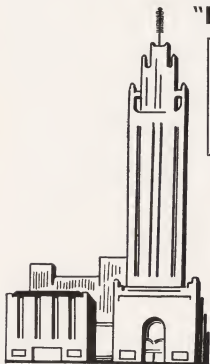

EDITOR'S REPORT:

Chuck and Jack Revisit Chicago

Chuck and Jack Luchsinger, the two young television artists seen weekly on ABC-TV's Cartoon Teletales program, have been receiving an abundance of mail from Chicago viewers who remember the days when the Luchsingers worked their way through schools in the Windy City.

After public school education in their home town of Moline, Ill., Chuck and Jack moved to Chicago. Although the two arrived together, their pursuits were quite different. While Jack worked as a waiter and bus boy in the Ontra restaurant, Chuck operated an elevator in the LaSalle hotel. Chuck worked his way through the Chicago Academy of Art and Jack through the various acting schools he attended.

While playing parts in local theatre productions, Jack met a River Forest girl who later became his wife. Jack recalls rooming with Sid Breese, now starring in the WENR-TV productions of "Stump the Authors" and the "ABC Television Players."

Visited the Zoo

Most of Chuck's spare time in those early days was spent at the Chicago Zoo where he practiced sketching various types of animals. This proved to be of great help in his work on Cartoon Teletales. Chuck, also, has found an old friend via the new cable. An old Army buddy, Boris Aplon, is now playing the part of Inspector Webb on ABC-TV's "Stand By For Crime."

While working on "Yank" magazine, Chuck came upon the idea of combining gag-cartooning, chalk-talks and children's stories into a television show. After the war they worked out their plan and began televising May 26, 1948, from WFIL-TV, Philadelphia.

Popularity Grows

Since that first telecast, Cartoon Teletales has gained popularity so steadily that it is now among the leading children's programs. The brothers receive fan mail regularly from as far south as Atlanta, Ga., to Boston in the

North. They say they can count on at least 11 viewers because they have that many nieces and nephews in Chicago, who have guaranteed to be at the television set when the show is telecast.

TV TOPICS: Our Girl Friday reports WGN-TV, channel 9, will telecast films of the Kentucky Derby on Sunday, May 8, just one day after the famous race is run. . . . CBS-TV, Louisville will televise the event locally, but at this writing no coaxial cable hookup for Chicago is seen. . . . In a recent survey it was discovered one out of every 16 students at South Shore high school, Chicago, live in homes having TV sets! . . . Students, teachers discovered, were "looking in" on the average of nearly 24 hours per week, the equivalent of attending a double feature every night. . . . Philip Lewis, South Shore instructor and TV editor for Educational Screen Magazine has been doing the research.

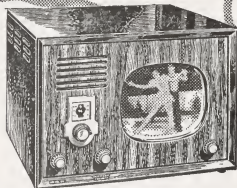
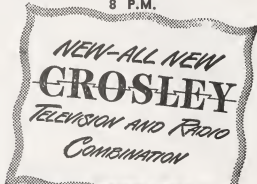

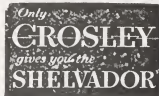

Meet "The Man with a Memory"

This is a man with a memory.

This is John Cameron Swayze whose encyclopedic mind will be exhibited again this week, Saturday, April 16 on "Who Said That?" a regular WNBQ feature on channel 5, sponsored by Crosley.

Swayze is able to identify more well-known quotations on this program than all other experts combined, so finely developed is his memory. News commentator on the Camel "News Caravan" as well, Swayze memorizes the headlines news of the day, then appears before the telecamera without a script.

As a "very little boy," he explains, his parents taught him the art of elocution. He could be heard, hand clasped in his mother's as they walked down the street, reciting whole passages from well-known authors. Within a few years he became a champion debater at grammar school, then at high school, being able to rebut with answers that sounded as though he had memorized them straight out of Blackstone.

Turning from elocution to dramatics, Swayze further intensified the process of quick memorization. After a few rounds with amateur dramatics and the onslaught of the depression, he turned to newspaper work and radio on the side. For radio, he found that memorization was not necessary.

Joe Kelly, Ex-Boy Soprano, Band Leader, MC's Quiz Kids on WNBQ

If someone was to tell you Joe Kelly, quizmaster of WNBQ's "Quiz Kid" show was once billed on theatre marquees as the "Irish Nightingale" it would be hard to believe.

Yet, the gentleman you'll see Tuesday, April 26 on channel 5 is the same ex-soprano who left Nell O'Brien's Minstrel show and Kelly's Klowns and settled down to a career in radio, and eventually television.

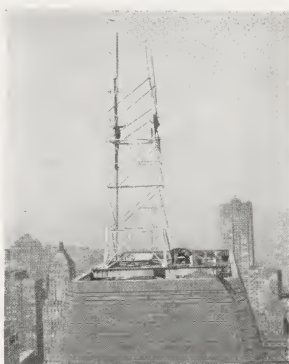
When other kids were learning the rudiments of arithmetic and geography, Joe Kelly of Crawfordsville, Indiana, was getting his education the hard way. He learned geography from the roads he traveled and mathematics from handling his own finances.

Joe was born in Crawfordsville in 1901. When young Kelly was eight, his father died and the youngster went into show business as a boy soprano to help support his mother. At 11, he was traveling the highways with O'Brien and earning \$75 a week. Decked in a lavish purple satin suit, he paraded daily in a carriage drawn by two white horses while the rest of the troupe walked. Two years later, his voice picked the worst possible minute to change—in the middle of a long-drawn high C—and Joe was out of a job.

Organizes Orchestra

He returned to Indianapolis and an office boy's chores, which he livened by spending his noon hours at the dime store listening to the girls play the piano. Although he couldn't read a note (and still can't) he optimistically organized his own orchestra, known by the highflown title of Kelly's Klowns. To his everlasting amazement, the Klowns got plenty of good bookings for several years. Then, at 17, he gave up the band business and went into stock, playing the sticks until his marriage in 1923.

Joe thought a benedict should settle down, and so he did—in Benton Harbor, Mich., selling pianos and victrolas. A limited market, however, drove him back to the band business for a brief spell, but the living was so precarious he became a manager of a clothing

store, a job he kept until 1929.

Then the new-fangled gadget called radio caught his eye and Joe decided there was a future in it. So he rounded up a gentleman named Jack Holden, now National Barn Dance announcer, and together they formed a comedy singing team called "The Two Lunatics of the Air" for a dairy company sponsor. They gave six half-hour shows a week and were paid \$12 per and all the milk they could drink.

Enters Chicago Radio

Kelly headed for Chicago in 1933 as announcer for a local station where he "opened the station at 4:00 a.m. and closed it at midnight."

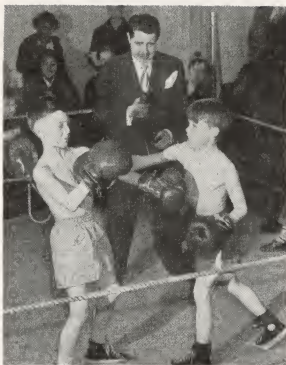

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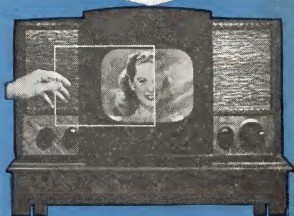
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
