946, the couple entered radio with their husband-and-wife team, "Hi Jinx." Television scouts had no trouble in deciding the pair was a natural for video.

The incredibly busy schedule of the couple is best demonstrated by the fact that Jinx took only two days away from her radio program in July 1946 to bear the couple's first heir, John Reagen McCrary III. In fact, the evening before Paddy entered this world, Jinx whitewashed Tex in tennis singles, 6-0, 6-0! And now the busy McCrary's are four—Kevin Jack having been born in August, 1948.


