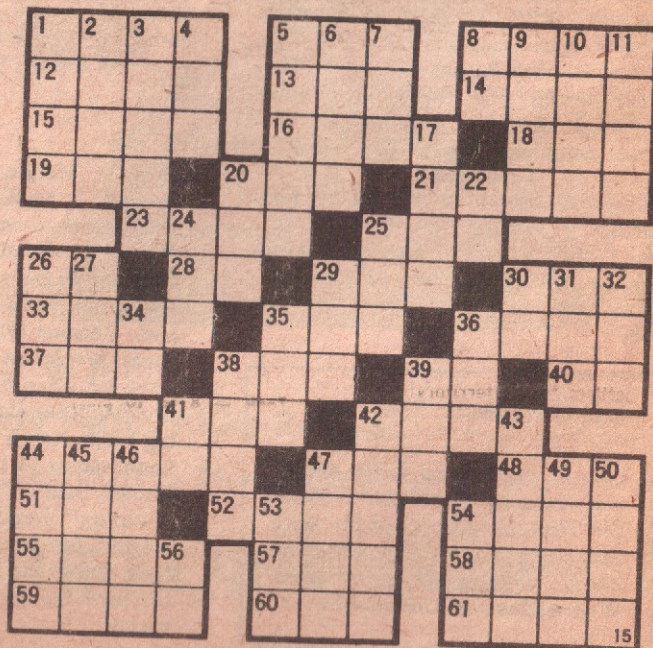

**C: White Lightning** — 8 to 10 p.m., 5 Burt Reynolds is Gator McKluskey, a good ol' boy let out of jail to spy on some moonshiners for the feds and, at the same time, secretly nail the sheriff who drowned his "hippie protester" brother. Sadly, the film is just another one of those over distilled clichés about Dixie dummies, dirt-track racing and degenerate moonshiners. With Jennifer Billingsley, Ned Beatty. Sour mash. ★½ ('73)

**Honky Tonk** — 8 to 10 p.m., 32 Notorious gambler (Clark Gable) meets nice girl (Lana Turner), and if you can't guess the rest, you'd better watch it. ★★ ('41)

**C: High Risk** — 8:30 to 10 p.m., 7 Six former circus performers plan the theft of a priceless art object from a Washington embassy. Made for TV ('76)

**C: Easy Rider** — 10:30 p.m. to 12:30 a.m., 7 Dennis Hop-

per's stunning portrait of two ex-drug dealers (Hopper and Peter Fonda) and their encounters on a motorcycle odyssey across the United States to Florida. Along the way, they meet hippies in communes, crazies in Mardi Gras New Orleans, rednecks and Jack Nicholson who gives a brief, brilliant performance as a bourbon-soaked liberal Southern lawyer. Tour de force. ★★ ('69)

**C: Zulu** — 10:30 p.m. to 1:15 a.m., 9 Exciting Kipling-esque epic based on an incident in South African history — the massacre of a British mission in 1879 by 4,000 Zulu warriors. Stanley Baker, Jack Hawkins, Michael Caine, Ulla Jacobsson. The battle scene is a lulu. ★★½ ('64)

**C: Man on the Outside** — 11:30 p.m. to 1 a.m., 2 Retired police lieutenant comes angrily out of retirement when his son is shot down and his grandson is kidnapped by a syndicate hit man. Lorne Greene, Lorraine Gary, Lee H. Montgomery, Jean Allison. Made for TV ('75)

**C: Tribes** — 12:30 to 2:03 a.m., 7 Well-done made-for-the-tube flick about a drafted hippie who can't be broken by the top drill sergeant. The cool cat (Jan-Michael Vincent) and his survival methods are adopted by his barracks mates, to the consternation of drill instructor Darren McGavin. Some of the scenes, including a barracks meditation, seem a bit too much, but the Marine Corps approved this story. ★★ ('70)

**Johnny Apollo** — 1:30 to 3:15 a.m., (9) When his father is indicted for embezzlement, disillusioned college boy (Tyronne Power) turns to a life of crime. With Lloyd Nolan, Dorothy Lamour, Edward Arnold. Son of a gun. ★★½ ('40)

**Harriet Craig** — 3:10 to 5:10 a.m., (2) Tepid remake of "Craig's Wife," with Joan Crawford as the domineering woman who cares more about her house than her husband. With Wendell Corey, Lucile Watson. Dull as a doormat. ★½ ('50)

**In Old California** — 4 to 5:30 p.m., (9) Young John Wayne leaves Boston and heads for California, where he clashes with the outlaw boss of a frontier town during the Gold Rush. With Binnie Barnes, Albert Dekker. ★½ ('42)

**C: Parent Trap** — 6 to 9:30 p.m., (5) Entertaining Disney flick, featuring Hayley Mills in a dual role — playing two girls who meet at camp and discover they're twins whose parents separated shortly after the girls were born. They switch places in a scheme to bring their parents back together again. With Maureen O'Hara, Brian Keith. Double bubble. ★★★ ('61)

**C: Columbo: A Case of Immunity** — 8:30 to 10 p.m., (5) Dual crimes which appear to be politically motivated put Columbo on a collision course with a suave, ruthless Middle East diplomat. Peter Falk, Hector Elizondo, Sal Mineo, Andre Lawrence. Made for TV ('75)

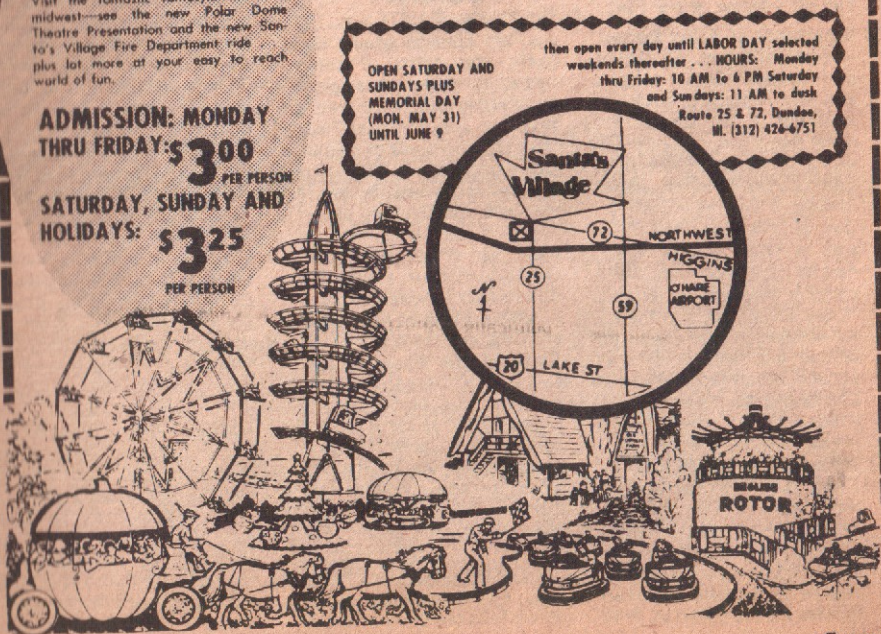

**C: Red Shoes—10 to 12:15 a.m.,** (11) Celebrated ballet movie tells the story of a bal-

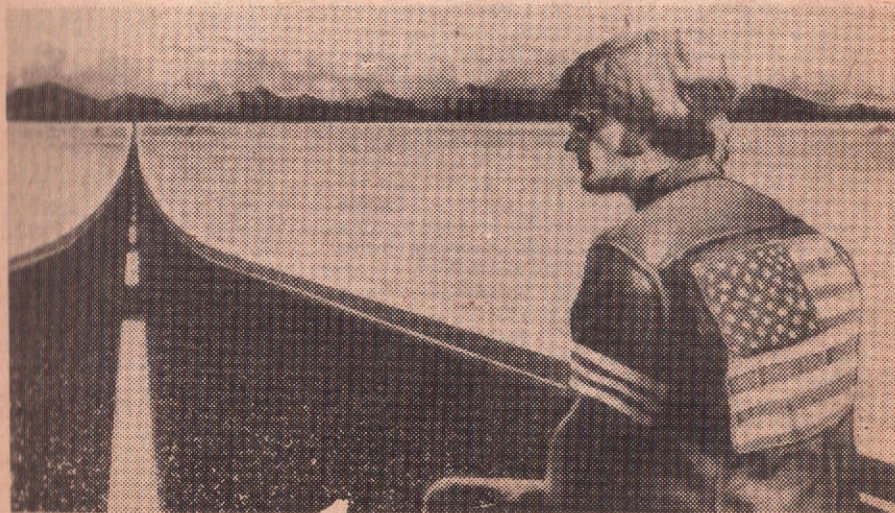

**Babes in Arms—9 to 11 a.m.,**

(9) Rodgers and Hart musical—minus most of the songs—about the children of vaudeville parents (Mickey Rooney, Judy Garland) who grow up to see vaudeville die. With Charles Winninger, Guy Kibbee; directed by Busby Berkeley. Show-biz bash. ★★½ ('40)

**C: Gimme Shelter—10 to 11:30 a.m.,** (11) Bitter milestone in rock-festival history, captured on film. It was the 1969 Altamont concert which started out to be another Woodstock but ended in a killing. The photography and recording of the Rolling Stones in performance is disappointing. But the bad vibrations hanging over the scene give the film a special power, as Mick Jagger, usually in complete control of his audience, seems unable—or unwilling—to deal with the violence. Let it bleed. ★★★★★ ('71)

**C: Halls of Anger—10:30 p.m. to 12:30 a.m.,** (2) A mostly reasonable drama about the problems of a high school with 3,000 black and 600 white students, which descends to violence and nudity for exploitation value. Calvin Lockhart, Janet MacLachlan, Jeff Bridges, Rob Reiner. Class dismissed. ★★½ ('70)

**C: Satan's Triangle—10:30 p.m. to Midnight,** (7) Shipwreck survivor and her two rescuers trespass into a part of

the ocean where strange phenomena occur. Kim Novak, Doug McClure, Alejandro Rey. **Made for TV** ('74)

**The Apartment—10:30 p.m. to 1 a.m.,** (9) Bitterly funny Billy Wilder comedy about an ambitious young man (Jack Lemmon) who gets ahead in business by loaning his apartment to senior executives for extramarital liaisons. With Shirley MacLaine, Fred MacMurray. Move in. ★★½ ('60)

**Double Dynamite—Midnight to 1:45 a.m.,** (7) A bank clerk saves a gangster's life and is suspected of being in on a theft. OK comedy, featuring three stars whose careers had hit low points when this was made: Jane Russell, Groucho Marx and Frank Sinatra. ★★ ('51)

**That Kind of Woman—1:15 to 3:10 a.m.,** (2) Girl with a shady past falls for a paratrooper heading back to New York. She tries to break off the romance but ends up going home to meet his family. Sophia Loren and Tab Hunter are woefully mismatched as the loving couple, and Barbara Nichols and Jack Warden watch helplessly from the sidelines. ★ ('59)

**C: Mr. Imperium—3:10 to 5 a.m.,** (2) May-December affair in which Lana Turner plays a Hollywood star who renews an old romance with a prince who has become a king (Ezio Pinza). Common plot for a singing king. ★★ ('51)

## THURSDAY

**Pigskin Parade—9 to 11 a.m.,** (9) Judy Garland's first film (if you don't count the short "Every Sunday") cast the 14-year-old in a music-comedy about a backward college football team with a hillbilly melon-throwing quarterback as its star, which is invited

by mistake to play a big ivy-league school. With Betty Grable, Patsy Kelly, Jack Haley. Kicky. ★★ ('56)

**C: Phantom of the Opera—3:30 to 5 p.m.,** (7) Off-key remake of the familiar thriller about a hideously scarred musician who haunts an opera house. Herbert Lom, Heather Sears. One encore too many. ★★ ('62)

**C: Shark Kill—7 to 8:30 p.m.,** (5) A skin diver and a marine biologist team up, and with their girl friends in tow, set sail in search of a killer white shark. Richard Yriguez, Phillip Clark, Jennifer Warren, Elizabeth Gill. **Made for TV** ('76)

**C: Dark Side of Innocence—8:30 to 10 p.m.,** (5) Three generations of a contemporary American family cope with the problems of the 1970s, ranging from divorce to extramarital relationships. Joanna Pettet, Anne Archer, John Anderson, Kim Hunter, Lawrence Casey. **Made for TV** ('76)
