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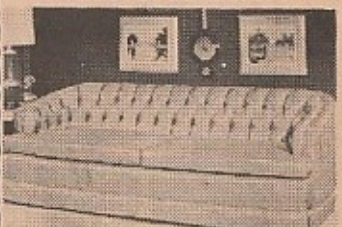

## Joey Bishop Is Switching to CBS and New Time Slot

**H**OLLYWOOD—Jack Benny goes to NBC and Joey Bishop gets claimed by CBS. This is a clew to next fall's programming. The way the schedule works out the laugh tracks will be almost constant while anguished cries from overwrought housewives in emotional drama may seem strange and rare. It's laugh, laugh, laugh as situation comedies will rain upon viewers.

The Joey Bishop story is a strange one in network thinking, and Joey says if you wrote it for a comedy show you wouldn't believe it. The ins and outs are complicated, but it boils down to the fact NBC was considering cancelling Joey's show while offering him 18 hour-long shows next season. Joey turned this down and found himself in the clear, only to have CBS call 30 minutes later with an offer to jump ship, an offer accepted.

In the fall Joey will appear Sunday nights at 8:30 [central time] with an unchanged format, a baby son [co-star Abby Dalton's son, Matthew] who is now walking, and a new serenity. "After three years of threatened cancellations no one can scare me any more," he says.

**BISHOP WENT ON** to say that CBS was most forceful about keeping the format intact, and pleased to put Joey on at a later hour.

Last season the Bishop show was saturated with guest stars and cute scenes featuring the new baby son. Kids were crazy about the baby and the mail zoomed. NBC evidently didn't think too much of the ratings hence their idea of a change, while CBS believes the show has gone past its breaking-in point, and is just ready to grab larger audiences.

This act could be compared to claiming horses. CBS believes the Bishop show is tight, ready for winning. All Joey has to do is run.

**H**OLLYWOOD — Don Knotts, who plays Deputy Barney Fife on the Andy Griffith series, must make a big decision soon, and right now he is pondering, trying to figure out the correct move.

Don's problem is this—his contract ends next year and so does Andy Griffith's. What should she do after this coming season, which could be the final year for the winning combination of Griffith and Knotts?

If Andy decides to quit, should Don continue with the series? Or should he go after a series of his own, changing the locale and environment, but not the basic character of the small, know-it-all hero, Deputy Barney Fife?

**OR, SHOULD** Knotts leave TV and sign a motion picture contract? All these moves are distinct possibilities. As Don says, "almost every step you take seems a good one."

Since plans for such ventures are made many months

ahead, Don must reach a decision shortly.

The Andy Griffith series could go on two or three more years running rampant over its competition, but the point has come when Andy might want to stop, having done his share.

The point has also come where some storylines are offshoots of very funny shows, and, naturally, they can't quite top the initial ones. "So this makes you think, maybe you should move on to a new environment," says Knotts.

**ALL THIS** is going to disturb many Monday night fans who like the status quo of Sheriff Andy watching his little deputy giving orders, acting like a vice president only to foul up miserably.

Don first attracted attention on the Steve Allen show, and says he went thru a lot of strain at the time, because he was trying so hard to make good. The pressure was on him. "And I don't do as well under pressure," he says. "Others react differently. I'm much better when I'm

relaxed and I know we can shoot over."

**THIS PAST** season Don spread himself out with nine or 10 guest appearances, and found the same old pressure returning when he appeared in front of an audience and camera. "It keeps coming back," he says, "and I just don't come off as well."

Like his crazy character, Barney, Don evidently is human too, not superman, and this chink or loophole only makes him even more likable.

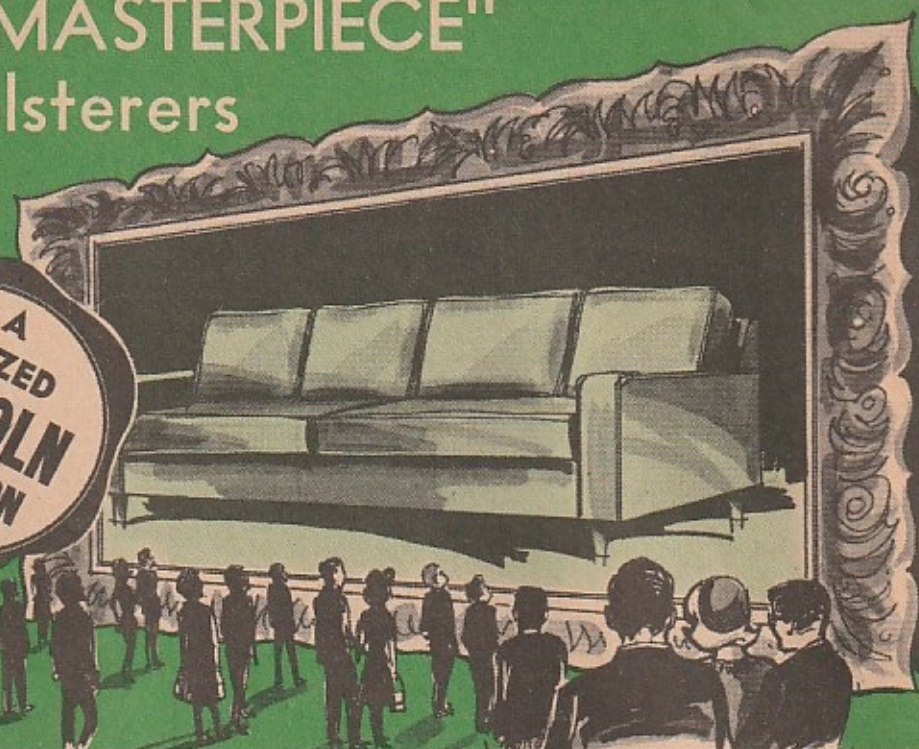
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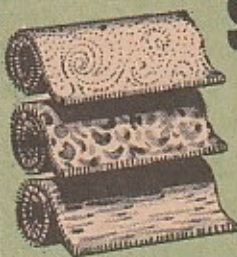
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
