PERRY COMO

HE KNOWS WHEN



MR. AND MRS. PETER COMO, an Italian immigrant couple living in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, probably attached no special importance to the birth of a son on May 18, 1912. The baby was their seventh son. Mr. Como also was a seventh son. According to a timeless superstition, the seventh son of a seventh son is destined to be both rich and famous. But Mr. Como, a millhand, was too busy trying to keep his family, which eventually included thirteen children, clothed and fed and had no time for superstitions. He named the lad Pierino and let it go at that.

For a while it looked like the lad was going to defy the omens and become an ordinary Canonsburg citizen. At the age of 14, he took up the barbering profession. He became an apprentice in a local shop, sweeping up shavings and doing odd jobs. It didn't look like he'd become either rich (barbers weren't in the upper income brackets then) or famous (name a famous barber besides the one from Seville).

As a young barber, young Pierino was an unqualified success. Holding down the second chair, he was very artistic with the clippers and besides, did a first rate job of singing with his own guitar accompaniment. Whenever things got slow on the job, Perry would tune up and entertain the hangers-on.

But the superstition wouldn't be damned, at least not in Pierino's case.

His voice so pleased his friends that they urged him to audition for the singing job with one of the hot bands of the day, Freddy Carlone and his orchestra. He changed his name to Perry, took the audition in Cleveland, and returned to Canonsburg expecting nothing to happen. But Carlone was hard-up for a vocalist and sent Perry a rush wire asking him to join the band. The year was 1933 and Perry hasn't returned to barbering yet.

It's nineteen years now since Perry abandoned his shears. In that time he has risen to become the nation's undisputed number 1 popular singer. He's won every conceivable popular music award, regularly runs away with first prize in all the fan polls and has sold millions of phonograph records. It seems that young Pierino couldn't overcome his destiny.

It is a tribute to Perry's excellence that he has reached the peak without the benefit of the usual press agent hoopla. In fact, he's a tub thumper's despair. He's still married to the same girl he wed when he worked for Carlone back in 1933. He doesn't sing like a freak and his private life is completely absent from misdeeds that would rate a plug in the gossip columns. The agents are in the position of having to tell Perry's distressingly simple story and let his singing do the rest.

Whenever anyone is asked what they like about Perry's singing, the usual reply, after a brief struggle for words, "Oh, he's so relaxed and natural." There's more to it than that, of course, but not much. As popular voices go, Perry's is one of the best. But the art of popular singing is the ability to create a mood around a song. Perry lets the song do it for him. If the song has any merit at all, its lyrics and melody don't need any wild embellishments. With an

resemblance is no accident. Like the Andrews Sisters, they are actually related.

easy natural baritone, Perry glides casually over the lyrics. If the song has it, Perry will bring it out.

Because of his studied casualness and his way with a song, Perry has even been able to give rides to songs that are often puerile and third rate. No matter how bad a song is, it never sounds terrible when sung by Perry. Witness "Chibaba, Chibaba."

The popular music world is at present subject to whims of a few key disk jockeys strung across the nation. It is very difficult for a song to become popular if the jocks aren't willing to plug it. It is in this field that Perry has done his best spadework. Always an amiable guy, Perry never fails to visit the local disk jockeys in whatever town he visits. Half in awe and half in appreciation, the jocks reciprocate by giving frequent spinings to Como recordings.

The big impetus in Perry's career came in 1943 when RCA Victor signed him up to counter the sales of the rock-eting Frank Sinatra on rival Columbia records. Perry had been with Ted Weems since 1936 and when Weems went into the service, Perry was unemployed, though one of the nation's top band singers. He went home to Canonsburg to open a barber shop when RCA dug him up.

The careers of Como and Sinatra ran parallel with both finally reaching the level of Bing Crosby, whom Perry frankly admits imitating. Now, Sinatra seems to be on the downgrade and Crosby is coasting on personality. Which apparently leaves the field to Perry.

Several Como recordings now rate in the category of all time classics. "Blue Room," "Prisoner of Love" and "Till the End of Time" rate as "must" items in any collector's library.

Perry's TV show is another example of his perfect salesmanship. Looking and singing like a man who hasn't a care on earth, he romps through three or four numbers a show, each one getting the exclusive Como treatment.

For his combined recording and TV chores, Perry nets around \$900,000 a year. He lives in a plush home on Long Island with his wife and two children and spends most of his spare time on the golf links. His formula for the future includes exactly the same routine he's following now. In the entertainment world, where ulcers are a staple, Perry is astonishingly carefree. His own explanation is that if he ever loses his popularity, he can always go back to barbering.

THE network executives who head up TV's placement bureau for Talented White Elephants are suffering occupational headaches these days. Their most thumping migraine is over the problem of what to do with Robert Q. (for Quandary) Lewis. Bob, a purveyor of good adult humor when given the opportunity, has batted around the radio and TV circuit, changing networks at the drop of a vice president. He has exceeded talent splurges, chatter get-togethers, record programs and panel shows—and none of them lasted.

He is currently starring in a modest panel quizzer which passes as a pale (albeit cleaned up) version of "What's My Line?" called "The Name's the Same." The show—no rousing success—could well fall into oblivion as just another in a long line of Lewis vehicles that never quite fit the comic's niche. The question is: just what is Robert Q's niche?

Despite Bob's abilities—which ivory hunters insist are exceptional—his biggest claim to fame is popularizing the Summer Replacement. Many viewers know him simply as that man who subbed for Arthur Godfrey when the ol' Redhead was off on one of his many vacations. The distinction of sitting in for a big TV star is slightly more self satisfying than being a stunt man for a vaunted Hollywood cowboy hero. And the Lewis fandom strongly feels that their boy deserves a richer reward.

Lewis is an inveterate show biz bug. He thinks and talks of little else. A bachelor, it has been suggested he is entirely too busy working on what makes an audience tick or what comprises good humor to allow time for marriage. He is a restless performer, an energetic talker, an avid lover of New York with its bright lights, its exciting show world atmosphere, its glamour and its past glories.

And who knows? Thirty years from now the man with the tickled laugh and the horn-rimmed glasses and the phony middle initial could emerge as a kind of

patriarch of the show world a la Joe Howard, Cantor, Jessel, Sophie Tucker or Ted Lewis.

While the chance is here, the story of Bob's middle initial should be made clear. It means nothing and was added merely for distinction. The press releases add that Lewis keeps the "Q" as a constant reminder to himself that "people shouldn't get stuffy."

Born in New York City in 1921, Bob as a child looked like a cinch bet to land on the make believe side of the foot-lights. He organized and ran children's theaters as a moppet, sang as a boy soprano and appeared in amateur hours, one of which was presided over by actor Paul Douglas, now of the movies. At 10 he rigged up a record-player with a parlor mike and became a juvenile disk jockey, a prophetic move by a kid not yet in his teens, who was destined to spin records for a livelihood.

He left his hallowed New York for college, attending the University of Michigan where he studied drama and radio production. But either the Western atmosphere or an itch to get into the real thing prompted "Q" to drop out in 1941. A radio job in Troy, New York, that included every duty save sweeping out the studio, was interrupted by war service.

Given a medical discharge early in 1943, he landed job after job—primarily as disk jockey—in station after station. The general public then got their first

taste of Robert Q. when, one morning in 1947 the familiar homespun dronings of Mr. A. Godfrey were missing and the fellow with the quavering voice of a Harvard freshman took over the show. Although New York-bred Bob's humor doesn't fall into the patented cracker-barrel category which the Godfrey fandom relishes, his extreme naturalness won the listeners over.

As a student of comedy, Lewis regards the little stage comic Bobby Clark, humorist S. J. Perelman and scribe Goodman Ace as just about tops in their field. It's curious that Ace, who at present is doing an amazing job of regaining popularity for Milton Berle ("Goody" heads the Berle writing corps), couldn't hit on the right formula for Bob. As a matter of fact, Ace scripted a radio effort by Robert Q. called "The Little Show" in 1947 which had some memorable moments. Following the vogue, the sponsors and the shows themselves were spoofed to death. Unfortunately "The Little Show" met a premature death itself—just another example of the difficulties of Robert Q. to jell with a solid program.

"The Name's the Same" gives little evidence of Robert Q.'s ability to get off literate, ad-libbed material. The game is apparently the thing and Bob—to his fan's dismay—comes off as little more than a high priced interviewer of unknown people with well-known names.

Robert (In a Quandary) Lewis hasn't found the old niche yet, that's for sure.

Lewis is seen on "The Name's the Same" every Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. on channel 7, WENR-TV.

TO the aristocratic breed, there's only one civilized way to make dinner worthwhile. That's to spend a half-hour or so beforehand in some engaging small talk while sampling hors d'oeuvres and cocktails. Unfortunately, most people don't have the kind of money it takes to finance this agreeable pastime. It's to these people that station WENR-TV extends a friendly hand. They can't furnish the food and drink, but they do serve up a palatable blend of small-talk & large thoughts that set well just before chow.

Channel 7's method is to package four different type shows within a 30-minute span, dishing up just enough of each to bring the customers back for more the following night. Their table of tidbit teasers includes a news show, some sports, the weather and five minute roundup of local gossip. Between the four they provide enough information so that people can save a nickel on the evening paper.

Leading off on channel 7 at 6:00 o'clock is newscaster Austin Kiplinger. Kip is a model of excellence for young newscasters to imitate—informed, perceptive, objective and completely unhysterical. By judicious editing and selection he manages to cram more local and national news into his 10 minutes than an hour-long news show featured on the same station.

Kip is the son of A. M. Kiplinger of Kiplinger's Washington Newsletter

fame. He's a graduate of Cornell University, Phi Beta Kappa, 1939. He spent the war years as a pilot for the U. S. Navy in the Pacific. In 1941, he co-authored with his father a book about the nation's capital called "Washington Is Like That" which was a bestseller. After the war he helped found the magazine "Changing Times," a monthly non-technical business magazine. He also worked as a writer for the Chicago Journal of Commerce before that paper was sold to the Wall Street Journal.

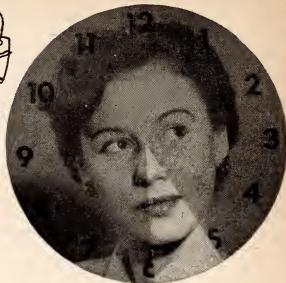
As moderator on the Daily News "Impact" Kip proved to be a first rate man with an interview, but that show suffers from too much interview and too little impact. In spite of Austin's efforts, "Impact" manages to make the news dull. But no such accusation can be made at his six o'clock news show.

Second in line in WENR-TV's lineup is sportscaster Jack Drees, who's on from 6:10 to 6:20. It's a typical sports show—a roundup of whatever scores are available, plus an interview if the sports news is thin as it usually is during the winter months. But sports scores and personalities seem to provide endless amusement to most males and Drees does a capable job as announcer.

Drees is moving fast into the upper echelon of Chicago sports announcers. He's now Sports Director at WENR-TV

and handles most of their sporting events. He first made a name for himself when he collaborated with Don Ameche on a series of radio broadcasts of big races from Chicago's Arlington Park. Racing fans consider him to be the best race announcer in the business and that includes Clem McCarthy. Jack did another fine job announcing the finals of the Illinois state high school basketball tournament. He can talk fast and call the play accurately, which is about all you can ask of a sportscaster.

After Drees moves out of the picture, Bill Hamilton, the latest in channel 7's long line of weathermen, comes on. Practically the only things required of a weatherman are an average literacy, a nice personality and an ability to write backwards on that huge, transparent weather map featured on the show. But for some reason, people fiercely resist the idea that they have to know what the weather's going to be, unless Clint Youle tells them.

Although he's only 30 years old, Bill Hamilton is one of the real veterans of Chicago TV. He handled a newscast on WBKB in 1945 when there were only 450 sets in the Chicago area. No matter what kind of rating he pulls on the weather show, it'll be an improvement on his 1945 show. For a man of Bill's obvious talents, it's surprising that he

isn't seen more often on Chicago TV screens. This five minute weather show may be just the boost this likeable guy needs to latch on to a big show where he can display his skill as an emcee.

Wrapping up channel 7's pre-dinner appetizer is the amiable and multi-talented Barbara Moro at 6:25. Barbara's show is a blithe five minute commentary on the arts around town. She reviews movies, plays and talks about exhibits and museums. She even surprises herself by coming up with some weighty philosophy once in awhile.

Barbara started out in show business as an actress, and when she first arrived on Chicago TV, found herself the proprietress of a home economics tips forum. From those unfamiliar grounds she passed on to her present discussion of the arts, where she's more at home. It's the only show of it's kind locally and makes Barbara Chicago's first TV critic of the arts.

Born in 1921 in Salt Lake City, Barbara has spent most of her life in Chicago, although she did spend various spells on the road when she was acting. She has one son, Jeffrey, a seven year old.

The latest trend in TV is to package several shows of this type to hit the viewer with a one-two punch. WENR-TV is keeping right up with the trend with a 1-2-3-4 punch that sends viewers into dinner, informed right up to the gills, and ready for more earthy food.

Singer **Frank Sinatra**, who was eyed suspiciously by U. S. customs on his return from Africa, has been cleared. Its soap sponsor thinks the ratings are too low. . . . **Ray Bolger** will debut Dec. 21 on the Comedy Hour, replacing **Eddie Cantor**. . . . "Hail The Champ" revival on ABC postponed until Dec. 27. . . . **Garfield Goose**, kid creation of **Frazier Thomas**, picked as honorary "member" of Civil Air Patrol. . . . They're thinking of a new cowboy series, called "Jesse James" and starring **Bob Steele**. . . . **Judy Garland's** proposed TV series may be delayed as a result of her recent baby. . . . Singer **Jo Stafford** is planning a TV series for January. . . . How about that rumor that **Dorothy Collins** is awaiting the stork? She's wedded to bandleader **Raymond Scott** of the "Hit Parade" show.

ABC's **Kay Westfall** due for a starring role in a coming Showcase Theatre legit vehicle. . . . **SDS**, the teen-age outfit promoting modesty in dress, has started a campaign against "What's My Line" and the outfits of **Dorothy Kilgallen** and **Arlene Francis**. . . . **Bishop Fulton J. Sheen** has jolted the Tuesday night ratings to such an extent that comic **Eddie Albert** may be shifted, and the remaining opposition—**Uncle Miltie**—may again wind up out of the top 20 shows. . . . 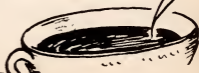

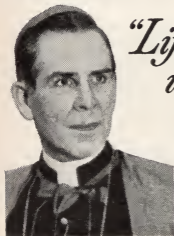

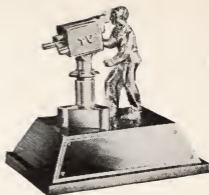

JOEY MAXIM, the Cleveland "cutie," will make his long delayed light-heavyweight title defense against aging Archie Moore in St. Louis over WBKB on Dec. 17. It will be Maxim's third title defense since he won it 34 months ago from England's Freddie Mills. Joey knocked out Mills in the 10th round at London, Jan. 24, 1950. Bowling enthusiasts will be treated to the thrills and action of the 12th Annual All-Star Bowling Tournament through a series of local telecasts via WGN-TV and WENR-TV, Dec. 11 through Dec. 14. A field of 160 men and 64 women will be competing when the tournament opens Dec. 6. Most of the speculation will be centered around Marion Ladewig who'll be shooting for her fourth straight championship in the women's division.

ALL THIS AND BETSY, TOO

PPETER BELL should be dubbed TV's "Mr. Satisfaction!"

Pete has everything. A white shutter and picket fence home, an enviable job, a circle of friends, a generally comfortable life.

All this and Betsy, too. Betsy is a complete volume of womanly whims, wiles and witchery filed under "W" for wife. She and Pete have set up house-keeping on a fluffy white TV cloud called "Heaven For Betsy."

Sometimes, though, the celestial atmosphere becomes clouded with the smog of materialism. Often Pete and Betsy are jolted back to earth on a jet-motored comet of realism. In such cases, they merely slip on a pair of rose-colored glasses and the blush of optimism once more tints their paradise.

A sticky philosophy? Too sweet for the cut-throat world of TV? Maybe. But "Heaven For Betsy" has been rescued by a balance of charm and realism rarely achieved.

Even though such shows as Rose Franken's "Claudia" were ousted from the fold last spring, the subject of wedded bliss has enjoyed considerable TV success. Why?

One of the reasons for "Betsy's" appeal lies in the personalities. Pete and Betsy Bell out of character are Mr. and Mrs. Jack Lemmon (Cynthia Stone), two youngsters whose roads to stardom have been paved with pillows. Jack boasts a Harvard education and even served as president of the university's famed drama group, the Hasty Pudding club. His father is vice-president and sales manager of the Do-Nut Corporation of America. With such a background, it's not surprising that Jack copped another honor recently when he was named one of TV's best-dressed young men.

Cynthia, too, has had her share of life's fortunes. Her father is vice-president of Peoria's First National Bank while her mother has built a reputation as children's writer Dorothy Dayton Stone. Cynthia's educational background includes fashionable Foxcroft School in Virginia and Finch College, New York.

The financial security enjoyed by Jack and Cynthia enabled them to concentrate their time and efforts on acting. From mediocre bits on Broadway where they met, the two launched their

joint careers on radio and TV. The portrayals of Pete and Betsy Bell sprang from the Lemmons' version of Sam and Amy Dister, newlyweds who first appeared on the Frances Langford-Don Ameche show in 1951.

About six months after the Langford-Ameche pact broke up, Jack and Cynthia turned up in "Heaven." For them, it has merely been a matter of magnifying their own problems and fitting them into 15 minutes. All newlyweds recognize the situations as carbon copies of their own. Betsy loses her engagement ring and Pete is forced to conduct a one-man search. Betsy coaches Pete on the subtle way of reminding the boss about "that raise." Or Pete decides he's allergic to his wife since he sneezes each time she comes near. Betsy's wrangles with the budget and Pete's tussles with wallpaper are oft-repeated imitations. But somehow the TV audiences never tire of them.

Viewers apparently didn't welcome the "great American love story" of Claudia and David, as CBS had anticipated. David's patience and Claudia's Dresden-doll appeal couldn't trap a sponsor. Pete, unlike David Naughton, has no endless supply of patience. He loses his dignity. (David never did.) He loses his temper. (David seldom did.) But he hasn't lost his contract yet. (David did.)

Rumors have been buzzing that it's only a matter of time before "Heaven For Betsy" is dropped by the sponsor.



If so, maybe Pete and Betsy can borrow Johnnie Ray's "Little White Cloud That Cried." There should be many disgruntled TV viewers joining them there. "Heaven For Betsy" is seen at 6:45 p.m. Tues. and Thurs. on channel 4.

"If you're stumped for Christmas gift suggestions," WENR-TV's culinary expert says, "English Plum Pudding is ideal for someone who has too much of this world's goods." Miss Karney is viewed each weekday at 12:30 p.m.



ENGLISH PLUM PUDDING

- | | |
|------------------------------------|-------------------------------------|
| 1 whole lemon | 1 1/2 cups currants |
| 6 lumps sugar | 1/2 cup chopped candied orange peel |
| 1 1/2 cups cooking sherry or cider | 1/2 cup chopped citron |
| 1 1/2 cups coke flour, sifted | 1/2 cup chopped candied lemon peel |
| 1/2 tsp. nutmeg | 1 3/4 cups dry bread crumbs |
| 1/2 tsp. cinnamon | 1 cup brown sugar |
| 1/2 tsp. salt | 1/2 lb. finely chopped suet |
| 1/2 cup sliced almonds | 4 eggs, beaten |
| 1 1/2 cups chopped golden raisins | 1/2 cup fruit juice |

Crush sugar with whole lemon, removing oil from rind. Add sherry or cider and let stand until sugar dissolves. Sift together flour, nutmeg, cinnamon & salt, three times. Combine with almonds, raisins, currants, orange peel, citron & lemon peel. Combine bread crumbs, brown sugar & suet and add to flour mixture. Add sugar mixture. Add beaten eggs and fruit juice. Mix well.

Roll in well-greased piece of muslin which has been sprinkled with flour. Mold pudding into center & tie lightly to permit room for swelling. Immerse in rapidly boiling water in large kettle. Suspend

pudding by tying to handles of cooking kettle so it will not touch bottom, or put on steamer rack. Boil for 5 hours. Keep water boiling, adding more water when necessary. Remove from water but do not remove muslin. Mold into ball while still warm. Cool. Store as for fruitcake. When ready to serve, steam for one hour in muslin bag. Serves 12.

TO PRESSURE COOK the pudding, place in pressure cooker. Put 1 1/2 inches water in pan. Bring to boil and let steam escape for 20 min. Then cook under pressure of 15 lbs. for the next 45 min.

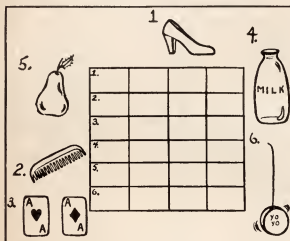
