FRED ALLEN, a human Geiger counter when it comes to spotting a trend, got the pulse years ago. Radio, decided Fred with a certain disgust, had gone "guest star" happy. The old medium was suffering the delusions of a Celebrity Complex. The bigger the name, the chant went, the better the entertainment.

Fred's dim view of the situation was summed up on one of his more memorable programs. With a great flourish he announced the arrival of a special guest star, humorist H. Allen Smith, "brought to you at great expense, flown 3,000 miles direct from Hollywood so that he could be with you tonight."

Accompanied by a blare of bugles and a roll of the traps, Smith carried off his one and only line flawlessly. He announced solemnly, "I have absolutely nothing to say."

Since this memorable pronouncement, the Celebrity Complex has grown to a fetish. Just about every major show on television is bombarded by guest imports and name dropping. Trouble is, the boys keep forgetting the old saw "the play's the thing." Most of the "names" turn up on camera, flash their familiar pans and then proceed to do nothing to merit the fanfare.

Pat O'Brien, known in most civilized corners of the world as the official spokesman for the Irish and Notre Dame, was announced as guest star on a recent "Toast of the Town" stint.

Most people wondered what he'd do. Perhaps a scene from "Knut Rockne, All American." Or an alphabetical recitation of the counties of Ireland. Instead, Pat performed a card game pantomime, funny when Bert Williams originated it, but classically unfunny when done by O'Brien. A name was dropped and the net result was a lead balloon.

It seems that the Celebrity Complex goes even beyond names with no particular talent. In some cases the talent at hand is just plain misused. The Grand Dame of the theater, Ethel Barrymore, recently appeared with Tallulah Bankhead after weeks of advance hoopla. Strapped to some banter that sounded like Marie Wilson prattle, Miss Barrymore seldom gave the camera a glance. Instead she knitted, probably to keep her mind off the show.

It's an unhappy moment when a variety show will strain to get a bigtime Hollywood actor or actress in its "all star" lineup. Fred MacMurray, generally considered a capable movie performer, shattered all illusions that he is a comedian in just 60 minutes as guest on the Bob Hope show. Paulette Goddard and Errol Flynn, on "Toast of the Town" last summer, performed a real miracle. In the scant space of a few minutes they convinced millions of viewers that they can't act. The two glamour bodies of the Glamour City turned a satire on private eyes

into a whopping burlesque on Hollywood shortcomings.

Panel shows can't seem to do without celebrities. Any unemployed luminary of stage, screen or the borscht circuit is snapped up for guest duty on a TV show quicker than a dime-a-dance girl. Here the name-dropping gets a little tedious. The guest panelists often turn out to be witless individuals, especially when the subject strays outside the confines of Times Square.

Even the political scene has gone blind with the kleig lights. The presidential campaigning was a potpourri of confetti, cheering crowds, florid oratory and screen stars lending their talent to the cause. Humphrey Bogart, Faye Emerson, Tex McCrary, Lena Horne, George Murphy all jumped on the wagon to prove the worth of names swaying the voters' opinion. A healthy chunk of rally crowds showed up just to watch their fan book idols, yet the entertainment value of the affairs amounted to a consistent zero.

The apparent topper to the Celebrity Complex in politics took place on television at 2:00 in the morning after the big election had been settled. Maestro Fred Waring, the great discipliner of the singing Pennsylvanians was vainly and hoarsely trying to make heavenly choraliars of a few thousand Ike supporters while waiting for the President-elect to make an appearance. Community singing has seldom been as unin-

spired. Even with the redoubtable Mr. Waring doing the directing.

Ask Joe Sport Fan and he'll agree the name dropping done before a big prize fight is sometimes unbearable. Every thug within three blocks of the local stadium is called upon to flip through the ring ropes in their pin stripe civvies, wave to the crowd and congratulate the fighters of the night. Maybe it's just to plug future brawls. On the other hand maybe it's the promoters' way of proving their tigers are human after all.

The complex of the celebs got its fullest showcasing last season on the Ken Murray opus. The show was simply a gigantic barrage of big names, all of them foreigners to a mike boom. The interminable list of interviews with such headliners as Estes Kefauver, Jersey Joe Walcott, baseball player Bobby Thomson, Colonel Storey (General MacArthur's pilot), et al. proved as exciting as a man on the street program. Prophetically enough, cigar-chewing Ken is no longer on the TV scene.

But the name droppers are becoming a lot more enterprising lately. Appearing with George Jessel one Saturday night was English channel conqueror Florence Chadwick. What a swimmer could do on a television presentation baffled most. But the solution was fairly simple. NBC went out and built a pool right into the stage for Miss Chadwick to flop around in. Shows there's some hope for folks with complexes.

Walter

THE MIRROR GAZER—

UP UNTIL June of 1940, Walter Winchell heard few dissenting voices against his own loud estimate of himself as the world's most formidable newspaperman. Either fear or professional courtesy had prevented other members of the press from treading on WW's journalistic toes. The *New Yorker* Magazine, famed for its irreverence, changed all that.

In a six week series bylined by St. Clair McKelway, WW was subjected to a merciless and devastating profile that shattered once and for all the notion that Winchell was either a responsible or accurate journalist. Wielding his scalpel with skillful irony, McKelway made incision after incision into the Winchell legend. After cataloguing the WW wrongs, McKelway went on to say that Winchell was chiefly responsible for the decline of public confidence in the U. S. press. WW never forgave him.

Winchell, the most vindictive and malicious journalist now operating, has taken every opportunity since then to throw unfavorable light on the *New Yorker* and its writers. He has accused the magazine of sheltering sexual perverts. He has accused them of hiring commie fellow-travelers. Since Winchell's influence is in a different sphere than that of the *New Yorker*, WW resorted to the harshest possible judgment. He barred McKelway and *New Yorker* editor Harold Ross from the favorite WW playground, The Stork Club. This edict was carried out through Winchell's flunky, Stork owner Sherm Billingsley.

In spite of the Winchell penalty, Ross and McKelway got along somehow, though they did miss out on those evenings at the Stork. WW wasn't through however. In typical Winchell

fashion he began castigating both Ross and McKelway in his column, with special emphasis on their private lives. Walter happily reported that McKelway's marriage had lasted longer than anyone had expected but finally had gone on the rocks. And as for Ross? Well, how's this Winchell item? "The New Yorker's editor (tee-hee, hee) was recently (ha, ha, ha) robbed of (haw, haw, haw) \$75,000."

The climax to the feud was an event that Walter had failed to write into the script. On December 3rd of last year, WW's column contained the following nasty item. "Mrs. Harold Ross, wife of the *New Yorker* editor, was forced to go to court to get money to eat . . . Every time the case was to be heard Our Hero ran up to Lahey's Clinic (Boston) and reported ill—so he didn't have to read the N. Y. papers about it. . . . It was Mrs. Ross the literary gag-men meant when they quipped: 'One day she'll be the most popular widow in town.'"

This continual WW harping on Ross' "faked" illness boomeranged on Winchell. Three days later Harold Ross was dead.

When WW made his debut on TV a while back, viewers who had lost track of Walter when they converted from radio to TV were surprised to find that WW had developed a whole new set of enemies. Walter used to be a great foe of fascists and all their evil works. Always fashionable, Walter now is an

arch foe of Communism. Which accounted for the fact that he spent a major part of the first show in an explosive blast against the Fair Dealing *New York Post* and its editor, James Wechsler.

The *Post*, a left wing New York paper, had dared to print a 24 part series on WW that was exceedingly unflattering. Digging far deeper than even McKelway, the *Post* published what must be considered the *Compleat Winchell*. Every phase of the Winchell past was explored. Walter was annihilated.

Unable to answer the *Post's* charges, WW went off on a new tack. Using the popular guilt-by-association method, he has gone to great length trying to tie the editorial policy of the *Post* in with the Communist Party line. Wechsler, who quit the party in 1939, has been accused of being an arch traitor. Every member of the *Post's* staff, snarls Winchell, is a willing tool of the Communist Party.

WW, the master of irrelevancy, had struck back the only way he knew how.

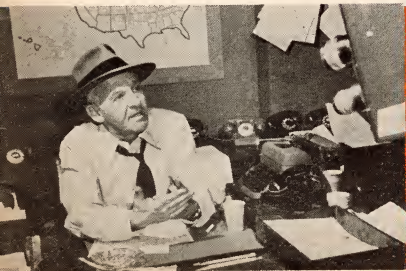
When Walter delivers one of his warnings of "traitors in our midst" in his breathless style, his readers often get a definite sense of insecurity. His column since the *Post* series has been a running smear against the *Post*, or as he calls it, the New York Ivan. Despite the fact that WW is on record as saying he can't be bothered by what small timers have to say about him, he apparently is extremely concerned with what the *Post* had to say.

What did the Post series include that could so enrage a big man like WW?

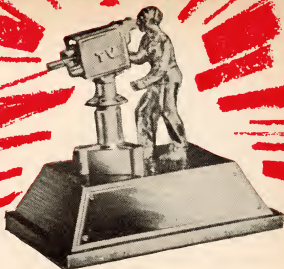

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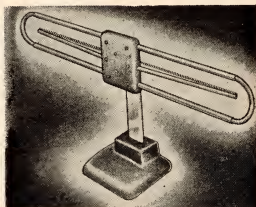

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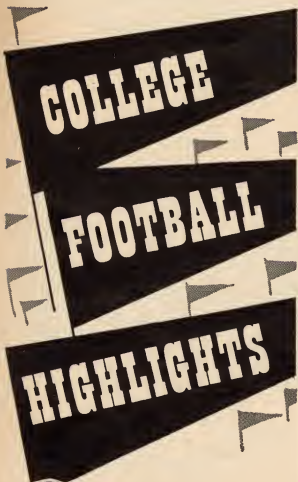

First off they showed that the column was seldom written by Walter anymore. Most of the time it was just a compilation of puffs for celebrities plus rumors passed on by press agents.

Chiefly responsible for what went into the Winchell column were three New York press agents, Irving Hoffman, Curt Weinberg, and Ed Weiner. But the final authority and the power behind the throne was a man named Ernest Cuneo, a liberal whose power with Winchell has waned as Walter has made the painful conversion into an unabashed Republican. Once a week Walter had a column that was a long rhapsodic piece about the joys of big city living. This column was written by a young man named Herman Klurfield, who was reportedly paid \$250 a week to remain anonymous.

The Post gloated over the Friday Winchell column which was allegedly written by his "Girl Friday". This was the only column that Walter wrote himself. What was especially amusing was that this column was one long and enchanted huzzah for Girl Friday's boss WW. Top gossip Winchell apparently had to reassure himself of his pre-eminent position by patting himself on the back.

What the Post found most reprehensible about WW was his acknowledged ability to sway public opinion, despite his lamentable lack of information. As a gossip at a peephole, he was forgivable. But as an authority on national affairs, he was deplorable. Linking him up with both gangland and the FBI, right wingers and left wingers, they found it incredible that such a conspicuously misinformed man should be in such an esteemed position.

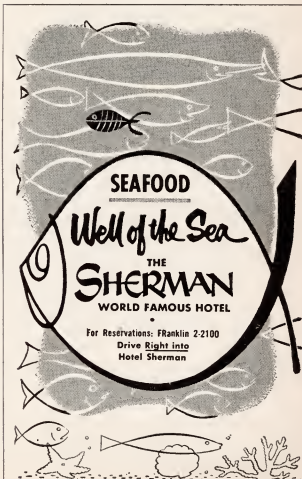
What is interesting about both the *Post* series and the *New Yorker* series is that they avoided what WW never avoids. They didn't dig into his private life. About the most damaging thing said about Walter's home life was a harmless little aside written by McKelway. He said that Walter so loved his two children that he named them both after himself, Walter and Walda. He also told an amusing anecdote about Winchell's dawn patrol.

By special arrangement with the New York City police, WW is allowed to have a police radio and a siren on his car so that he can be on the scene if anything takes place while he's out driving. Roaring through the Manhattan night at 4 a.m. Walter would keep the siren going full blast. But when he approached the St. Moritz, where his family was residing, he'd shut off the siren. Didn't want to wake up his own kids.

One of the recurring themes in Winchell's column and on the air is the imminence of war. He has reported frequently that high Washington authorities have informed him that war will break out any day. This has happened often on his radio broadcast. After listening to Winchell on Sunday night, many people are left wondering whether the world will last out the week. In spite of WW, the world is still going round. But then so is WW.

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The "Ghastly" Prospect

Of The Major Leagues

TV SPORTSCAST

BASEBALL is on the warpath. A nightmare of 18,000,000 TV antennas sprouting all over the country, plus the ghastly prospect of three million more within the next year has unnerved the Major Leagues.

Club owners are mulling over the idea of televising road games, instead of home games, to hypo gate receipts. At first glance, the idea appears sound. But a closer examination reveals a few flaws. For instance, will a sponsor be willing to absorb the additional cable costs to beam a game, say, between the White Sox and Yankees from New York on a closed circuit to be seen only in Chicago? What about the Cubs? Would they tolerate White Sox road game telecasts while they performed at Wrigley Field?

Brooklyn prexy, Walter O'Malley, has already written to all seven National League teams requesting permission to televise Dodger road games. "Up to now," said O'Malley, "no one has given me permission."

Fred Saigh, Cardinal owner, has been campaigning for several seasons to let visiting clubs share in home clubs' TV receipts. Saigh maintains if visiting clubs share in a percentage of gate receipts, why shouldn't they also share in TV receipts? . . . Next we suppose Saigh will be seeking a cut in concession (beer, red hots, etc.) receipts of home clubs.

Frank Lane, the White Sox dynamo, is scheming to remove a ban against the Sox on TV and radio broadcasting in Michigan. Because of previous agreements, the Detroit Tigers have "exclusive" broadcast privileges in the Michigan area. No change, said Lane, is contemplated in their 1953 TV plans, which means the Sox will continue to televise all daytime games over WGN-TV. . . . A real sleeper among Chicago sportscasters, still considered a newcomer but rapidly building an audience, is Jack Drees. His "Sports Highlights," 6:10 p.m. over WENR-TV is well worth watching.

Cuffnotes: Joey Maxim, the synthetic light-heavyweight champion, is slated to defend his title against Archie Moore, Dec. 10, in St. Louis. The bout will be televised over WBKB. Charlie Johnston, Moore's manager, has had a \$2500 forfeit binding his challenge of Maxim since last July.

YOUR GRIPES HAUNT THE STATIONS

I'd like to share a charming piece of poetry mailed in by one Dorothy Pinkerton:

"So you don't like accordions on TV? . . . well, sir, neither do we. But too, too critical don't you get . . . mine's not been on TV yet."

Miss Pinkerton, if your poetic abilities are indicative of your talents on the accordion . . . let's get on to the next piece of correspondence.

Fred E. Graham of Hartford, Michigan got so tired of the long commercials on one Chicago station that he protested to the Federal Communications Commission.

He received a long reply, which said in part: "Although there is no rule which limits the amount of time a station may devote to commercial announcements, the Commission has pointed out the importance of avoiding advertising excesses as a factor in achieving balance in the program schedule."

The letter also said that Mr. Graham's complaint about excessive commercials will be placed on file, and the station will probably be confronted with it when the FCC makes its periodical review of the station's activities. All radio and TV stations have to get their licenses renewed every few years, and valid complaints which show they aren't operating for the public interest and welfare really haunt them.

Our admiration of Jerry Lester provokes Mrs. G. Turner of Chicago. "What few people like him, I look at and see why," says Mrs. Turner. "But you, you have an intelligent face—just what do you rate from him? But each to his own poison, I always say."

So do I. About that intelligent looking kisser, candor compels me to admit it is a photographer's triumph over nature. As for Jerry Lester, it was only two years ago, I think, that Jerry was

named the favorite comedian on television by *TV Forecast* readers. I still like him.

"As long as they have movies every night, can't they have *one* good movie at least every month," asks Barbara Dralle of Monee, Ill.

I think there probably is an average of one good movie every week, out of those dozens they throw at us. Trouble is, usually we've already seen it on TV if it's any good.

Mr. J. Gus Liebenow of Chicago has been at his typewriter again. "George Jessel's first show was enjoyable and pleasantly acceptable," says J. Gus Liebenow. "I don't expect an epic every time I turn a dial. I don't even get epics at \$8.80 per throw."

Well, to quote Mrs. G. Turner, every man to his own poison, I always say.

I was one of Milton Berle's most consistent detractors last season, and have been cheering for him this season. This doesn't stem from any great appreciation for Berle the Man, but rather from an admiration of his willingness to change and experiment.

He junked his old show and put in a completely new format this year. It was bound to be criticized. But he's winning back his audience. The show is good, and people who stopped watching Berle a year or more ago are tuning in again.

One of his experiments was to do shows only three weeks out of every four. The fourth week was occupied by some super-colossal circus production dreamed up by the mammoth thinkers of Radio City.

The payoff on this show is that this month Berle is appearing as "guest star." Berle is making NBC look good for that 30 yr. pact with Uncle Miltie.

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FRED WARING

His Banjazzatra Had a Future

It's a curious fact that though there have been numerous bands that have ridden the crest of popularity, only two have remained perennially tops. Fred Waring is one and Guy Lombardo the other. Of the two, Lombardo has been content to stick to the saccharine, offkey dance music that he played from the start. Waring has done the exact opposite. He's continued to progress, expanding from his first group which consisted of four members called the "Banjazzatra" to his present-day "over half-a-hundred Pennsylvanians."

Born with the 20th century in Tyron, Pennsylvania, Fred first formed an orchestra in 1917. It featured his brother Tom and frog-voiced drummer Poley McClintock, both of whom still belong to the Waring organization. The original band soon expanded into what they called "Waring's Twelve Collegians," a brash, youthful crew that soon caught on. They were hired for several Broadway shows and two motion pictures. Fred had begun experimenting with a glee club and soon hit upon the formula he has retained up to the present.

A harsh perfectionist, Fred has perhaps the best disciplined chorus on earth. Several times he has apologized to audiences when his group didn't achieve the precise effect he wanted. His drive for perfection has paid off. The choral work on his show has added a new dimension to music.

With his great chorus, first rate soloists and orchestra, Fred has built a monument to popular music. Aside from a Johnnie Ray with his synthetic stimuli, Fred achieves the closest thing to an emotional purge available in the pop field. If it isn't art, it isn't because Fred hasn't tried. And it's certainly the best thing that ever happened to popular music.

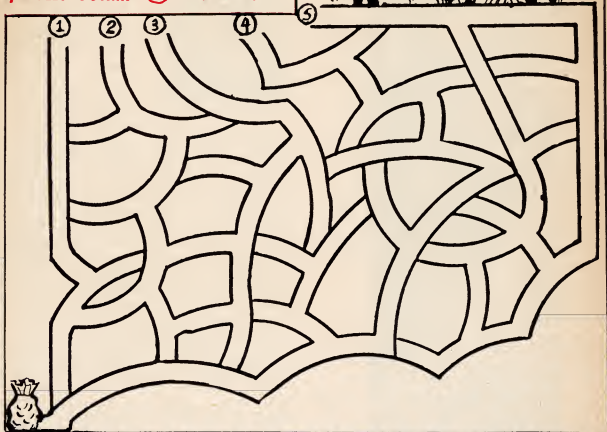

SOME centuries ago a wise and gifted storyteller named Aesop unravelled a fable, the moral of which was that man was incapable of making a silk purse out of a sow's ear. Whether Fred is trying to achieve the unachievable is a question that will have to be answered by musicologists of the future. Mixing the exaltation of a Toscanini huffing through a Beethoven symphony with the slick production of a Rodgers & Hammerstein musical, Fred's TV show is just about the liveliest assault on music imaginable. This is no mean accomplishment when you consider that Fred's own musical talents run to the musical saw and the long-necked banjo.

STRANGE AND TRUE

SILHOUETTES OF THE WEST

One of the wildest towns known to the frontiers of the West in the late seventies was Abilene, Kansas. Many honest citizens lost their lives from stray bullets when unexpected gunfights broke out. Law and order meant nothing to the wild element of this wide open cowtown and Mayor Henry didn't know what to do. Every marshal he hired either quit or got himself killed in a gunfight.

One day a young fellow named Tom Smith came to his office and asked for the job. He explained he was at the time town marshal at Kit Carson, Colorado, but was interested in moving on. Mayor Henry decided the town needed a marshal with a killer reputation and

turned young Tom Smith down. He hired his killer marshals all right, and Abilene went from bad to worse. Each new marshal, regardless of his reputation, lasted less than a week. Then desperately Mayor Henry remembered Tom Smith's offer and sent for him.

The new marshal's first act was to issue a bulletin that no guns were to be carried within the town limits. This naturally was met with all of the opposition a rough cowtown could offer, but Tom backed it up with iron nerve and pile driver fists that convinced them he meant business. He tamed the town but eight months later lost his life helping a sheriff from another town arrest a killer.

If you are ever in Abilene, be sure to look up the grave of this lawman. Over it you will find a monument just as I did, marked with this inscription:

"Here lies marshal Tom Smith . . who died a martyr to duty November 2, 1880

A fearless hero of frontier days who in cowboy chaos established the supremacy of law"
