Pro and Con of UHF Tempest

This week the question is: Would you buy a television receiver today? What truth is there the set I buy may be obsolete in 60 days?

This is the answer of Wayne Coy, chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, official agency charged with setting TV policy:

"I think the question of obsolescence of television receivers is something of a tempest in a teapot. I do not think anyone buying a television set today has had a fraud perpetrated upon them."

Mr. Coy added he would have no hesitation today in buying a receiver because "present TV sets available on the market will get service from these channels continuously." Chicago, it might be pointed out, has been allocated six channels.

Coy's comments resulted from a battle of manufacturers now brewing in Chicago, New York and other TV cities. Aimed at this controversy over sets reputed able to receive programs on channels which may be added through utilization of UHF (ultra high frequency), Coy said "Until such time as the commission makes a decision, the radio manufacturing industry cannot know, with any degree of certainty, what kind of receivers to make for the future."

When will Chicago TV fans receive an answer? May or June, probably.

The editor and publisher of *Television Forecast*, in an effort to inform present TV set owners, hereby set forth the Pro and Con of the UHF tempest to point out:

—Wherever a TV signal is now available your set will render fine service for many years.

—Such sets can be converted if ultra-high frequencies are utilized.

—Present sets receiving VHF (very high frequency) will not be able to receive UHF without the addition of a converter.

No TV manufacturer, retail store salesman, newspaper or magazine

knows definitely whether UHF channels will be granted Chicago.

Coy feels that if such UHF stations are authorized for Chicago, there will be a degree of obsolescence for all of those receivers not equipped to receive video from the ultra high frequencies. "The degree of obsolescence will be determined by each individual," Coy adds. "I would buy a television receiver today because of the many worthwhile programs now available. . . . I would want to enjoy them now. I would not want to wait until some bureaucratic agency decided whether there was sufficient propagation data available to write new standards. Nor would I want to wait on some equally bureaucratic industrial establishments to produce television sets at some indefinite date in the future. . . . We at the commission cannot rush scientific development nor can we make it conform to a time schedule."

This means anyone's guess is as good as yours. UHF for Chicago may be one to three years away.

Sunday morning at 6:00 A.M., April 17, WBKB will place cameras on the roof of the fourth floor of Cook County hospital for the telecasting of a special Easter Sunrise Service.

The hospital is so constructed that ward and sickroom windows overlook the rooftop on three sides, thus enabling the patients to attend the service from their windows. In addition to the thousands of patients observing from the windows, several hundred people will be in attendance below.

A special pulpit is being built and a guest preacher will preside at the service. There will be two choirs, one composed of a group of Negro nurses, the other of hospital doctors and nurses. The telecast will run from 6:00 to 7:15 A.M.

"Over 50 Club" Membership Rolls Swell; Here's a Fan in Nebraska!

Last year at this time, a TV fan who was able to receive a Chicago station more than 50 miles away was an oddity. Since then, hundreds of *Television Forecast* readers have written to the editor, telling stories that continue to amaze most TV engineers.

From West Point, Nebraska comes this interesting note:

"Reading the current issue I note you wonder who is the longest distance *Television Forecast* reader? Sometimes I wonder, too. Perhaps I may be in line . . . for I have been one of the first readers outside of Chicago to subscribe.

Mr. Davee also pointed out Chicago's TV stations were doing a good job of video programming, and felt midwesterners have a right to be proud of pioneer stations.

A Highland Park resident this week raises the question: "Will my set become obsolete?"

"Several weeks ago you wrote an article concerning ultra high frequency and said you would advise the TV set owners how it was progressing. This week you wrote about NBC experimenting with it and about Zenith having a set with both bands. But you didn't write a word about what will happen to us poor folks who ran out and bought TV sets and because of our purchases encouraged the stations to grow and have better programming.

We pledged to keep you informed, and we shall. We do, however, predict that both UHF and VHF channels will be employed, so that no set will become obsolete.

Channels 4, 5, 7, and 9, Chicago TV stations you now receive will continue to telecast we further predict, on present frequencies.

Trout, Radio Veteran, Sets Video Sights

An NBC Saturday night show which can be seen here April 16 on channel 5, "Who Said That?" with Bob Trout is fast becoming a favorite of video viewers, although its formula is as old as radio—and you know how old radio is.

Trout supplies a quotation, his guests (usually famous personalities) are asked to supply the name of the person responsible for issuing such a remark. It's fun, and you'll find yourself playing it before long, if you haven't already.

Trout is an interesting character who leads a busy life behind a most austere British guard's mustache. At the age of 41 he has twenty years of radio work behind him, plus a new video future.

Born in Washington, D. C., in 1908, Trout started as an announcer with WSJS, the capitol station. Since then he has reported from 47 of the 48 states, has covered every national political convention since 1936, was the only American broadcaster to cover King George's coronation, and all told has reported from more than 20 countries.

Baltimore Sets Up

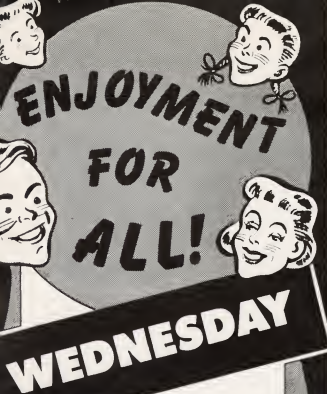
Garrity is now on radio, and assists Bob Elson and Wayne Griffin in interviews during WENR-TV's boxing and wrestling telecasts.

Baseball is Back! WGN-TV Covers Sox

Get the easy chair in shape, stock up the refrigerator with refreshments, forget your worries: baseball is back! On April 22, the Chicago Sox opens at Comiskey Park facing St. Louis, the event to be telecast in its entirety by WGN-TV, channel 9. Old friend Jack Brickhouse will be back to describe the game.

All 77 games scheduled will be telecast, including 22 night games the first of which will take place May 10 against Philadelphia. Night games, WGN-TV point out, will take precedence over other evening telecasts.

WGN-TV will also cover the Cubs, as announced earlier. This week the annual city series are being played. April 15 was the opener at Wrigley field; April 16 (Saturday) you'll be able to catch the second game at Comiskey and the final will be played the following day at Wrigley.

WGN-TV's first telecast of an officially scheduled game will be the Cubs opener against Pittsburgh April 19.

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Statements the Public Should Read

In a published letter written in the public interest by Senator Edwin C. Johnson, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce, dated February 15, 1949, to the Honorable Wayne Coy, Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, Senator Johnson said among other things:

Quote: "Also, we are concerned deeply with respect to the marketing of television sets. Television-set manufacturers and spokesmen for some broadcasters have repeatedly declared that present-day sets will not be outmoded in the near future. Nevertheless, it appears obvious to us that when and if licensing is authorized in the ultra-high-frequencies and television develops in those frequencies, television sets being manufactured today will be obsolescent. While it is contended that an attachment can be made which will meet such a contingency, in part, we are not greatly impressed with the efficacy of similar attachments for FM frequency shifts. We note that no purchaser of a television set today is warned or advised that such an attachment may be necessary or, in fact, that in a matter of a few months or years, the set for which he is paying \$200 to \$1,000 may be junk. We wonder, therefore, if some action cannot be taken by the Federal Communications Commission which would result in set-manufacturers making clear to such buyers that *caveat emptor* should not enter into the purchase of such a highly complex and intricate mechanism as a television set.

"We understand that the Federal Communications Commission has no present

legal authority to compel such action. If the Commission is of this opinion also, or that suggestions to television manufacturers to correct this practice may fall on deaf ears, we would appreciate recommendations for legislation to meet this problem. The public requires protection." **Unquote.**

Chairman Wayne Coy, by direction of the Federal Communications Commission, in responding to Senator Johnson's letter on February 25th, said among other things:

Quote: "The 12 channels presently available for television are not nearly enough to take care of the demand." * * * "Of course, if ultra high channels are added there will be some obsolescence. To be sure, converters can readily be made which will alleviate the matter somewhat, but as recognized in your letter converters are not as satisfactory as regular receivers." **End of quote.**

In its May, 1945, published report the Federal Communication Commission stated, "... there is insufficient spectrum space available below 300 megacycles to make possible a truly nation-wide and competitive television system . . . development of the upper portion of the spectrum is necessary for the establishment of a truly nation-wide and competitive television system."

In a public notice issued on May 5, 1948, the FCC reiterated its opinion of May, 1945, and pointed out that the 475-890 megacycle band would have to be used for television if this country were to have a nation-wide competitive system of television.

So public notice has been given by FCC.

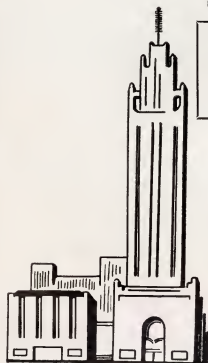

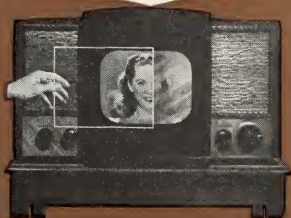
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
