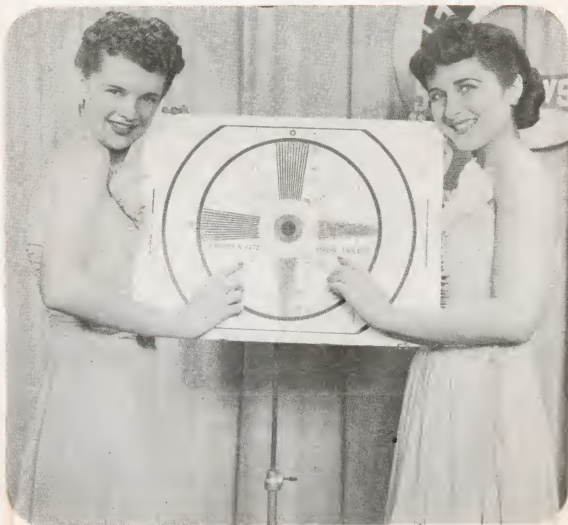

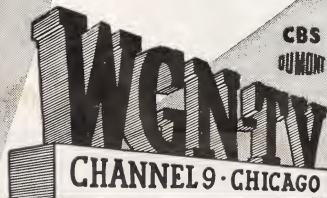

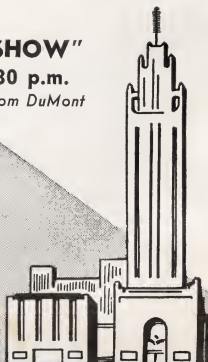

IT MAY BE SUMMER, BUT—

TV People are Talking Football

This week, when most of us are talking about the heat, summer television shows, and whether to buy a portable receiver to take up to the summer home, TV people are planning and talking about telecasting the Notre Dame games this fall.

WGN-TV and WBKB took the lead with word they will have exclusive coverage of all top Notre Dame grid contests through arrangements with the DuMont television network, assuring Chicagoans they'll see the fighting Irish play Indiana, Tulane, North Carolina, Iowa and Southern California.

Few readers realize how much competition there is in the TV trade to obtain such rights. Telecasting Notre Dame is regarded by all as a plum. Chicagoans who attended Northwestern, Illinois, Beloit, Georgia or DePauw, sooner or later include themselves in the Notre Dame alumni, which means hundreds of thousands will be watching the Irish fight.

Sports lovers will also be pleased to know that beginning June 20 WBKB will telecast Arlington and Washington Park races every night except Sunday. Races will be recorded on film at the park, processed and rushed to channel 4 studios and shown at night. Jack Drees, commentator, will describe the races and also take viewers on nightly trips around the track, introducing them to owners, trainers and racing celebrities.

There is a current gag in the television studios of WENR-TV that Claude Kirchner, ringmaster on "Super Circus," is so tall that the camera must "pan" up and down to get all of his image onto the TV screen. Actually, the white-trousered, red-coated host of the three-ring circus is a modest six-foot-five whose background is slightly more than international.

Claude, or Klaus, as he was yclept at birth, was born in Rostock, Germany.

His father was born in China, his mother in Russia. His background of "far-away places" was occasioned by the occupation of his father, who was an importer by profession.

When Kirchner was nine years old he came with his family to the United States and after debarking from the ship in New York the family came directly to Chicago, where they have remained ever since.

Ringmaster of Super Circus Kirchner holds the distinction of having been the first barker for Sally Rand at Chicago's Century of Progress exposition in 1934. At the time, he had just graduated from high school and felt more than an ordinary hankering to revisit Europe. At the end of that summer he had earned enough money with his vocal vibrancy that he joined the crew of a freighter and traveled to Germany, Switzerland, France, Norway, Italy and Denmark. When he returned in 1935 he enrolled at Chicago University in a course designed to equip him for a

WBKB to Telecast First Trip to Moon!

Lots of fun and laughs around WBKB this week, their 8th anniversary in TV. Ernie Simon cracked "We passed up the eclipse of the moon, but we're getting all set to telecast the first trip to the moon!"

Constantly out for "firsts" in video, WBKB won't surprise the TV industry if they obtain rights for such a lunar jaunt. Simon even thinks channel 4 will engage Russ

Davis to do the announcing, while boss-man John Mitchell is certain such a trip can be sold to Philco as sponsors.

Eight years ago, on June 16, WBKB racked up their "first" play. No one remembers what it was, or who starred in it, but the TV log for the day read:

4:20 to 4:28 p.m.—Test Pattern

4:30 to 4:35 p.m.—Test Pattern

5:00 to 5:06 p.m.—Test Pattern

5:08 to 5:18 p.m.—Play

Quite a change from today's programming. In 1941 the enthusiastic, bright-eyed engineers worked 14 to 18 hours a day to bring some kind of picture on the screen, and when they succeeded the whole gang rushed into the office of the boss, stood around his set, and admired the fuzzy poor signal.

Understandable. W9XBK, as WBKB was known then, used only one camera and radiated power up to 100 watts. Today there are 14 cameras, six remotes, two projectors, four studio and two spare. The station generates 13,000 watts; can go up to 26,000 if desired. All this in eight years!

Controversy Rages Over Mystery Shows

A recent paid advertisement in *Television Forecast* attacking TV mystery shows and films depicting murders has resulted in a flood of letters to the editors of this newsmagazine.

A large number of readers disagree with the suggestion that such video fare be banned from the home; an equal number feel revision of program hours is necessary.

Writes A. J. Robertson of Chicago:

"I am surprised that you are so hard up for advertising as to permit such a controversial subject to be set out in your publication.

"I, too, have a growing son. He has cap pistols, rubber knives, slingshots, etc.; he reads all the exciting books of adventure. He has a file of comic books equal to none; he enjoys the cowboy and murder mystery movies, and watches the same on television.

"In fact, he does all of the things I and thousands of others have done and always will do as a child. It did me no harm that I know of, and certainly none to my boy."

Writes John E. Thompson of Chicago:

"Congratulations. Maybe a letter to Congressmen or to the F.C.C. will result in later schedules of horror and mystery shows, now being seen as early as 7:30 p.m. I am not for banning such shows, but do feel they should be moved up to at least 9 p.m."

W. R. Taylor of Chicago writes:

"I am not capable of purchasing a whole page to show to you my likes and dislikes . . . however, I am sure that I can wait till the programs get so bad that I won't even turn my set on before I write such criticism.

"I have a five year old son, and I'm sure that he likes the shows that appear now as well as I. Trying to judge the shows that I feel worthy and educational proves something difficult, but it is much easier to change the channel, select and find another program, than to try and rabble rouse, as your advertiser did."

Ghost Images Gone, Engineers Report

The new WBKB transmitter opened this week by B. & K. officials represents a 100 percent increase in effective radiated power, eliminating ghosts previously seen on some channel 4 telecasts.

Engineers who reported this also stated the total height of the new antenna is 700 feet, excluding beacon and lightning rod at the top. The tallest in Chicago, WBKB's new antenna promises good reception for at least 60 miles.

Cost of the entire project, antenna and transmission, is estimated at a quarter of a million dollars.

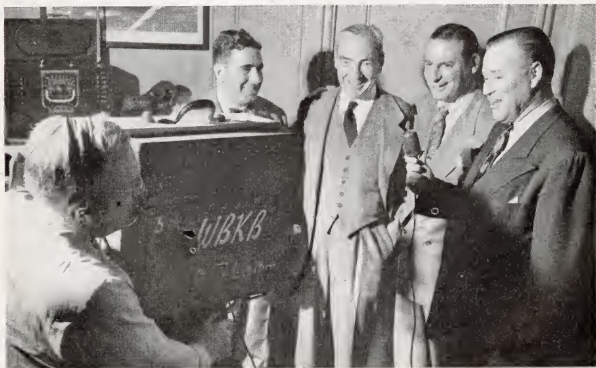

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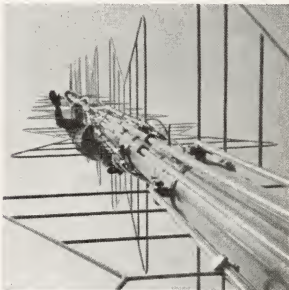

THE GOOD OLD DAYS

Viewer Picks Up W9XBK's Signal Five Miles From Loop, a Record!

(See Cover)

It's a bit hard to believe the attractive girls seen on the cover of this issue of *Television Forecast* were photographed in the spring of 1941 when WBKB's first test pattern was shown to the viewing public. At that time, the B. & K. station was experimental, with call letters W9XBK, and a signal scarcely strong enough to reach out of the immediate loop area.

A televiewer five miles from the station able to catch the signal was an oddity. For those at the station it was a great moment. After all, there were less than 100 sets in Chicago.

Eight years ago, W9XBK operated from a studio the size of a kitchenette apartment and a control room that was no larger. At the top was Capt. W. C. Eddy and A. H. Broolly, chief engineer, who persistently worked on producing better programs and a stronger signal. Eddy, who knew the names and phone numbers of practically every set owner in Chicago, regularly called them up to query about reception as soon as something appeared on the screen that was recognizable.

Then the war came. B. & K. at once offered its facilities to the Navy; most of the space and equipment was used in training radar operators. W9XBK, however, continued to operate with the aid of the "Iron Women" crew, Kit Carson, Esther Rojewski, Rae Stewart, Marge Durnell, Lorraine Larson, Pauline Bobrov and Eugenia Minetz.

Of that group, Misses Stewart and Rojewski continue as WBKB camera operators, and as far as is known, they are the only two camerawomen in the United States.

In August of 1942, W9XBK obtained a construction permit for its commercial station, WBKB. Two months later WBKB, channel 4, made its debut. Sets still numbered in the hundreds, reception was poor, and business even worse; the nation was going through a war.

With the end of hostilities, WBKB made immediate plans to match the demand for TV sets and increased programming. The use of radar in World War II had made thousands of veterans interested in electronics, and factories that had been manufacturing such equipment switched to video production.

This week, as WBKB observes its special celebration of eight years in TV they have this to say:

"B. & K. through its television station WBKB will give Chicago video fans the kind of comfort and solid entertainment they have come to expect in B. & K. theaters in the past 31 years."

career in medicine. At the end of his first year he found his finances dwindling. He traveled to Dallas, Texas, where a state fair was under way, and applied for a job once more as a Barker.

During the same summer he applied for a position as announcer with a local Dallas station and was successfully auditioned. He returned to Chicago university for one year but the lure of the microphone overpowered his purely academic ambitions. He applied to the manager of WROK in Rockford, Ill., for an announcing position, and at the end of his sophomore year joined that station.

In the years that followed he announced for WTMJ, Milwaukee; two major networks in Chicago and, in 1943 enlisted in the Coast Guard as a seaman. A year later he was promoted to ensign, and he was discharged in 1946 with the rank of Lieutenant.

Since that date he has announced many of Chicago's radio programs, including ABC's "Ladies, Be Seated." He also announces the open air summer concerts which are conducted in Grant Park.

When WENR-TV made its entrance into the television field in September, 1948, Claude was chosen from a field of 20 auditionists to serve as ringmaster of "Super Circus."

In the American League, Joe thinks Cleveland will repeat, with New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Detroit, Chicago, Washington, and St. Louis following.

New TV set owners who have not read earlier sketches of Joe Wilson's



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life may be interested to know the channel 4 sportscaster studied drama at Northwestern university. Following graduation Wilson went east to seek a job in a stock company.

He was told to return in six months with possibilities of a job at that time but instead of waiting he got married and never did go back.

On entering a bus one day in his native Minnesota, cradle of American hockey players, Joe met a former radio actor who was describing hockey games. He accepted an invitation to join his old friend and, during the intermission, was given a chance to voice his opinion as to the turn of events in the game. When the regular announcer didn't return in time to continue, Joe took over and did such an excellent job that he was retained. He's been at it ever since.

From Minnesota, Joe barnstormed the small station circuit through Wisconsin and finally landed in Ohio. Next Joe went to Cleveland and then came to Chicago.

In 1943 he became sports announcer for the central division of the ABC network. Here he worked with Harry Wismer on sports, particularly football, from 1943 to 1945.

Three years later, after working on TV intermittently, Joe became a permanent staff member of WBKB, where he now holds forth as one of the country's top sportscasters.
