Now TV's Trend Is to War Shows

HOLLYWOOD—Dialog with the introspective Selig J. Seligman, executive producer of *Combat*, which is one of several war series coming our way this season:

Q.—Isn't it true that war pictures is the only discernible trend on television?

A.—Yes. If you guess right, you set trends. Otherwise . . .

Q.—Why now? Why weren't the war subjects done before on network television?

A.—I used to be with Paramount theaters, and I still study the box office returns very, very carefully.

Well, the low-budget war pictures were coming out of the movie studios at the rate of a couple a year. But then, in about 1957, two or three of them took off in box office returns all out of proportion. That's when we began looking closely.

We noticed the best-seller lists—"The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich," "The Longest Day." We began to notice that local TV stations were getting large ratings on

their old movies when the movies were war pictures. It was pretty clear that the public was ready.

Q.—Can you explain why the public began to like material about World War II?

A.—I have theories that may be nothing more than rationalizations. How sound are the rationalizations? I don't know.

But it seems to me that we are in a period in which the nation is reflecting on its history and culture, where we're going and why.

We were thrown into shock about

five years ago when the Russians took the lead in the space race. Quite obviously, the nation that dominates space will dominate the earth. And a lot of us were terribly upset, almost despairing.

In time of crisis, people look to historic parallels, search for heroes with whom to identify. That's what is happening now.

And that's why we have the war series. Historic parallel, time of crisis. Heroes.

Q.—What's the format of Combat?

A.—Basic ingredients. War is classic. You have someone who feels strongly enough about what he is doing to sacrifice his life if necessary. You have the constant factor of jeopardy. You have the readily identifiable hero and enemy, and you make it even easier for the audience by putting uniforms on them.

It's similar to the Westerns and cops 'n' robbers.

We picked a lieutenant, Rick Jason, who represents authority and potential romantic interest. We have the battle-hardened, shrewd, able sergeant, played by Vic Morrow. We have the comic character, played by Shecky Greene, you know, the historic use of humor for relief of tension. We have Doc, Steve Rogers, for the idealism and innocence of youth. And we have Pierre Jalbert as a Louisiana Cajun, representing minority interests.

We set these up as the basic characters and use guest stars in roles to play off them. All this is basic in television. You see the format everywhere. The difference is in the writing and the acting.

Q.—What types of series do you predict for television in the next few years?

A.—Based on what is going on, I'd say we're becoming increasingly realistic—the medical shows, the hard-working policeman, the lawyer shows—and we're getting away from the glittering and glamorous. Look at *Naked City*, *Route 66*, *Ben Case*, *The Defenders*.

You also see this quote period of realism unquote approach in your prime-time news and documentaries.

I think we'll have series about space, though I don't know how they'll be worked out. We'll have series about life amid the complexities of urban living. The organization man. The city dweller. Big business. Big city life. Science and space.

That's where television is drifting now.

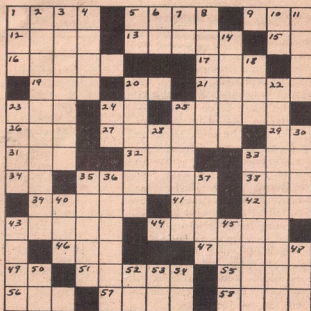

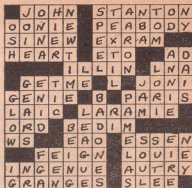

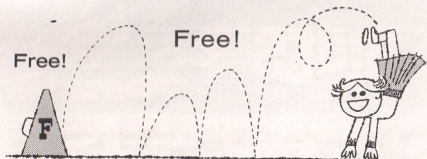
