

# Tony Fontaine

When Tony Fontaine sings, teenage girls undergo some sort of physical evolution. Heartbeats slow down. Eyelids flutter softly. Moist little hands twist nervously at handkerchiefs. Faces grow taut with torment.

The young man who inspires this type of mystic torture probably doesn't give it much thought, and would rather let the psychologists figure it out. Next to singing, Tony Fontaine would rather be munching banana splits.

*He's a handsome young tenor of 23 years of age who has stockpiled a pleasing combination of voice and manners into a brace of WGN-TV shows—"Top Tunes With Trendler" and "The Tony Fontaine Show."*

More than that, Tony is a Chicago-land boy who came back home to make good. With the solid backing of the local teen set, the Fontaine star has started to climb in the entertainment heavens.

Besides his TV stints, Tony has done well in radio and the record field. Some of his disks that move briskly are "Stranger In The City," "To Love You Is Madness" and his latest, "Vision of Bernadette." His hobbies are painting and collecting ties.

The Fontaine story started in Ann

Arbor, Michigan 23 years ago when little Anthony Trankina was born. Tony's father, a rugged individualist even for those days, soon shucked a secure job with the railroad to become a Baptist minister and establish a mission on an Indian reservation in North Dakota. Tony grew up there as the mission's star basketball player.

While still in high school, he won the Dakota State Achievement award in a vocal contest. The state university offered him a musical scholarship. Meantime, Tony had run off with a dance band—wearing a mascara mustache to disguise his age. A statewide alarm brought him back six weeks later.

Soon Tony moved to Chicago to live with his grandmother on the West Side and attend Austin high. Here he organized his own band and became locally prominent as a singer. After a stretch with a Red Cross entertainment unit overseas, Tony auditioned for the famous Major Bowes show—then considered the blue-sky-land for all good amateurs.

*Deep in the juke box bistros where earnest young talent gather is whispered in hushed tones the legend of the Bowes encore. In all history, only two performers were ever called back for one. The first was Frank Sinatra, the second Tony Fontaine.*

Not content with this fling at immortality, Tony junketed among theater appearances, teen radio shows and Hollywood movie shorts. The prodigal son finally returned to Chicago where he now is getting the right kind of breaks in show business.

On the human interest side, there's a young lady in Tony's life named Carol. He is very fond of her. Carol hasn't walked or talked since she was three years old, but she heard Tony one night and asked her mother to write for his picture.

Tony delivered it in person and fell in love with Carol. Now he visits her regularly, in fact, has helped her in learning to talk. Carol is just 12 years old.

The rise of Fontaine helps to keynote a phenomenon peculiar to U. S. vocalizing—the widespread monopoly enjoyed by crooners of Italian descent (Frank Sinatra, the late Russ Columbo, Perry Como, Frankie Laine, Johnny Desmond and recently Ray Barber in the east). Irish Bing Crosby, of course, splits the field, but technically he's a singer of ballads, not a crooner.

# Columbia College

## where students learn facts of TV Life

By HARRY FINKEL

Continuing our tours through various video schools in Chicagoland, this roving reporter visited Columbia College on South Michigan Avenue.

Founded in 1890 as a School of Speech, Columbia has progressed with the changing times, and four years ago, after a year of careful planning and organizing, the Columbia School of Television was inaugurated. The need to organize according to Dean Daniel D. Howard, "was due entirely to the infancy of the vast field. The year before, we knew that television was here to stay, and that a school in this field was necessary, but TV had come too suddenly and the knowledge had not been coordinated into presentable form for students.

"Professors also were not available since educators had to become acquainted with this mysterious new medium for entertainment."

*Now, however, leading television actors, directors, producers, technicians and writers make up the Television faculty. The instructors have been selected from active and outstanding personnel in the field.*

Comparatively few students in intimate surroundings make Columbia a haven for those who would like concentrated study in the magic field of TeeVee.

This writer watched several future actors, producers, directors, and an-

nouncers prepare a student production in professional authentic studios.

Every third Friday of each month, a video production is staged before an audience, with all stage and camera work, producing, directing, acting, and all other vital jobs completely under the supervision and handling of the young folk.

The television department has five major fields of concentration: Acting, Directing, Producing, Announcing, and Writing. The incoming student will choose one or two of these concentrated courses and develop basic skills in them. But conforming to the strict beliefs of the administration will also receive a limited amount of training and education in every other field.

*"We believe that everyone in this vast field should know something about what everyone else is doing. For example, we feel that the producer of a show should have a thorough knowledge of the abilities and limitations in the studio and of his fellow workers who unite to make the production."* So contends Michael Alexandroff, Columbia's business manager.

The student has a choice of three programs of study: the Bachelor of Speech Degree, Master of Speech, or a non-degree curriculum of concentrated professional subjects.

The Master's degree includes intensive study in the field of Speech, while



the other two courses include Television in a great measure.

The non-degree curriculum, two years in length is for those students who are interested in taking concentrated professional training, incorporating all other fields including Television. The requirements for the diploma are sixty semester-hours of study, with thirty-six of them in television.

In his first semester, after an audition the entrant decides what subjects he wants, e. g., fundamentals in speech, voice and diction, character, interpretation, and the fundamentals of television.

In his second semester he will choose his video speciality. If Production is the choice, he must learn the basic concepts in lighting, scene designing, studio technique, casting, organizing rehearsals, and analysis of script. He will continue with special courses in acting and speech and a fundamental course in writing.

Although he is a Television major, specializing in Production, he continues with other elective courses.

The final year will find our future Producer taking advanced courses in Television Production (camera technique, Dramatics, Sports and Mu-

sical), Studio Technique, which includes operation of equipment, and continued subjects in acting and writing.

Upon completion of this condensed but thorough course in Television Production he may continue toward the Bachelor's diploma, or he may, through the aid of the school's placement bureau, obtain a position in a local or national TV hookup.

*At present, out of four hundred students attending classes, two hundred of them are specializing in television. Agreeing with all other experts in the field, the administration insists that the demand is going to be far greater when the coaxial cable is completed.*

The curriculum is regulated by the Board of Examiners of the Illinois State Department of Education. When graduated, the Alumnus is qualified to teach, if certain fundamental education courses are completed.

Located at 410 South Michigan Boulevard, Columbia will welcome visitors and a postcard will bring a catalogue to the applicant. A non-profit school of higher learning, the school is governed by a Board of Directors whose sole purpose is to improve the standard of the institution.


