COAST . . . TO . . . COAST  
with Marty O'Shaughnessy

**S**INGER Rosemary Clooney's current squabble with Paramount Pictures over her plans to do a regular TV show may be settled any day now. Coca Cola was all set to sponsor Rosemary until Paramount raised a squawk that her TV appearances would hurt her movie box office. Whereupon Coca Cola canceled out. But here's what'll settle the dispute—a little clause in Rosemary's movie contract whereby she holds onto all TV rights. Read it and weep. . . Kling Studio is packaging a film series of fights from Rainbo Arena for nationwide distribution. Sports expert Jack Drees announces. . . There'll be more sleeping in '53. The reason is that NBC has put its foot down on all-night telethons, such as the Milton Berle cancer pitch, and Martin & Lewis's yak-kathon for muscular dystrophy.

The networks are after Danny Kaye again to do a TV show of his own, because the agile comic is setting box office records at the theatres. Kaye was approached once before, but the price wanted was "so unrealistic" that negotiations came to a screeching halt. . . Now it can be told—When former Vice President Alben Barkley was dickering with NBC for his new "Meet The Veep" show, there was some worry among the TV brass that he would use the program as a sounding board for Democratic politics. But Barkley himself insisted that his show be "informal, non-partisan and constructive." Nevertheless, the former Veep is too skilful a politician not to resist throwing a sly needle into the new Eisenhower administration whenever possible.

Comic Eddie Albert may be seen in a new daytime series on CBS, an idea which may go over with a bang. It's been long-known that housewives like some light comedy stuff to mix in with their soap opera tear-jerkers, and Albert might be just what the psychiatrist ordered. . . "This Is Show Business," the Sam Levenson-George S. Kaufman-Clifton Fadiman wit session on CBS, is drawing new attention in its Saturday night spot. The critics agree that it's a definite audience-rating threat to NBC's "Show of Shows" epic. . . Joe Marine, the handsome singer with the Fred Waring show, has been inked by Decca records. . . Sponsors are the ones who pay the bills, therefore it's good news that "Ding Dong School," the amazing kid show, picked up two backers. Conversely, it's bad news that "Studio One" may lose its sponsor every other week. This may put the fine drama series on an alternate week showing.

Some of the major comics, George Jessel among them, are screaming at the networks to get them off the "live" basis. They say this type of show is shortening their lives because it takes too much effort. They'd rather have the shows on film, so they could be done on a leisurely basis. This is the old Red Skelton dilemma. Should he save his health and lose his audience? It's the age versus youth debate all over again. TV is a young man's game, but the oldtimers want to play it their way. This is "gamesmanship" of the most obvious sort.

Studs Terkel, star of the late "Studs' Place," says that nowadays when a fellow claims he's going to "rough it," it means he's turning his electric blanket down to medium.

# the humor of *Herb Shriner*



It was after a summer's spell as a replacement for Arthur Godfrey that Herb blossomed as a full-fledged TV star.

**N**O SOONER had Herb Shriner launched his "Two For The Money" quiz show than the pundits were saying that Herb was no Groucho Marx in the ad lib department. But there was no arguing his ability to deal out a genuine and gentle American folk humor, based on sly observations of Smalltown, U.S.A. If a quiz show is the only way to get him on TV, the fans will take him that way. Because genuine humorists are hard to come by.

As Herb said when he first came on "Two For the Money," "Quite a lot of people have asked me when I was going to be back on television. Well—actually it was my landlady asking me if I had anything lined up." After a pause he continued on with "Can you imagine a man just standing around giving away money? I don't know how President Truman can give it up."

Herb isn't interested in getting the audience into hysterics. No seltzer squirter he. Instead he relies on rambling monologues about the characters in his home town which bring pleased chuckles from his listeners. In this way Herb has built up a sort of cracker-barrel friendship between himself and his audience. He hasn't had the oppor-

tunity on his quiz show to talk at length about his home folks but he still manages to squeeze in several sunny little stories a show. It's surprising how many of these Shriner sayings have a way of sticking in the memory.

Such as "The public spirited fellow—well, he drank a lot of spirits in public . . . he was drinkin' to forget; the reason he drank so much was that he had such a good memory." Then there's "The woman who would have been one of the '400' if we'd had that many in our home town."

Floppy-haired, stoop-shouldered Herb looks the part of a small town yokel. Actually he was born in medium sized Toledo, Ohio in 1918 and as Herb says, "My folks moved to Indiana as soon as they heard about it." Fort Wayne, another large city, was Herb's next stop. His first contact with small town characters came when he went up to his grandpa's place in Michigan and went to work in the General Store as a window decorator. "All I did," said Herb, "was to put in some clean flypaper."

Peculiarly, Herb got into show business not through comic talents, but as a harmonica player. He and some of his pals around Fort Wayne formed a harmonica band which got small billing and smaller salaries in some of the mid-west's seediest theaters. Playing these dates familiarized Herb with small-town types and also gave him the impression that there was no crying demand for harmonica bands. Finding his sly observations were going over better with the audiences than the music, Herb abandoned his crew and went out as a single—a comedian.

His first big engagement was at the Oriental Theater in Chicago and from there he vaulted into frequent appearances on the Kate Smith radio show. At the outbreak of World War II he went overseas to entertain troops and entered the army himself in 1943. He was discharged in 1945 with five battle stars



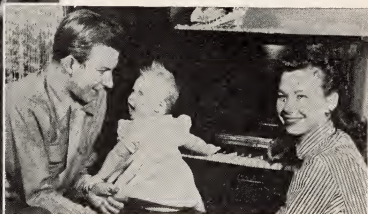
and a big reputation among army men who had heard his whimsical humor over the Armed Forces Radio Service.

After his discharge, he landed in the revue "Inside U.S.A." which starred Beatrice Lillie. While the great Bea nearly dominated the show, Herb got fine notices from the critics for his short monologue while Miss Lillie went out for air. From this show, he landed a regular 15-minute radio spot and the Shriner fame began to spread.

Herb finally crashed television after he blew up a storm as a summer replacement for Arthur Godfrey. Most observers claim that Herb got more laughs from the steadfast Godfrey audience than the Redhead himself and popular demand brought Herb a weekly half-hour on ABC.

This show folded prematurely after 26 weeks because Herb tried to make it a one man show and his humor comes over better when it is spotted among other acts. Herb claims the reason he was dropped was because his commercials last year were on film showing how Ar-

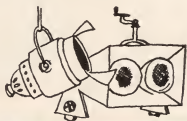

Kukla and Fran are my Valentines.

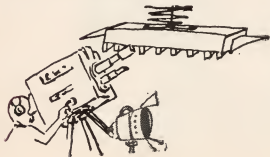

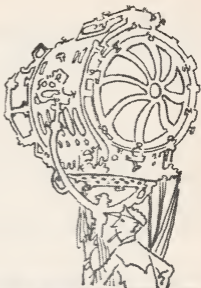

# AIR TIME

## Drama Project For TV

ONE of 1953's most interesting experiments will be unveiled on Feb. 18, when a talented group of Chicago actors present the TV debut of radio's famed "Curtain Time."

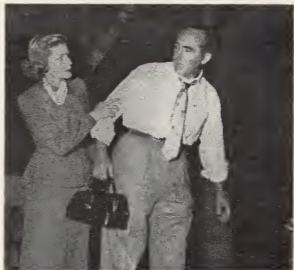
When the "Curtain" goes up on channel 5 at 9:30 p.m., it'll represent the season's most ambitious project on a local dramatic scale. TV fans who watched Marshall Field's ill-fated "Pace of Chicago" falter, stumble and then fall flat on its face will be keeping their fingers crossed against any such disaster for "Curtain Time."

Practically every factor points to its impending success. Under the expert handling of Grant agency's Harry Holcombe, "Curtain Time" will start off with a surefire success format—light comedy drama. Such sparkling sketches as "Pygmalion Was A Woman" by Irene Colvin, "Sold Short" by Ken Petrus and "Too Young and Too Old" by Bob Pieron will typify the programs offered.

*Direction will be topnotch stuff in the hands of such skilled NBC drama vets as Lynwood King and Dave Brown.*

And most important of all, the casting will be open to more than 800 actors and actresses who now participate in Chicago TV, radio, little theatre and summer stock. This is one of drama's richest reservoirs of talent, and TV viewers can now cash in on a first rate nighttime offering.

The original "Curtain Time" radio version produced much in the way of name talent—Geraldine Kay, Brenda Forbes, Harry Elders, George Cisar, Norm Gottschalk, besides the famous thespians pictured on these pages.



Two "Hawkins Falls" mainstays are Bev Younger (also Gracie in the late "Studs' Place") and Maurice Copeland, one of TV's most versatile stars.

The program will be telecast from the stage of the NBC theatre at 418 S. Michigan. A studio audience will be admitted to each Wednesday night performance. Studio tickets can be obtained at the showrooms of Chicagoland Dodge Dealers, sponsors of the show.

In the show's initial production, "Pygmalion Was A Woman," the cast will include Beryl Vaughn, Peter Collins, Geraldine Kay and Toni Gilman.

Two of TV's top names got their start on the old radio version of "Curtain Time." The announcer on the show met one of the guest actresses and after a few months they were married. The announcer's name was Mike Wallace and the actress Buff Cobb.

*The curtain on "Curtain Time" goes up for the first time on Feb. 18 at 9:30 p.m. on channel 5 (WNBQ) and will be on every Wednesday thereafter.*

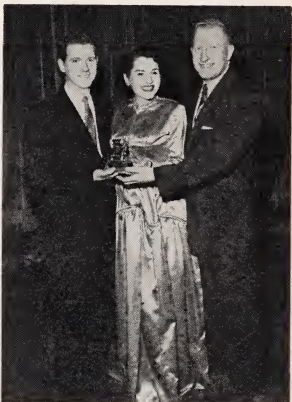

# Nothing Like a Good Scare

SINCE it is obviously impossible for a camera to probe inside the human brain, TV's mystery shows have been hamstrung when they want to communicate real horror to their audiences. Instead they have been forced to concern themselves with shock and brutality. It's all very exciting in its way, but it can never compare with the greatest horror of all, the horror of the inner mind. Now along comes a show called "Faces in the Window" with a solution to this problem.

The solution is so simple that it's surprising one of TV's geniuses didn't come up with it before. Get the mood. Here's a rather grim looking man, sitting alone in a tiny studio, with only one camera trained on him. Eerie modern music is playing. The man reads. Ah, but what he's reading! Ever hear of Edgar Allan Poe?

*Mr. Poe was not one to fool around with blackjacks and other such superficial instruments of terror. When he wanted to throw a scare into you, he dug right into the nervous system and exposed the raw terror that comes from coping with the supernatural. And that's the story of "Faces in the Window."*

Ken Nordine, who, when he's in a more cheerful mood, announces on the Chicago Symphony TV concerts, is the man doing the reading. Each week he picks out a notable work from the library of classic horror literature, from Poe to Hawthorne to Maupassant. When you hear those immortal words delivered in Mr. Nordine's dark baritone voice, the results are spectacular. As if this combination weren't enough, they've put the show on at a time (11:30 p.m. Saturdays on WNBQ) when the hobgoblins and the witches are just starting to come out. Beware!

Although "Faces in the Window" has



only been on for slightly over a month it surprised practically everybody by winning an award in the recent *TV Forecast Awards Poll*. Which only goes to prove that everybody loves a good old-fashioned scare.

Ken Nordine, the man responsible for these terrifying experiences, started out in life with the less macabre ambition of becoming a musician. But the acting urge hit him and he abandoned violin lessons in favor of drama school. His violin playing is now confined to an occasional get-together with his family where the family has jam sessions on a Beethoven or Bartok quartet.

Ken is a native of Cherokee, Iowa, but has lived in Chicago most of his life. He went to the U. of Chicago and founded the famed dramatic workshop out on the Midway. Although he calls himself an actor, his principal earnings are made as a commercial announcer. (He handles the What's My Line commercials.) He's a regular in local intellectual circles and betrays a weakness for writer James Joyce and poet T. S. Eliot. Obscure enough for everyone?

The "Faces in the Window" idea first occurred to Ken several years back but he couldn't find anybody willing to put it on. Late in 1952, George Heinemann, one of Chicago's top TV idea men, had a similar idea. After auditioning several actors, George picked Ken. It was a wise choice, for Ken has a taste for the best in horror classics and the properly terrorized attitude for reading them aloud.

He might even scare the wits out of you.

row shirts were made and "the pictures were so good that now women are making the shirts at home, and so we worked ourselves out of a job."

The Shriver show of last season had a sort of "Our Town" format which allowed Herb to ramble around spinning tales and commenting slyly on the foibles of small town life. There was the sheriff "who didn't know the meaning of fear—or many other words, for that matter."

There's Joe Trilly "who painted the church steeple from the bottom up. He was up there three days waiting for the paint to dry."

*Herb is a master of understatement and it sometimes takes audiences a while to get on to the idea that he isn't just leading to a punch line. Any line can have punch with Herb.*

"One fellow decided to marry a rich widow. He didn't like the idea of marryin' her for her money . . . but he couldn't think of any other way to get it. So he married her . . . but she didn't have any money left. When her first husband died she buried him in a rented tuxedo. . . . So her second husband didn't get any of her money 'cause she had spent it all payin' rent on the tuxedo."

On "Two For the Money" much of this is missing. Herb is in the position of leading the contestants around to a spot where he can ad lib a story about back home. Or else he tries to come across with Groucho type ad libs such as the answer to a lady who worked in a department store and advised brides what to do. Herb's comment, "Department stores do that now? Their mothers used to."

All in all, "Two For the Money" is a pretty interesting quiz game (the contestants make their dough by naming state capitals or cities or whatever in 15 seconds). It's not the best possible format for Herb but it does keep him working and the public is able to catch

at least a fragment of the warm, whimsical, folksy Shriver charm.

*Herb isn't the only chap from his mythical hometown to head for the big time. Another local yokel tried.*

"He almost made it too," Herb laments. "He started to go out on the road with a necktie that lit up. But, just as he got goin' real big, the bulb burned out. He got another chance though. His big ambition was to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel. And he'd never have been able to make it if his folks hadn't helped him. They financed him. Had his name put on the barrel and everything.

"It was kind of interesting how they raised the money, too. His folks had a garbage disposal unit in their sink, and they raised all the money by takin' in garbage.

"Finally the great day came for the trip over the Falls. But they turned out kinda poor too. The feller was drowned. It was just bad planning. They forgot to take the beer out of the barrel."

# GARRY MOORE— HE'S WONDERFUL

## Minute Reviews:

**Garry Moore:** By all odds the favorite adult daytime show of the harem in my house. "Today Garry told us how important mothers' jobs are," is the latest report. "He really made me feel like somebody. He's wonderful."

**My Hero:** *Somebody said this was supposed to improve. No signs of it yet.*

**Paul Winchell:** This man is one of the cleverest performers on the air. The show is on at an ideal time for youngsters, and the business with the dummies is great. But those dramatic skits that Winchell throws in the middle of the show are for the birds. They're too short to make much sense anyway, and they ruin the program for the little kids.

**This Is Show Business:** It may be my imagination, but Levenson, Kaufman, and Fadiman seem like new men now that they are released from the yoke of a sponsor who can find controversy in such tricky subjects as the time of day or the height of the Empire State building. All three men are great natural wits, and Show Business could develop into the most civilized comedy-variety program in television.

**Superman: Superhooley.**

**Victory At Sea:** WNBQ shifted this fine documentary from Sunday afternoon, when many people are busy, to 9:30 Sunday night, when most viewers are watching TV. It competes with What's My Line, one of the two or three most popular shows in Chicago. Yet its rating went up from 8.3 to 12.8. This may not clinch the argument for putting constructive programs on at prime viewing hours, but it helps a lot.

**Boxing:** There can be too much of a good thing.

**Show of Shows:** At the start of this season, we began watching Show of Shows every fourth Saturday, because it is such excellent entertainment, and watching every week spoiled it. This was no gag. We still watch it once a month, and enjoy it now more than any other variety show on the air.

**Basketball:** Promoters are wondering why attendance is falling off. They might build it up with television. But from what I've seen on TV this year, the game is simply getting dull because of the insane whistle blowing of the officials. Every time the action gets hot, toot toot! and you fiddle around with free throws. Hockey is my nomination for the best spectator game on television.

**The Western Frolic:** All of a sudden this show appears on WGN-TV on Wednesday night. Either it was sneaked on the air or my mail isn't coming through. Anyway,

it was a barn dance type of show with Bill Bailey from a West Side auditorium, and to the eye of a man who doesn't enthuse particularly over folk music, it was one of the best shows of its kind that's been on the air.

# BILLY WILLIAMS' QUARTET

## TEAMWORK

**A**ROUND the turn of the century it was grandpa's voice that determined his popularity with the saloon crowd. If he could curl himself around a bar stool, nurse a beer and contribute a bell-toned tenor to the barber-shop harmonies, he was in. And the old boy liked nothing better than to join Casey, Clancy and Pat in a four-part conspiracy, using "Clementine," "The Old Oaken Bucket" or "Sweet Adeline" as their victims.

Then for a while those happy teamwork days were forgotten as singers ventured out on their own to grab a share of show biz dividends. First tenors became Irish tenors. Second tenors became street singers. Baritones turned to light opera. And the bass boys were sold on Verdi.

This led to a barrage of Morton Downeys, Dennis Days, Nelson Eddy and Ezio Pinzas. Not to mention the freak crowd of Frankie Laines and Johnnie Rays who offered not only their voices but accompanying hysterics.

Today teamwork is once again on the upbeat in entertainment as combos begin to steal the spotlight from singles. And TV spurred the revival.

*One of the best evidences of the return of barber shop harmonies is the success of the Billy Williams' quartet which has notched itself a solid spot on "Show of Shows" in the last two years.*

Billy couldn't have done more for harmony groups if he had been a major stockholder in the SPEBSQSA or, as it's commonly known, Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America, Inc. Although a corn fed group, the Elm City Four, copped most of the honors in national amateur competition, Billy and HIS boys have taken the lead in the professional world.

Billy's smooth handling of both sweet and bop tunes has sold his team to a good share of the viewing public. Add to this his flare for showmanship and you have the ingredients for four-part harmony success on TV.

# ON THE UPBEAT



Some fans complain that Billy is a spotlight hog. His name adorns all billing while his boys remain obscure and nameless as far as the public is concerned. Billy stands almost on top of the TV cameras while the harmonizers are pushed at least four to six feet behind him. But credit Billy with the idea, the initiative and the determination and his prominence is justified.

Even as a youth, Billy trained his ambitions on public acclaim. It was generally accepted by his family that he would follow his father's professional footsteps and become a Methodist minister. During his childhood in Texas and Ohio, he combined his love for music with the church by singing in all the church choirs where his father had a pulpit.

But later, while at Wilberforce college outside of Cleveland, he joined three other students in a quartet, the Charioteers which graduated from college performances to the bigtime. Williams stayed with the quartet for ten years through radio appearances, night club dates and finally the Olson & Johnson Broadway revue, "Hellzapoppin'."

About three years ago, Billy broke with the Charioteers and formed his own quartet, recruiting a tenor, baritone and bass. Tenor John Bell, a Louisiana boy, formerly sang with jazz pianist Nellie Lutcher on a Louisiana radio station, toured with the Tuskegee choir and served as staff musician for station WLW, Cincinnati.

*Bass Eugene Dixon was a truckdriver by trade who had previously sung with the Hall Johnson Choir. He also earned four years tuition at the Old Ironsides Military Institute in Bordentown, N.J., by singing in a quartet.*

Youngster of the group is the baritone, 27-year-old Claude Riddick, Jr., who sang with amateur groups throughout school, Army air force service and college. After graduation from West Virginia State college in 1949, he went to New York to find a job in industrial arts, but joined Williams instead.

The Billy Williams' quartet has upped its stock in show business with such recordings as "Pretty-Eyed Baby," "Slow Boat To China" and "Devil And The Deep Blue Sea." The team supplements its income, too, with personal appearances in night clubs and theaters throughout the country.

TV has often been credited with inspiring the rebirth of vaudeville. But it's also helped bring back the four-part harmony of barber shop fame. The transition from grandpa's style to today's slick teamwork can best be expressed by an immortal tribute paid Billy Williams by a bop fan: "Man, dig that cra-a-a-zy harmony!"
