

ONE day, back in 1942, a five year old boy was listening to a radio quiz program and thought it might be fun to be a Quiz Kid. And so he sat down and printed this letter:

"I am five and a half years old.

I can do 99 times 98 or any number up to 100 in my head . . . I can add faster than my mother and the man at the store. I like to fall asleep counting 6 plus 6 equals 12—12 plus 12 equals 24—24 plus 24 equals 48 until I get up into the thousands and then I am asleep.

But I am not as good at numbers as Richard Williams.

I know a little geography too . . . like hemispheres, and the names of the continents and oceans.

I would like to be a Quiz Kid.

Love,
Joel

PS My grandfather has teeth that he takes out at night, but he is smart."

Joel, as anyone knows who watches the famed Friday night show on WNBQ, is Joel Kupperman, math wizard who holds the record for appearing more times on the program than any other child. The Richard Williams he mentioned in his first letter to the Lou Cowan agency was his idol, and one of the most brilliant Quiz Kids to star in the Alka Seltzer show.

For his 367 radio and now television appearances, Joel has amassed \$36,700 in bonds, and it is all in the hands of the Probate court to be used only for education if spent before the young man is 21.

Now 15 years old, and in his final year as a Quiz Kid, Joel Kupperman continues to fascinate the millions who watch him calculate in lightning fashion. In the early days he refused to tell anyone how he worked problems so quickly, saying they were "seequit twicks." Now he reveals his secrets.

For instance, when he multiplies two numbers, he works toward the nearest zero. In multiplying 24 by 98 he multiplies 24 by 100, getting 2400; then 24 by 2 (2 is the difference between

98 and 100) which is 48. He subtracts 48 from 2400 and gets 2,352. He can also give immediately the cube root of any perfect cube under a million!

Joel is the son of Sol and Sara Kupperman of Chicago. He has a 16 year old sister, Harriet, who was also a Quiz Kid and who is now planning to enter Northwestern university in the fall. Mr. Kupperman, too, is a great mathematician. He is an engineer who works for the city, Mrs. Kupperman is a former Chicago public grade school teacher.

The first few years of Joel's life, the Kuppermans were a bit worried about their son's backwardness. Joel was slow in developing. He didn't walk or talk until he was 18 months old. Harriet had started talking at eight months.

Mrs. Kupperman started reading to Joel when he was three. When she had finished each story, Joel would repeat the story back to her, almost word for word. After he knew the story by heart, he would sit in bed by the hour, with the book propped in front of him, pretending to read. Actually, he was telling the story from memory while looking at the book's pages.

Joel learned to read upside down. Sister Harriet always sat across the table from him when she was starting to read. Her book rested on the table, so that Joel saw words upside down. That way, he picked up words and letters—only in a rather reversed manner! When Momma discovered what was happening, she had quite a time teaching him the correct method.

Joel is a very religious person. As a baby he liked to sit by himself and talk to God. He used to read Bible stories, and now owns and reads his own Bible.

He wants to be a lawyer and be as much like Abraham Lincoln as possible. He would like to study law at Northwestern University in Chicago.



Hot summer weather being what it is, there is nothing more important to your health than the quality and quantity of food you consume. By observing rules of diet strictly, you can be assured of a healthful and happy vacation time.

There are certain general rules for dieting. You should meet the daily nutritional requirements set up by the National Research Council. This expert board recommends a diet of approximately 1600 calories each day, broken down in the following manner:

Milk	1 pint
Egg	1
Meat, fish, poultry or cottage cheese	4 oz. raw or 3 oz. cooked
Whole wheat or enriched white bread	3 slices
Whole wheat or enriched cereal	1/2 cup
Potato	1 small
Green or yellow vegetable	1 serving
Other vegetable (1 raw)	2 servings
Citrus fruit	1 serving
Other fruit (fresh or water packed)	2 servings
Butter or fortified margarine	3 teaspoons

Certain diet rules apply to both men and women, even though each sex has its own physical differences. The following information will apply equally well to both a hard-working housewife or career girl, and a busy Loop executive or suburban office worker:

Coffee & Tea—Use as desired without cream and sugar. Milk can be added for taste.

Salad Dressing—Lemon juice and vinegar may be used. Mineral oil dressings, however, are discouraged because they break up the fat-soluble vitamins.

Breads & Cereals—All breads and cereals should be whole wheat, rye or enriched white.

Potato—May be boiled or baked with butter and milk added.

Meat, Fish & Poultry—May be roasted, broiled or boiled, but not fried. Excess fat should be trimmed.

Fruits—Either fresh or water-packed (minus sugar).

Egg—May be boiled, poached or scrambled with milk and butter added. Two eggs may be substituted for a meat serving.





Summer unfortunately is such a short season that all of us are tempted to overdo in the exercise department, especially on those wonderful weekends. Here are a few tips that should help you to report for work on Monday mornings, still a member of the human race:

1. Start each exercise with a warmup session, slow and easy moving.
2. Wear loose fitting clothing for maximum circulation.
3. Don't gulp cold water in great quantity. Better to wait and sip.



Let's Take a Peek at TV in 1966 . . .

by JACK MABLEY

I'm going to take a fling this week at Oliver Dragon's favorite form of literature—science fiction.

Let's take a look at television, not in the 21st century, but a mere 15 years from now. We're going to try to visualize life with television on the basis of what we know now, and the speed with which the industry has developed in the past decade. It won't make much sense, but that shouldn't bother us. Television always has been unbelievable anyway. Even Jules Verne didn't foresee anything as fantastic as 10,000,000 people sitting in their living rooms and watching something taking place a thousand miles away.

Of course 15 years from now all television will be in color, which automatically will make it about 10 times as effective and appealing. There will be 2,000 stations in the country. Chicago will have 10 stations.

Some stations will be on the present very high frequency, and most will be on the new ultra high frequencies. But all commercial sets will be able to get either frequency, so we won't even be conscious of the difference.

All rural areas will have TV. There will be stations in cities of 40,000 and even 25,000 or 20,000. Country areas out of range of these cities will be served by feeder stations, which will fan out from the cities.

There will be sets in practically every home that now has a radio. Most families will have a couple of sets, and the youngsters probably will have a portable to take down to the beach. Homes will have sets built into the walls, in living rooms, bedrooms, basements. Mom may have a small set built in with her kitchen cabinets, and a few showoffs will put sets in the bathroom.

Some cars will have TV screens in the back seats, and they will be standard equipment in buses, trains, and planes.

Screen sizes will range from 10 or 12 inches for the little utility jobs up to any size, limited only by the dimensions of the house. This large picture will not come on a tube, but by projection.

And what will we be seeing on the screens? We'll probably have to pay to see the best entertainment. Theater television will be the highest bidder for some top events, such as major football games or the world series or a performance of "South Pacific," which we presume will still be going strong in 1966.

Fifteen thousand movie theaters throughout the country will be tied to a television hookup. The Notre Dame-Army game of 1966 will be on theater television. Each of the theaters will have an average of two-thirds of its 3,000 seats filled, making a total audience for the game of 56,000 in the stadium at South Bend and 30,000,000 in theaters. The gate will be \$30,000,000 at \$1 a head. Good quarterbacks will retire upon graduation from college and spend the rest of their lives clipping coupons.

Folks at home will have their choice of the educational channels, Phonevision, which will carry all the latest movies, plus sports events and whatever else it can outbid theater-TV for.

And what will be on the commercial television stations? Well, 15 years from now, Milton Berle's contract with NBC will have 16 years to go, and that's not fiction, science or otherwise. That's fact.



Remodeling a Home Fun for the Youles

CONTEMPORARY, traditional and early American pieces mixed with skill and taste blend into a livable, functional home for Jeanne and Clint Youle (The Weatherman, WNBQ) who recently have completed remodeling and redecorating a ten room home in suburban Wheaton.

The home, an imposing three story frame structure built before the turn of the century, stands on a heavily wooded lot in the center of the suburb. When purchased by the Youles, it gave evidence of not having been redecorated in the last 50 years.

"Everything was dark and dingy looking when we first looked at the house," Jeanne told us as we sat in the comfortable living room. "The wood-work was almost black from repeated coats of varnish and the walls presented a dismal picture."

To remove this dark appearance, the Youles first tore out the wall dividing the living room and stairway to the second floor, bringing the stairway into the room and lengthening the living area. They also gained two windows on the stair wall.

"Livability" is Jeanne's one word summation of their decorating ideas. "We considered everything from the standpoint of comfort. We also mixed furniture periods because we happen to like modern living rooms and old-fashioned dining rooms, some modern bedrooms, others in early American pieces."

In the living room and adjoining sitting room, the walls are painted a deep green, with white woodwork, and gray wall-to-wall carpeting. A handsome crab orchard stone fireplace dominates the wall dividing the two rooms.

A striking wallpaper mural on the back wall of the sitting room creates a feeling of added depth in the room; the other three walls are painted green. A large sofa is placed beneath the mural and the television set is on the opposite wall.

Two handsome fur rugs, purchased in South America by the Youles, are used in these two rooms. Made of Llama, Alpaca and Caracul fur, one rug is placed in front of the fireplace and the other beneath a leather-topped coffee table, also from Peru, in the sitting room.

In the dining room the woodwork was given a natural finish, as was the plate rail. A large antique mahogany cabinet dominates one wall, with a smaller built-in cabinet on the opposite wall to take care of their china. Maple furniture, braided rugs and white ruffled curtains give this room an old-fashioned, country air.

Hotpoint designed Jeanne's modern blue and yellow kitchen, with sink-dishwasher-disposal unit, large refrigerator and electric range. A built-in breakfast bar on the stair wall has a formica top, as do all the base cabinets. The floor is covered with blue rubber tile.

A pink and white playroom for their two daughters, Jessica and Susan, and a full bath complete the first floor.

Jeanne and Clint's room has blue walls with a wallpaper panel behind the bed and blue draw drapes at the window. A wardrobe wall provides ample storage space for clothes. The furniture is of bleached mahogany.

In the children's room, where maple furniture is used, Jeanne selected a quaint Mother Goose paper with white background that has provided many hours of delight for the children. Dark green draw drapes create color contrast.

The guest room has a soft yellow floral paper on the walls, a perfect setting for the early American bed and dresser and such home touches as ruffled curtains at the windows.

Clint's office, which has a wonderful, large roll top desk in it, is painted yellow with white woodwork. The maid's room and a second bath complete the second floor.

As you move from room to room, you feel that here is a house that is lived in and enjoyed not only by those who call it home but by all who share its hospitality. A tribute to the efforts of Jeanne and Clint in furnishing their home.

NCAA TV Ban Will Collapse . . .

AT the time of this writing, the University of Pennsylvania is submerged to its ears in hot water. We predicted several weeks ago that Penn would defy the NCAA moratorium and fight for its rights to televise all home football games.

As a result of Penn's spunky bolt, they were suspended by the NCAA. California, Princeton, Columbia, Cornell and Dartmouth announced they would not play if Penn persisted in its plans to televise their games. In spite of their recent set-backs, Penn intends to fight the issue to the bitter end.

Talking to Mort Berry, Penn's publicitor, over the long distance phone he expressed hope that more schools would follow their example and bolt the NCAA. "They have no authority to enforce such a rule. We are convinced that TV did not hurt attendance and that majority of the schools in the NCAA are against this TV moratorium," said Berry.

Francis Murray, Penn's director of athletics, suggested the dispute be put into the hands of the U.S. Attorney General. If this is done, a long and bitter battle will ensue to determine whether or not the NCAA moratorium constitutes a restraint of trade. It is our contention that the NCAA is in violation of the anti-trust law and the courts will rule in favor of Penn.

About Theatre-TV . . .

With the acquisition of the American Broadcasting Company by United Paramount Theatres and the rapid progress of Phonevision, a tremendous battle of giants is taking shape. Initial shots were fired by the Theatre-TV group by telecasting the Joe Louis-Lee Savold fight. Theatre-televisioners plan to secure exclusive rights to such events as baseball, football, golf and other events of national interest. Phonevision plans to telecast an equally entertaining program.

There may soon come a day when a fan will have his choice to see the World Series in one of three ways:

1. By theatre-TV, in your favorite local theatre for an undetermined price of admission.

2. By Phonevision, through your present TV set on a pay-as-you-see basis.

3. By television, through your present TV set, but sponsored with intermittent commercials.

The final decision rests, of course, with the public. Which do you prefer?



Without a doubt one of the fastest men produced in Europe, Francois also proved his versatility as a grappler with a vast assortment of holds. Miquet is 30 years old, stands 5 feet 11 inches in height and weighs a muscular 215 pounds.
