


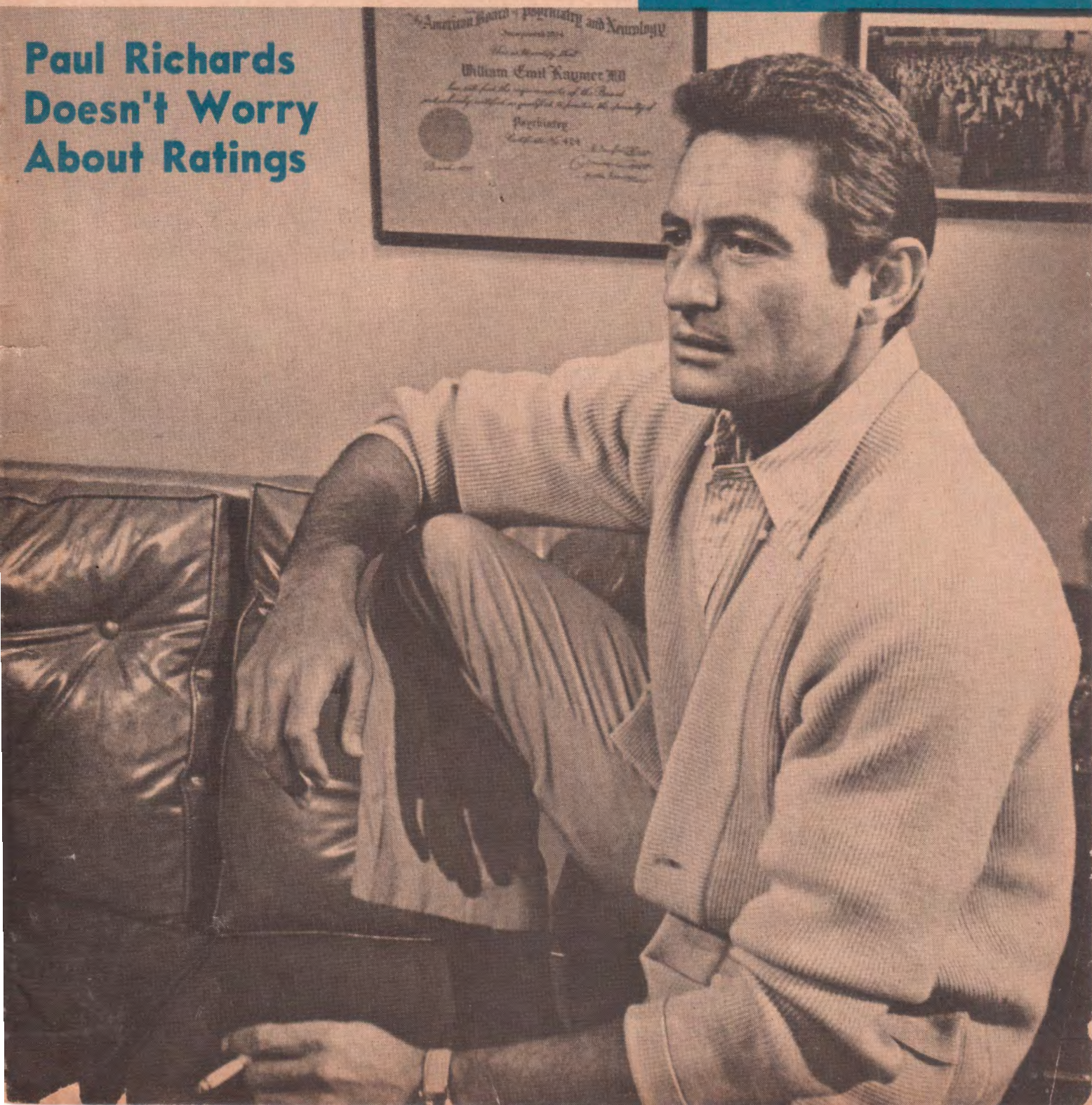

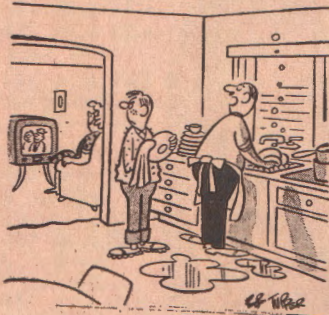

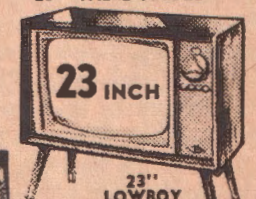

Paul Richards Doesn't Worry About Ratings

PAUL RICHARDS, who plays Dr. McKinley Thompson, a psychiatrist, in ABC-TV's *Breaking Point* series at 9 p. m. Mondays [channel 7], is a rare breed of TV actor—he doesn't worry about ratings.

"My job is to do the best I can on the show," said Paul recently when asked if he was concerned about the program's only fair standing in the audience ratings. "I can't worry about things like that, too."

The fact that *Breaking Point* has not been one the season's top-rated shows is no reflection on Richards' portrayal of Dr. Thompson. The handsome Richards has given the part as warm and realistic an interpretation as any actor could be expected to bring to a difficult role.

When actors were being tested for the part of "Dr. Mac," a psychiatrist of compassion as well as courage, he introduced

himself to the producer and explained that he had just learned of the part, adding, "I know I wasn't invited, but may I try out?"

HE WAITED on the doubtful chance that there would be time for him after the others had finished. He was the last tested.

When Richards' screen test was shown to an audience of VIP executives, they were impressed when he concluded his scene with this line to a departing patient:

"If you need help, will you call me?" which prompted one of the executives to observe, "I'd call him." The others concurred—and the role was Richards'.

Born in Los Angeles, Paul entered UCLA as a psychology major, and earned a master's degree in Theater Arts. He went to New York for his post graduate studies where he studied under Lee Strasberg of the Theater Wing. Subsequently, back on the west coast he studied with Michael Chekov, a founder of the Moscow Art Theater.

During his New York stay, Paul met and married actress Monica Keating.

Maureen O'Sullivan Is New 'Today Girl'

ACTRESS MAUREEN O'Sullivan, entering a new phase of her career, as a regular cast member of NBC-TV's Today show, looks forward to the new role as an "exciting challenge."

Until now, the attractive, blue-eyed star of more than 80 movies and the current Broadway comedy hit, "Never too Late," has only appeared on television in dramatic parts and as a guest panelist.

HOWEVER, as the "Today Girl" she joins host Hugh Downs and Jack Lescoulie in interviewing guests and participating in many other program features. Because of her Broadway role, she will appear on Today only once a week during March and April. She will be seen daily starting May 4, when she leaves "Never too Late."

One of the reasons Miss O'Sullivan is looking forward to her new assignment is that Today's broad range of subject matter parallels her own varied interests.

"Of course I enjoy everything connected with show business, new books and meeting important people," said Miss O'Sullivan. "But I am also interested in what is happening in the world, and I like politics."

TODAY'S early hours will mean a great change for Miss O'Sullivan, but she isn't too concerned about getting up before dawn every day. "I used to get up at 4:30 or 5 a. m. to go on movie locations, and that's the time I'll be getting up for Today," she said.

On Today, Miss O'Sullivan also will be taking part in the many far-flung projects planned for the program during the coming year. These include more 2-hour special programs devoted to a single subject, weekly reports from the 1964 New York World's Fair, and coverage from the 1964 Republican and Democratic conventions.

THO THIS is an ambitious schedule, it doesn't frighten the actress, who has been in the public eye since she came to Hollywood from her native Ireland at the age of 17 to act in the movie, "Song of My Heart," which starred Irish Tenor John McCormack.

Miss O'Sullivan made her Broadway debut in "Never too Late" when the Summer Long comedy opened on Nov. 27, 1962. It has played to capacity audiences ever since. Before the Broadway role, she appeared on the stage in "A Roomful of Roses" at the Drury Lane in Chicago.

Her television appearances have included two previous visits to Today, dramatic roles on Lux Video Theater, Alcoa Presents and Playhouse 90 and appearances on Tonight and other panel shows.

MISS O'SULLIVAN'S husband, writer-producer-director John Farrow, died of a heart attack in 1963. They had been married 26 years, and had seven children.

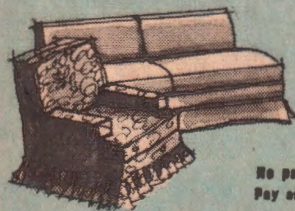

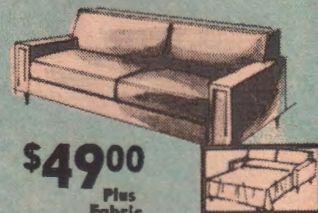
