HAWKINS FALLS

"Hawkins Falls, Pop. 6200" is not only the first television novel to originate from Chicago—it's WNBQ's big chance to parade some of the finest talent in show business across the nation's screens. All this—and soap opera, too.

More than 30 seasoned troupers, most of whom earned their spurs in network radio, are seen on the channel 5 serial, which is beamed Monday thru Friday at 4 p.m. The wealth of talent includes veterans of summer stock and road shows as well.

For example, Phil Lord has trod the boards of English and American stages for 40 years. He was already a show business vet in 1931 when he started radio work in New York, and now he's doing a finished job in the role of Judge Willard Sharp.

Butler Manville, who is seen as Jonathan Kratz, is another veteran who's played everything in the theatre except grand opera. His radio career began in Chicago in 1930.


Frank Dane, who plays the bedridden Knap Dreher, has chalked up 38 years

in show business. He started with a road show while still in his teens. Frank first appeared before a TV camera back in 1928, but it was just an experimental telecast.

Norman Gottschalk, who takes the role of Phinney Zites, was a barker in the Streets of Paris show of the 1933 World's Fair. That year, he auditioned for his first radio part. Other veterans of radio are George Cisar and Les Spears.

The women of "Hawkins Falls" also have extensive backgrounds in dramatics. Bernardine Flynn, who plays Lona Dreher, left the University of Wisconsin in 1929 for a role on Broadway. One year later, Bernardine launched her Chicago radio career.

Viola Berwick, in the role of Vi Carlson, is a graduate of Northwestern University. Viola got started in radio in 1934, and has since played a variety of roles. Hope Summers, who plays Belinda Catherwood, graduated from a theatrical school, taught dramatics at an eastern college, joined a stock company, and wound up in Chicago radio.

Elmira Roessler, who's Elmira Cleebe, got her start in St. Louis at the age of 14, when she starred on a radio show there. Later, Elmira attended college and appeared in stock, finally returning to radio here in 1939.

Jean Mowry, cast in the role of Jeanie Sandborn, graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1945 and quickly latched onto a number of TV dramatic jobs.

The youngest cast member is eight year old Bruce Dane, who plays the homeless Roy Bettert. Bruce's dad is actor Frank Dane, but prior to joining "Hawkins Falls," Bruce had no professional training.

The real star of "Hawkins Falls" is never seen by the TV audience. He's writer Doug Johnson, and it's his fertile brain that serves up the best slice of authentic Americana this side of the late Sinclair Lewis. "Hawkins Falls, Pop. 6200" is a great show not only because it's entertaining, but more important—it's believable.



Advertisers Hang On to Summer Time

by JACK MABLEY

The lineup of television shows over the summer will be almost as good as during the winter—and in some cases better.

An example of the better is the Cameo Theater, which will be the summer replacement for some show, not yet decided. You may remember Cameo Theater from its run last summer. It is the dramatic show which uses only blacks and whites and shadows for backdrop. There is no scenery, but the production is far more effective than most dramatic shows which spend more for scenery than is spent for the whole Cameo program.

There seem to be a number of public service shows on tap. These will be filmed and live, on health, Boy Scouts, and American industry and resources.

These won't be as dull as the subject matter might lead you to believe. I think television is learning how to sell its educational and informational programs merely by injecting some old fashioned showmanship into them.

Some proposed NBC shows include the Lewisohn Stadium concerts from New York; a mess of quiz shows, which I definitely regard as a step backward; and some interview sessions, which are as good or bad as the people on them.

Most of the advertisers who have winter programs on the best network time—7 to 10 o'clock any evening, and a few other good spots, such as Sunday afternoon—are hanging on to the time. Some will keep their regular shows going through the summer, and others will have summer replacements.

The important thing to the advertisers is to hold on to the time period. If you have a good time, no matter how rotten a show you put in it, you're bound to have a pretty good audience.

The greatest example of a bad show in a wonderful time is the Fireside Theater, following Berle Tuesday nights at 8. After months of trying to figure why it has such a good rating, I can conclude only that it is because it follows Berle. The movies on the program are about Grade F, even by Hollywood standards.

Shows which will stay on all summer include the Sunday night Comedy Hour,

Ford Festival, Amateur Hour, Kraft Theater, Ed Sullivan, Cavalcade of Bands and Cavalcade of Stars, Paul Whiteman Teen Club, and Super Circus.

Kukla, Fran and Ollie will take an eight weeks vacation. Sid Caesar, Berle, Jerry Lester, Jack Carter, and the Wednesday night Four Star theater will vacation.

The networks make a lot of noise about their audiences holding up during the summer. This seems to ignore the few million people around Chicago who are out in the ballparks, golf courses, gardens, beaches, and U. S. 12, 20, and 41 all through the good weather. I think that on a warm summer Sunday evening there are more people in cars on Milwaukee av. north of Devon than there are in front of television sets.

Maybe TV will change all that. It hasn't yet.



1 small can sliced mushrooms
1 small can tomato puree
salt and pepper

Slice into patties one pound of veal. Lightly brown in hot fat. Add one onion and one green pepper and simmer on low flame until green pepper is soft. If fat dries up add a small amount of water. Add sliced mushrooms and tomato puree. Cook on a low flame 20-25 minutes, adding water if sauce thickens.

Dr. FIX-UM'S

Lurking in almost every U.S. bosom is a nostalgic desire to build the perfect birdhouse, or at least, that better mousetrap. City dwellers rarely find time or opportunity to satisfy this primitive urge. As a consequence, they adopt visual substitutes — dawdling near excavation projects, kibitzing on street repair gangs, breathing down the plumber's neck.

It's no surprise to psychologists, therefore, when a major phenomenon

occurs in Chicagoland TV homes one night each week. Mom puts down her crossword puzzle and collects pencils and paper. Pop takes the number 1 seat near the set, and tunes in Channel 7. For 30 minutes thereafter, Art Youngquist, WENR-TV's Dr. Fixum, gets the spotlight.

Art is probably best known to viewers as the "Clothes Hanger Man." He won this title hands down by inventing more than 100 practical devices from an ordinary wire hanger.

Art's fans claim that he explodes home craft ideas like popcorn on a griddle. On any one show, Youngquist may repair a dripping faucet, fix a sagging screen, make a clever toy out of a cardboard box, or fashion an ingenious plant holder.

Phone calls suggest many of his TV ideas. One woman wanted to know how to remove glass ring stains from her

end tables. Art answered her right on the show—"moisten some cigaret ashes with water and rub it off."

Once a woman motorist called in an emergency. Her car was stuck in a snow drift. Art couldn't prescribe a remedy in a hurry, but the following show, he showed how to rig up a handy, portable lath gadget to be carried in the trunk.

Some other Youngquist stunts—building scale models of homes to demonstrate repairs, constructing boats and furniture, plastering and refinishing. Best part of the show is that Art doesn't just talk about the jobs, he actually does the work using "live" equipment.

How did Dr. Fixum get started? He was born in Chicago May 26, 1910, one of five children. His father helped his tinkering hobby by installing a home workshop. Before Art was 18, he had built his first motor boat, an ice boat and two gliders. He graduated from Lane Tech high, and attended night school at Armour Tech (now Illinois Institute of Technology).

After free lance writing for trade magazines, Art obtained an editorial position with *Science and Mechanics* publication. One day, WENR-TV producer Ed Skotch asked that magazine to suggest a handy-man personality for the Dr. Fixum show. Art landed the job and has been there ever since. He still doubles as an S&M editor.



hospital presented TV sets

Patients of Chicago Fresh Air hospital, Howard and Western Aves. were presented recently with three TV receivers by a television executive.

The donor, Topper Pritikin, head of Central Television Exchange, completely surprised patients of the 40 year old tuberculosis hospital when he dropped in unannounced with the sets and a crew of installation men.

Dr. Hugo Deuss, medical director of the hospital, first learned of the gift when he was asked to appear on WENR-TV to talk about the hospital on the Bob and Kay show, featuring Kay Westfall and Bob Murphy.

Topper, informed by friends about the need of the hospital for additional recreational facilities told Kay Westfall he'd like to give some TV sets for the use of the patients. Kay and Bob urged him to appear on their midday show and present the sets to Dr. Deuss in person.

In expressing his thanks in behalf of the patients, Dr. Deuss spoke of the important part television now plays in the treatment of long term diseases such as tuberculosis. He said that the so-called wonder drugs were ably augmented by the occupational therapeutic value afforded by television.

Topper disclaimed any credit for generosity and said that he felt the TV industry had a definite obligation to help share the pleasures and benefits of television with those unfortunate enough to be shut off from so many normal pleasures.

"Besides," Topper added, "One of my former bosses, General MacArthur, has become a TV headliner and I'd like to help him get as wide an audience as possible." Topper served during the last war with the Armed Services Radio in the Pacific.

The Chicago Fresh Air hospital, a non-profit institution founded in 1909 still remains one of the Chicago's lesser known hospitals. It is not tax supported as are the municipal hospitals, but is dependent on the payments of its patients and the generosity of its friends. The cost to patients and out patients is scaled to an absolute minimum because a large majority of the patients spend many months in treatment and convalescence.

The Chicago Fresh Air hospital has never in its history had an all out campaign to raise funds, but now it is in serious need of additional help to maintain the present equipment and purchase additional equipment needed to carry on its work.

Patients of the hospital were presented with three video receivers recently. It is believed much therapy value is attached to television entertainment. Scene below was taken at the hospital.

SEVENTEEN years ago, in Chicago, I started traveling around the banked track of the Roller Derby. Since then I have been around the world four times and the darn Roller Derby still fascinates me. I still get a thrill by watching the game or actually participating.

As a skater, my days are now numbered and as skater-coach of the Chiefs, it is only fair and sensible to step aside for youth. Some of my experiences have been interesting, harrowing, and exciting. For that reason, I wouldn't trade my career as a derby skater for anything. I have traveled, met people and have made a career of seeing the world.

I'll never forget back in 1935 when my late Dad kidded "Ma" that I could never make the Derby at the Chicago Coliseum. . . . We tried out for ten days, and believe it or not, they picked "Ma." She joined the Derby and took me along for the whirl around the country.

It wasn't as much fun in those days before the derby blossomed into its present stage. There were only two couples who scooted around the track all day and night. It was gruelling but "Ma" and I stuck it out.

After our first year of competition, "Pa" came to fetch us and brought us back home to Chicago. Our life immediately became a monotonous existence and when the derby visited Chicago again at a later date—"Ma" and I joined for the second time. This time for good. The years passed quickly and the game began to evolve into its present state.

I could tell the grind was beginning to tell on "Ma" and after much deliberation she decided she too must make way for youth. Today, as I look back on the part "Ma" and I had in contributing as pioneers in this growing sport, it fills me with pride and gratitude. Even when I hang up my skates for good, it will still be my life. And as they say in the vernacular of the sport—We'll be rollin' and rockin'.

Now with another season under our belts, I guess we deserve a little vacation. Don't be too surprised if you see most vacationing skaters hanging around roller rinks. Once this sport gets in your blood, you're sunk. It's a grand game and it gave me a grand time.
