Musical Madness

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Summer is upon us, and with the heat comes that back alley Beethoven, Spike Jones.

Jones, who keeps himself pretty well hidden from TV fans during the fall, winter and spring, seems to blossom forth each year about this time, like a late-blooming musical weed.

The gum-chewing Spike makes his debris July 17 over CBS-TV and will continue 11 weeks during which time a few music lovers will doubtlessly take to the hills.

While purists are wringing their hands, Jones will be going about his satirical way messing up the status quo.

"WELL DO a musical satire on conductor Leonard Bernstein and TV star Lloyd Bridges," Spike revealed. "We'll have the whole chorus under water."

Spike shrugged off suggestions that he might drown a few aquatic vocalists and said dispassionately, "I'm not too crazy about singers anyway."

Jones' wife, Helen Grayco, is a singer, which should prove Spike doesn't let anybody influence his opinions.

THE ZANY entertainer claimed TV hasn't had any good satire on the air in the last two years and that writers who can spoof are hard to find.

"For our show, we have wonderful writers," he said. "But, I had a hard time finding them. There aren't as many good satirical writers around today as when Jackie Gleason

and Sid Caesar were on the air,

"Satirical writers have been brainwashed by the economics of TV. By that I mean there has been so much filmed TV, that agents for writers have told them to do scripts for situation comedies.

"They've replaced their satire with folksy, family situation comedies. There are about 20 insipid husbands on TV."

SPIKE believes his shows will lead to a permanent spot for him on a network this fall and says, "If I didn't think so, I wouldn't go on this summer."

While talking about future plans, Spike revealed he is doing a "little image changing."

For Spike to change his image would seem as remote as Jack Paar and Ed Sullivan singing a duet of "I Love You Truly," but that's what Jones said.

"I'll probably go on a lecture tour, talking about the arts," said Spike, seeming to warn culture buffs to be on guard.

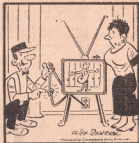
