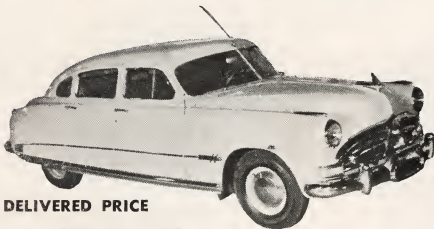

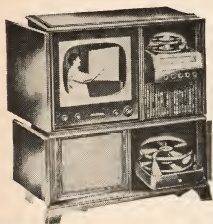

NEW YORK—Despite the flurry of stories about network shows coming and going this summer, here's what you can safely believe: Next season will see almost every major entertainment star knee deep in TV. Unless the FCC lifts the freeze on new stations shortly, most LOCAL sponsors—car dealers, department stores, beer distributors—will be forced off the air or else move to the early morning hours. Come autumn, TV will be bigger 'n better than ever, your darling. . . . NBC is finally moving its big guns up against CBS competition. For example, Kate Smith will compete directly against Arthur Godfrey and his Friends on Wednesday nights. In retaliation, CBS will launch a star-studded array of comics against Milton Berle. . . . The lifted pinky set is eagerly awaiting Patricia Bowman's debut Aug. 11 for DuMont. She's a ballerina.

That Faye Emerson chatter session on ABC will get the bounce at the end of June. But flamboyant Faye starts her own stanza on CBS June 16. It's rumored that the Robert Q. Lewis show may also switch to late Saturday which will give CBS a one-two punch. . . . Meantime, portly Sam Levenson may get switched to Tuesday p.m. Everything clear? . . . Despite beefs from the U.S. Smiles Ass'n, Ed Sullivan's show will remain on during the summer. . . . Jack Haley isn't through with video, no matter what you hear. After Ford yanked him in favor of James Melton, Haley was understandably miffed. But his TV experience gained him so many new fans that Jack is ready for another crack. . . . Smilin' Ed McConnell will shift from NBC to CBS Aug. 11. In addition, the show will be seen Saturday morning instead of evening.

Are you kidding dep't? Frank Sinatra and Dagmar will cut a record called "Mama Will Bark." . . . The Amazing Mr. Malone will be seen on ABC every Monday night starting Aug. 27. . . . The cute Fontane Sisters who sing with Perry Como are actually related. Their mother led the church choir in Milford, New Jersey. . . . CBS is in real trouble unless they buy more TV stations. Already such shows as Bigelow Theatre and Star of the Family have served cancellation notice because the network can't clear enough time with affiliated stations to give the sponsors a sufficient audience. . . . Freddy Martin and his band will fill in for the Martin Kane show this summer. . . . In place of "Big Story" this summer will be a new thriller titled "Door With No Name." . . . It's hard to believe but Ethel Waters, who stars as Beulah, used to weigh 89 lbs. when she plugged songs. They called her Sweet Mama String Bean.

Vaughn Monroe may switch to a variety type show next season. His sponsor isn't happy with the straight musical format. . . . Mr. I. Magination goes from Sunday to Saturday after the June 17 show in an effort to pick up more kid viewers. . . . Mothers—tie down the small fry, a Superman film series is being prepped. . . . Gaining attention is the ABC Hollywood series with Hal Sawyer. He uses "behind the scenes" techniques—the result is a living gossip column. . . . Florian ZaBach, the CBS violinist with a bobby sox following, is also a competent magician. He studied under Thurston.

CRIMINALS FEAR TELEVISION

By U. S. Senator Estes Kefauver

I was surprised by the impact of television on the work of the Senate Crime Investigating Committee.

In the first place, it did not occur to me that the television industry would give our hearings the coverage that it did. Before we reached New York, individual outlets had televised our proceedings in New Orleans, St. Louis, San Francisco and Detroit. But, these presentations were for localized area consumption, and we could not envision the response on a national basis.

To be very frank, we had misgivings that the American public generally would become sufficiently aware of our undertaking to gain a nation-wide picture of the implications of organized crime syndicates.

As we moved from place to place, it seemed to us that the only ones aroused were local people. Then, when we would leave a locality, it seemed that an en-



tirely new, similar situation would develop.

It was about this time that I agreed to write a series of magazine articles, to appear after the report was in, to draw the attention of the American public to Big Crime and its corrupting influence on governmental officials.

Very few of our citizens ever see—let alone read—a stuffy public document; and, I thought that a presentation of our findings in more readable form would arouse the people to the evils of the situation. An unanticipated extension of our committee, at the insistence of my colleagues, caused this series of articles to appear in advance of the release of our official report.

But, it later developed, this result could have been achieved without the magazine articles. Television brought our work into the living rooms of some 80,000,000 Americans. It also provided

us with an opportunity to point out that our investigation had been in process for nearly a year. Many of those who communicated with us knew nothing of our inquiry except for the final three weeks of hearings in New York and Washington.

In addition, we were able to direct the attention of the television audience to another important fact, i.e., that the primary responsibility for law enforcement rests on Main Street—not on Pennsylvania Avenue in Washington.

There are some who contend that televising congressional hearings is unfair to witnesses. This is a decision for the courts to make, of course. At the same time, my own opinion is that the educational advantages and public information involved make the televising of congressional inquiries very desirable. Of course, the lights should not be obtrusive, and the heat should not be permitted to be obnoxious. But, where the physical factors are proper, I don't see that presenting telecasts are unfair to witnesses.

As a matter of fact, if I were a witness, I should prefer that my testimony be televised. The newspaper accounts of my appearance are limited by space, the impression I make upon the reporter, and the reactions of an editor. If my testimony is being carried on radio, I must depend upon my voice to give those who are listening an impression of me. However, television is broader.

Television is the medium that will present my entire appearance, my voice, my reactions, the treatment accorded me, my demeanor in the witness chair, and so on, to the public. As the little girl said, "I ain't much, but I've got all I got." I can't expect to be accepted for what I am not; but, I have a right to be accepted for what I am as a witness.

Our probe was assisted in this facsimile manner. A great number of American citizens could see, as well as hear, the type of individuals with which we were dealing. The newspapers did a

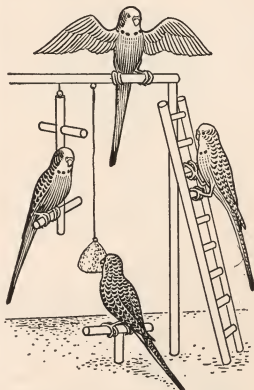

Mabley's Semi-Annual "Best on TV" List

By JACK MABLEY

Back in the dim days of the TV pioneers I used to get more foolish than usual and print my idea of the 10 best programs on the air. There were only about 20 shows in Chicago then, so it wasn't too risky a proposition.

Now it is impossible to select a valid list of 10 best, because there are far too many good shows on television, which appeal to the thousands of different tastes of the viewers. You could name any of five major dramatic shows as best, and not be wrong. Kraft is best for people who prefer lighter shows. Studio One is best for those who want more intense dramatics. Philco, Pulitzer Prize Playhouse, Somerset Maugham theater, or Ford all hit a good variety of dramas.

But once or twice a year it's fun to suppose that you could watch only 10 shows a week (a reasonable supposition, too). If you were confined to only 10 programs, what would they be? Here's my current list:

Kukla, Fran and Ollie. Right at the top of the list, where it's been for three years, because the whole family understands and loves it. You might think that Burr and Fran would be running out of ideas after three and a half years of doing shows for half an hour every night. But they don't. The show is better than ever, and their ratings are the highest ever.

Garroway At Large. This list smacks of provincialism so far, but that's merely coincidence. A TV critic has to watch a new program the first two or three times it's on the air. That's duty. When he watches regularly from that point on, it's pleasure. I never miss a Garroway show because you're almost certain to see something brand new in television every show. We're sorry it won't be on the air in its usual time and place next fall, but we know the people who make the program great will continue to show the way in TV, wherever and whatever they are working on.

Clifton Utley news. You must have news, and this man keeps you well informed. He shows no newsreels, but I figure that it's more important to understand what is going on in the world

than to see a run of films every night.

Studio One. Usually the best written and best acted of the dramatic shows.

Philco Theater. Always well produced, and with consistently good stories. The time of these two dramatic shows is a factor in putting them on the list. I happen to watch TV more Sunday and Monday nights, when they are on, than other nights.

Zoo Parade. Here's how to learn something without it hurting. Another show which the whole family can enjoy.

Bob and Kay. You need a daytime show in here, and Bob and Kay have one which gives information, entertainment, and can cheer you up. A lot of customers watch the show just to look at Miss Westfall.

Martin and Lewis and Jimmy Durante. The best comedians in the business, even if Martin and Lewis didn't show up for a TV marathon. We take Durante for heart, and Martin and Lewis for masterful slapstick.

Groucho Marx. Groucho is the only man in the world who could make a quiz show worthwhile.

good job of describing the fidgeting of Costello's hands; but, because of television 30,000,000 American people were able to make up their own minds about Costello's reactions.

This new medium of public information is presenting new problems and emphasizing old ones. For a long time, I have felt that Congress needed a code for the conduct of investigative hearings. The advent of television re-emphasizes this need.

The large problem for the industry is probably one of sponsorship. It would hardly do for a committee to be hearing Joe Doaks, and have the announcer break in with a commercial for "Joe Doaks Beer," or the like.

The ideal thing would be for these presentations to be straight public service programs. At the same time, television is in its expensive infancy, and this may not be possible. The second best choice would be strict institutional-advertising programs. In speaking this month to the National Association of Broadcasters, I urged the industry to give careful attention to this problem.

At least one television station profited by the presentation of hearings of our committee. The "spot-announcements" coming during station breaks more than paid for the commercial time cancelled.

Another rule should be laid down by all means. No hearings should be televised unless the entire proceedings will be carried. It would be unfair to have someone's name brought into the proceedings in front of the cameras, only to have the program off-the-air when this person later vindicated his good name.

The good sense Congress and the television industry uses at this point will largely determine whether this medium will be a great boon to the people of America, or a bust for all concerned.

America, Congress and television can profit thereby, or all three can be harmed. It's a big question, and demands a well considered solution.

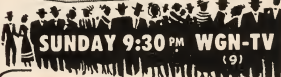

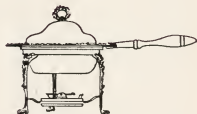

EDITH BARSTOW

choreographer at large



Having been with "Garroway-at-Large" almost since its inception three years ago—I've missed three shows—I feel that I was very lucky to have been asked to do the show originally for it gives me a chance to work with a wonderful group of people and a wonderful guy—Dave Garroway.

"Garroway-at-Large" has given me the opportunity of building from the bottom with a new medium. Although this has been hard work, I get a thrill out of being part of a show that tries to accomplish originality and viewing pleasure out of a small budget. I don't think this would have been possible in any other place but Chicago.

As I look back to the very first days that I ever heard of television, I wonder how many people realize how long ago it started and yet how slowly it developed until the last two or three years. I really don't know at what date the first television programs were telecast or from where, but MY first participation in television took place in London, England in 1928.

I was dancing at the London Palladium with my brother Dick. It was our first trip to Europe and there were only three or four American acts there then—Sophie Tucker was one of them. We



went over with a four week contract, but after opening, we were offered bookings that kept us in Europe for two and a half years. We danced in musical comedy, the leading hotels and clubs, and vaudeville; and we were asked to do some movie shorts and then this funny thing called television.

We did several TV shows in 1928 in London but there is no possible comparison with them and the shows as we do them today. First: The make-up was all done in deep purple and white with extension of the eyes in white grease paint, then outlined in purple. Lips were almost black and even the costumes were accented in sharp oblique lines. Secondly: We had to dance or move much slower and would have to hold one pose before going on to the next one. Thirdly: I only remember one camera being used, and that the space in which to work was very small.

Today we use three or more cameras and the space is still very small (at least on our show) but so much more is done with wonderful scenery and the painting of perspective to give greater depth, especially on background drops. In staging with this type of scenery, you must be careful not to get the dancers too near to any part which is painted to appear small or far away, as then the audience can compare sizes and lose the illusion.

I have been asked what are our greatest problems in getting the Garroway show on the air. Speaking for myself, in helping to plan the shows and doing the staging and choreography, I would say the biggest three problems are budget, space and time. The years I spent dancing with my brother Dick all over the United States and in practically every country in Europe, are now paying off in this respect. Because I have a lot of experience at hand to draw from and a background in so many various kinds of dancing, I can work quickly.

I do not have the time on television to do research or to use first rehearsals for tryout ideas and steps, as I did while assistant to Merriel Abbott on shows in the Empire room of the Palmer House. At rehearsals in television, I have to know exactly what I want done, then barely have enough time to show the performers how to do

it before we are on camera and the show goes on, once and for all.

After my first fling in television in Europe, I did not encounter it again until January, 1949 in Chicago when the coaxial cable to New York was completed. It was the Swift show with Lanny Ross and Martha Wright, and I was called in to do the staging for Chicago models used in the show.

I had been watching all the TV shows I could previous to this, and was convinced it was the coming business for someone in my line. Only about two months later I started with NBC. As well as "Garroway-at-Large," I worked on the original Wayne King show for the first 29 weeks last year, and at the same time was doing the shows in the Empire room for Merriel Abbott.

My brother Dick, who is also in the production end of show business now, has been doing his shows out of New York, working on the television shows of Fred Allen, Eddie Cantor, Danny Thomas and Ed Wynn.

Edith Barstow, a dancing star with her brother of national and international fame, is the staging director and choreographer for "Garroway-at-Large" seen at 9 p.m. Sunday on WNBQ. The show is sponsored by Congoleum-Nairn.



“MUSTS” for Brides

Brides-to-be hear the job of preparing meals described in a variety of ways. To some, it is exciting and challenging, to others it's just three meals a day! But everyone agrees on one point—it has to be done. It is a most important part of homemaking and, believe me, it can be a real joy. If you have the right tools, the task goes easily and smoothly. Then, when your brand new husband smacks his lips over the results, you'll begin to think, “Why I like to cook!”

Now let's assume that you are moving into a kitchen that is already equipped with a range, refrigerator, and sink, together with convenient work space, with cabinets for storing dishes, supplies, and small equipment. I hope your shower and wedding gifts included some—or all—of such electrical appliances as a toaster, waffle baker, sandwich grill, food mixer, coffee maker, and electric roaster, because every one is wonderful to have. But you'll still need tools and utensils for food preparation, for cooking and baking, and for dishwashing. It's smart to have all the really necessary items to begin with, then to add others as your budget and storage space permits.

As a start for you, I have made a list of essentials. Naturally it can be altered to suit your mode of living and your habits of work. The starred items are, to my way of working, absolutely necessary. As time goes on, you will want to add more, but this basic equipment will get you off to a good start.

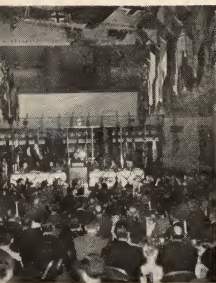

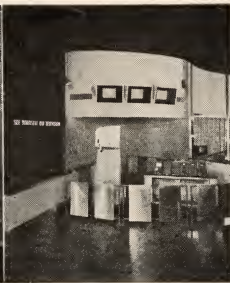
Remote operations that telecast a baseball game are shown (right), including a tiny remote truck.

THE most complete television story in the midwest—RCA Victor's fine display at the Museum of Science and Industry—has completed its first year with an estimated total attendance of 1,500,000 fans. The big free exhibit provides a fascination for TV-minded folks who like to know what's behind their set screen.

The RCA Victor display is an entire video series in itself—from early theory to electronic reality. Visitors are briefed on the evolution of scanning, which is basic to all television, from crude beginnings to Dr. Vladimir Zworykin's use of an electron stream. Beyond this great advance, TV fans are treated to such mysteries as phosphors, the Image Orthicon camera, kinescope tube, receiver circuit, Dynamic Demonstrator and projection illusion.

TV laymen, however, needn't flinch at the phraseology. Thanks to visual displays, the video exhibit becomes crystal clear even to children. Besides which, a few laughs are mixed in for everyone's benefit when Mr. and Mrs. John Q. Public parade before a TV camera on closed circuit.

Located in the exhibit is a theatre room. Here visitors can watch other folks as they enter the exhibit. Some of the results are wonderful to behold, since those in front of the camera can watch themselves on TV but don't realize that they are also seen in the theatre room.

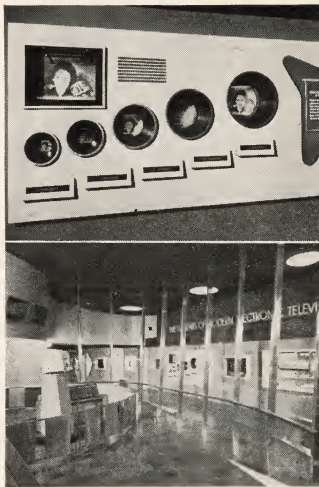
One small lad went through the motions of pitching an entire baseball game. Teen agers break into song and dance. Older folks preen and strut. It's an all-American sideshow.

There's an interesting story behind the TV exhibit, according to Norb Hildebrand of the museum staff. When it was decided to feature a video display, bids were invited from major TV companies. RCA Victor offered to install the complete TV story, and on this basis its bid was accepted.

After fighting TV so ruthlessly all winter long, the National Collegiate Athletic Assn., has humbly pacified its wrath and is reportedly willing to permit gridiron TV for \$1,000,000. It appears as though their fatherly concern about smaller colleges has fallen by the wayside.

The NCAA has long contended that the primary reason it so staunchly opposed TV is because of its adverse effect on smaller colleges. After all, colleges such as Lake Forest and Beloit are also NCAA members and must be protected—they said.

Now, under the reported \$1,000,000 sponsorship plan, it's understood the NCAA would keep 60% of the take while the remaining 40% is to be divided among the colleges participating in the weekly pickups. *What does that leave for the smaller colleges they were so concerned over?* Then there's the theatre-TV deal that the NCAA pockets.
