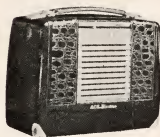

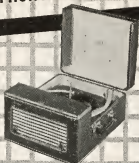

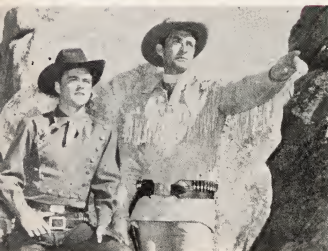

Let's Talk About Sex on TV

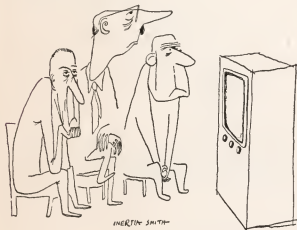
I'd like to write a column about vulgarity on television, and be cold and impersonal and unbiased about the whole thing. Unfortunately it takes a better man than me to write about smut and not sound sanctimonious. So with the calculated risk, let's talk about sex.

The Bob Hope shows are a good place to start. Bob is a great entertainer, but he fails to differentiate between playing before an auditorium full of GPs and being a guest in that GP's home, entertaining his sister and mother or his children.

On the most recent Hope show a few weeks ago one gimmick was built around Hope being measured for a suit. There was a deliberate buildup for an alleged joke about perversion. There are more flippant names for it, but that's what it is.

Later in the show Rex Harrison and Lilli Palmer, two wonderfully talented and normally tasteful artists, descended to burlesque standards with the hoary old kissing lesson routine.

The two big mysteries about this are, (1) why people such as Hope, Harrison, and Miss Palmer will cheapen themselves with this sort of bilge before six or eight million people, and (2) why NBC will tolerate it.

I think that people who object to vulgarity on television are not prudish or narrow. Martin and Lewis, on television, are many times funnier than Hope, and they never resort to vulgarity.

But in a night club, such as the Chez Paree where they just finished, Dean and Jerry can and do get very filthy. But they have sense enough not to abuse the privilege of coming into your home via television. In the night club you leave your children at home, you expect proceedings to get a little rough, and I personally enjoy them.

There is a place for a dash of sex on television, and again I think Chicago has made New York look sick in its presentation of it. New York spices its shows with crude pervert jokes, kissing lessons, or Dagmar's chest—all about as subtle as a slap in the face with a herring.

If you want to see this delicate subject handled with taste and skill, watch Garroway's program Sunday nights. The New York way is to lower the V; in Chicago they design a dress which covers their females and still is more provocative than the lowest neckline in Radio City.

And if his jaw man-ages to hold out again, we'll ride along with Bratton to defeat Gavilan and retain his title.*
