

Our Readers Make TV News

Elsewhere in this issue you'll read letters from readers of *Television Forecast* who are making news in their communities by receiving telecasts from Texas and Florida, breaking long-distance records.

Each week a dozen or more readers offer suggestions on reception, transmission or programming that is in turn forwarded to Chicago TV stations and studied by staff personnel in an attempt to match the desires of midwest television viewers.

No suggestion was more outstanding this week than that of *Mr. W. H. Parr* of Chicago who felt the master-mentalist, Dunninger (WNBQ, Thursdays) should be drafted immediately into the U. S. State Department. Mr. Parr felt that if Dunninger possessed the certain something enabling him to "read the minds of others," he would be a logical choice to assign to foreign ministers conferences, meetings of allied nations, and other international events. It may be interesting to know what men like Molotov and Vishinsky are thinking.

Another Chicagoan, *William Bentch-off*, suggests some Chicago TV station televise Traffic Court. Mayor Kennelly may think this an excellent idea; certainly his safety committee should see the widespread publicity such a show would produce. It may cut down the number of violations; on the other hand, it may increase your chances of appearing on television!

Reader *Jean Pishko* enjoys "Tinker O'Toole" (WENR-TV) but feels it is too masculine for her. She'd like to view a television show with hints and suggestions for hair styling. Some smart sponsor may see the large audience for a show of this type and incorporate it into a special woman's show.

Leona Kathrein is against summer vacations for TV shows. Reason: she misses Club Television (WGN-TV) and Lee Bennett. "I'd just as soon throw my television set out the window" than miss Lee, she says. As in radio, some

TV shows are disappearing for the summer months. Most of them will be back in the fall. One network, DuMont, startled the entire TV world this week when they announced plans for beginning 54 new programs.

WBKB to Open New Transmitter June 16

Reserve Thursday evening, June 16 for a mammoth TV celebration to be staged by WBKB, channel 4. On this date, the Balaban & Katz station will officially open its new transmitter atop the American National Bank building, 33 North La Salle, in addition to celebrating its eighth anniversary in television.

The June 18 issue of *Television Forecast* will be dedicated to WBKB and contain special features and pictures of the new equipment designed to produce better video reception for midwest viewers.

From the stage of the Chicago Theatre, WBKB will wind up the evening's celebration with a star-studded stage revue, revealing for the first time in Chicago the elaborate teletranscription system installed in the theater.

After June 18, theatergoers will witness TV shows selected by WBKB for spot entertainment, in addition to the regular fare of motion pictures.

More details of channel 4's eighth birthday will be told in the next issue of this magazine.

View City Life On "Hurlbut's Notebook"



Emcee Jack Brand of "Action Autographs" is bringing something new to WENR-TV fans each Sunday at 9 p.m. in a program that knits studio action and film sequences, providing entertainment or educational information that otherwise may be denied midwesterners.

Let's go behind-the-scenes of a recent "Actions Autographs" show that took but 15 minutes on the screen, yet was the result of weeks of work, research, editing and planning on the part of Brand Productions, producers of this new Bell and Howell company television program.

Bell and Howell wanted to present a picture depicting the recent atomic bomb tests at Bikini, conducted by the U.S. armed forces for research purposes. Jack Brand immediately sought Col. Perry Thomas and Commander Albert Carter to tell their experiences as heretofore restricted Army and Navy films were unveiled before a vast video audience.

Thomas was chief photographic officer at Bikini. The motion pictures were taken by men under his command. Com-

mander Carter, now executive officer at the Great Lake Naval Training Center, told telefans the Navy side of the story. And he was just the man to tell it, for his ship was taken from him to be blown up at Bikini.

More than 60,000 feet of motion picture film was taken of the A-Bomb blast. The War Department agreed to loan approximately 3,000 feet to tell the story on television. To boil it down to a 15 minute show, Brand and crew edited the choicest parts down to 200 feet.

To provide a realistic touch to the show, assistant producer Jim Shaw wanted a cutaway section of a B-29 superfortress. The Air Force was called on for help. They offered a B-29 in its entirety, but refused to cut one in half for the program, therefore WENR-TV had to fabricate one with stage props.

To lend further atmosphere to the set, the Army loaned two parachutes to the set, and the Navy loaned its \$5000 plastic miniature model of the Bikini atoll as it was before the A-Bomb. Another set duplicated the bridge of the ship from which Brand, Thomas and Carter "observed" the explosion.



The Wendy Barrie Story: She Loathes Cocktails, Loves Her Husband & TV

Here's a gal who insists she'd never be in TV if it hadn't been for her husband. She's Wendy Barrie, star of WGN-TV's three-a-week video show, "Inside Photoplay."

This week we learned how this former screen star entered television. The story starts in Hongkong, where Wendy was born. The daughter of a King's Counselor (British barrister) Wendy Barrie went to London to start school, later went to Switzerland for advanced schooling, and before she was 17 had travelled between Hongkong, London, Siberia, and Canada, so much she had been around the world seven times!

At 18, Wendy went to England to be presented at Court, but instead took the role of Jane Seymour in "Henry the Eighth," offered her by Alexander Korda. She had never before acted, and her mother has never quite recovered from the surprise.


While visiting America Wendy met Zeppo, one of the Marx brothers and he decided to get her into pictures with a truly Hollywoodian stunt.

After 10 years of film making in Hollywood, Wendy Barrie felt the need for a change and came east to do a legitimate show, "Morning Star," directed by Guthrie McClintic, starring Gregory Peck. From the stage she entered radio, occasionally making a few motion pictures.

In 1944 she came to New York for a vacation with her mother, and they went to a cocktail party together. (Wendy insists she loathes cocktail parties.) The moment they walked in "there was this man standing there with a glass in his hand." Her mother said, "I saw him first!" Eleven weeks later Wendy was married to David L. Meyer and began to take an interest in her home, husband and the links. From there it was just a 'chip shot' into television stardom."
