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Test Pattern More Than Odd Picture

Telebugs who like semi-technical articles should find this just the answer to questions they may have regarding test patterns.

A television picture passes through many complicated pieces of equipment from the time it is picked up by an electronic camera tube until it is reproduced on the screen of a home receiver. Some means of judging performance is required if this equipment is to be properly adjusted.

It is difficult for an observer to determine essential characteristics of picture quality if regular program material or a casually chosen photograph are observed on a receiver or on a studio picture monitor. Consequently, several forms of stationery charts or test patterns have been devised to provide information on the performance of a receiver or an entire television system.

Test charts such as this provide specific information which aids in securing proper adjustment of transmitting equipment as well as home receivers. This specific information covers such items as geometric form, picture size, aspect ratio, resolution, vertical and horizontal sweep linearity, contrast and focus.

In simpler terms, "geometric form" means the general shape of objects appearing in a television picture. A round basketball should not appear oval, and a short fat man should not look tall and thin.

"Picture size" should be adjusted so that the picture just fills the viewing screen.

"Aspect ratio" means the comparative width and height of a television picture. For proper reception the ratio of picture width to height should have a 4-to-3 relationship. In other words the picture should be three quarters as high as it is wide. Referring to the test pattern shown, the radii of the outer white and black circles have this 4-to-3 relationship. Thus the proper picture aspect ratio is established with the aid

of a test pattern when the controls of a receiver are adjusted so that the white circle touches the horizontal limits and the black circle touches the vertical limits of the picture screen. Controls to center the picture properly are also adjusted by watching the test pattern.

"Resolution" describes the amount of fine detail which can be seen in a television picture. The test pattern permits an observer to determine resolution by reference to the two vertical wedges and the two horizontal wedges shown in the illustration. These wedges are made up of straight lines converging to the center of the pattern. If the individual lines of the vertical wedges are clearly distinguishable at the edge of the inner white circle the system is capable of maximum resolution and should produce clear and detailed pictures.

A television receiver is said to provide 160-line definition if the lines in

Located 100 miles directly east of Chicago, Kloss believes he could have received Texas better if his antenna wasn't permanently fixed on Chicago.

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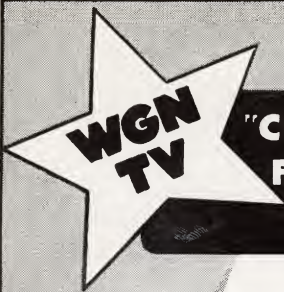

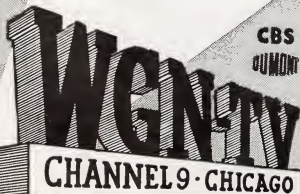

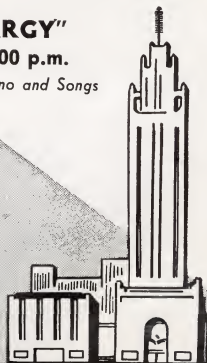

Naturally they are accustomed to my methods of direction, and therefore one of the problems of putting on weekly dramas is simplified.

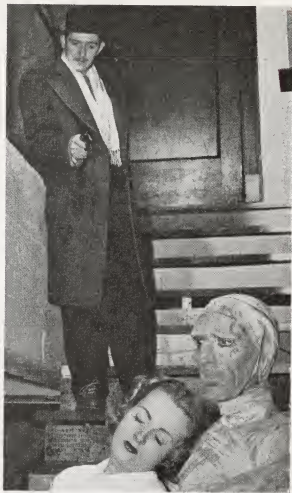
Unlike other forms of entertainment, our WGN-TV program does not have long hours of rehearsal, and the fluffing of a line or action stands for the record. There can be no prompting or retakes, and, of course, no film to be cut or edited, as in Hollywood.

An inexpensive production utilizing a minimum of facilities, our weekly "whodunit" sets are simple and are utilized to the utmost so that the desired illusion is sustained for the viewing audience.

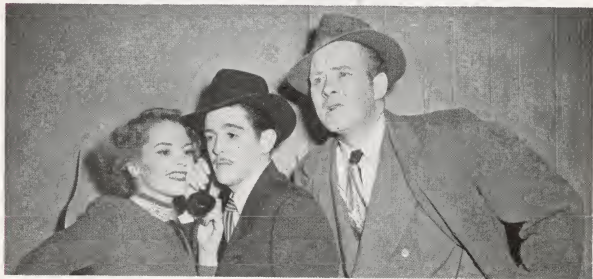
All camera cueing must be rapid, so that action, visual clues, plot and deduction are given in their entirety in one-half hour. That half-hour feels more like 15 minutes. I do not work with a script in shooting the show, but memorize it along with the actors. However, I do have a script girl at my side with instructions to call the cues one second afterwards, in the event I miss one.

Scripts come in approximately seven days before the show; they are mimeographed and on Thursday evenings the cast is given copies, at which time there

Meet Don Anderson, He's Happy with TV

Since the first of the year you've heard the soft, deep voice of Don Anderson on WBKB, channel 4. Maybe you'll recall seeing him on the Manny Oppen show or on Ernie Simon's Curbstone Cut-Up. This week, Chicago-born Don Anderson can be seen and heard with Lynn Chalmers, a pleasing combination.

Although a Chicagoan, Anderson has spent little time in our city, for at the age of 17 he went to sea as a wiper. Says Anderson, "A wiper is the lowest

form of a sailor." It was while in the maritime service he sailed all over the world. His choice of standout ports are South Africa, France, England and South America. The wiper spent nearly a year in Wellington, New Zealand, when his damaged ship was forced to the repair dock.

In 1943 Anderson returned to the States and enlisted in the Army. He graduated from Air Cadets and spent a year and a half with the 8th and 9th Air Forces. He returned to the sea after leaving the Army as a Port Engineer for a large steamship company and spent some time in Le Havre, France, on this assignment.

this test pattern wedge are just distinguishable at the outer black circle. Similarly, the picture is considered to have 380-line definition if the individual wedge lines can be seen at the inner white circle. A satisfactorily operating television receiver should show distinguishable lines in the test pattern wedges over at least the outer three fifths of their length.

Vertical resolution is determined by observing how close to the center white area the lines of the horizontal wedges can be resolved. Horizontal resolution, which is more difficult to obtain, is judged by determining the extent to which individual lines of the vertical wedge are retained.

Vertical and horizontal "sweep linearity" are good if all the concentric circles appear round. Most home receivers have adjustments for controlling sweep linearity which the service man properly adjusts while observing a test pattern on the receiver's screen.

"Contrast" of a picture is its ability to show various levels of gray in addition to just black and white. Contrast is properly adjusted with the aid of the illustrated test pattern when the inner black ring looks black and the successively lighter gray areas can be distinguished out to the heavy black circle.

An image is adjusted for proper "focus" when close examination of the picture discloses the image to be composed of many fine, closely-spaced lines.

So, when you see a test pattern on the viewing screen of a television receiver, remember that this peculiar looking picture is being sent out by a television transmitter to help engineers adjust the station's complex equipment and to enable service men to properly install and align home television receivers.

are several readings and sometimes partial blocking.

Friday the dialogue is memorized, almost word for word. Saturday night complete blocking of the show takes place, and on Sunday afternoon—just a few hours before the program begins—the director is available for conference with all departments.

Sunday evening, when the cast appears at the studio, the sets are up and a quick camera rehearsal takes place, the director working out technical problems and location of cameras. A few minutes later the show goes on. A half-hour later I'm faced with the same old assignment: another "whodunit."

I feel that in spite of the difficulties inherent in presenting a mystery telecast each week on WGN-TV, the Mystery Players week after week turn out adequate video entertainment.
